Through the gift from the Durham Foundation, established by Charles W. Durham and the late Margre H. Durham, the Durham Research Center allows the University of Nebraska Medical Center to move closer

to achieving its goal of being recognized as a world-class health sciences

center and a leading research center.

The state-of-the-art Durham Research Center creates a research mall on the University of Nebraska Medical Center campus. This 289,000 square foot biomedical research facility houses research laboratories and associated support space, educational space, including classrooms, a computer cluster room, an auditorium, and conference/seminar rooms; and accredited laboratory animal care and procedure facilities. The center allows enhanced research in areas such as cancer, cardiovascular diseases, developmental biology, genetics and molecular genetics, organ

transplantation biology, neurobiology and eye research.

This exceptionally generous gift will have a lasting impact upon the advancement of research in the medical arts and sciences. In recognition of the Durham's vision of excellence and continued support for the University of Nebraska Medical Center it is recommended the Research Center of Excellence be named the "Durham Research Center" and the plaza area along 45th Street from Emile Street to Dewey Avenue and Dewey Avenue from 45th Street to 44th Street, be named the "Durham Research Plaza."

It is proposed that Sections 2.1, 4.2, 4.3, 6.1, and 8 of the Standing Rules of the Board of Regents of the University of

Nebraska be amended as follows:

2.1 **Annual Meeting**. The Board shall hold its annual meeting in on the first Saturday after the second Tuesday of January as required by Section 1.4 of its Bylaws.

- 4.2 **Order of Business**. The order of business at a meeting shall normally be: roll call; approval of minutes and ratification of actions taken at the previous meeting; KUDOS; resolutions; ,if any; strategic or policy issue; public hearings; public comment; and appearances, if any; committee reports and appropriate action; strategic or policy issues; university consent agenda; university administrative agenda; additional business; and adjournment.
- 4.3 Role of the Chairperson. The Chairperson, or the Vice Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson, shall preside over each meeting. The Chairperson shall decide all procedural and parliamentary questions which arise. In the absence of a controlling Standing Rule, Regental Bylaw or Policy, Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall be utilized as a procedural authority. A ruling of the Chairperson may, however, be appealed and overturned by majority vote of the quorum present.
- **Minutes**. The minutes of the Board shall reflect only official actions of the Board with the exception that when necessary, the Corporation Secretary has the authority to reflect the intention of the Board as a whole. The Corporation Secretary

shall, within ten (10) working days after each meeting, prepare the minutes of the meeting and post them on the university website. eirculate them to the members of the Board, the President and other appropriate parties. The Minutes of each meeting shall be presented for approval at the next scheduled meeting of the Board. The official Minutes of the Board shall be kept in the office of the Corporation Secretary and be available for public inspection upon request during normal business hours. Copies of the Minutes may be obtained upon payment of a fee established by the Corporation Secretary.

EXPLANATION: This contract represents a continuation of a partnering activity

between UNL's Center on Children, Family and the Law (the Center) and the Nebraska Department of Health and Human

Services (NDHHS) that has existed since 1988.

Under the terms of this contract, the Center will provide training services to NDHHS consistent with the Nebraska Family Policy Act, the Nebraska Family Portrait, and Nebraska's Child and Family Services Program Improvement Plan. As a part of this contract the Center will assess training needs; develop and deliver training programs; and evaluate the effectiveness of training programs for NDHHS staff and other individuals who assist wards-of-the-state and other children who are in, or at risk for, out-of-home placement. Funds provided by NDHHS are expected to total \$6,494,503 over a three-year period. UNL will cost share in this project by providing matching funds in an estimated amount of \$2,235,286. The percent effort listed in the contract for UNL faculty as match does not reflect time away from regular faculty activities. Traditionally, the State has allowed UNL to include as match the regular faculty service, teaching, and research activities that coincide with Center projects and training programs.

Transportation Services provides vehicles to faculty and staff for conducting University business. Rental vehicles are made available for University use, and include a variety of vehicle types including sedans, pick-ups, and vans. To assist in these services, Transportation Services performs maintenance and repair and provides refueling operations for all vehicles owned by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Additionally they service University vehicles housed in other parts of the state whenever possible. Transportation Services also services and maintains the buses in the campus transit fleet.

This project will replace the existing Transportation Services building that is in the path of the Antelope Valley Project. The proposed 20,880 gross square foot building will replace the existing automotive service facility and accommodate required space needs. The structure will provide 8 service bays for light and medium duty vehicles, two bus services bays, a body repair bay and paint booth, vehicle wash facility and parts inventory area. Offices and workspace are provided for administrative staff including a break area and employee changing rooms. Offices are also provided for Transit Services personnel.

The facility will replace fueling stations and vehicle parking and will provide space for transit bus parking. The proposed project will be located southwest of the intersection of 14th Street and Salt Creek on property recently purchased from the Lower Platte South Natural Resource District.









North Elevation
