EXPLANATION: The Center for Digital Research in Humanities at UNL is proposed by

University Libraries with a formal affiliation with the College of Arts and Sciences as a collaborative initiative which allows for multiple opportunities for new and emerging forms of scholarship in all of the humanities. The CDRH will foster interdisciplinary research that demonstrates high standards of digital scholarship in the humanities and will focus on those projects that have potential of drawing national and international acclaim, and by forming interdisciplinary research teams

with scholars.

Specific goals of the Center would be to triple the number of digital research projects in the humanities, find significant external funding for humanities computing, create models of interdisciplinary research teams in the humanities, and increasing faculty and student's knowledge about international standards of metadata and best policies for conducting digital research.

Support for this center comes from the Dean of Libraries, the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences and from numerous faculty representing a broad range of humanities disciplines at UNL, UNO, and UNK. The Academic Planning Committee unanimously supported the creation of the center.

The Center will be co-directed by Professors Katherine Walter and Kenneth Price.

PROGRAM COSTS: It is proposed that the Center will in time sustain its activities through

continued external funding. Currently the University has designated Programs of Excellence (POE) funding in the amount of \$254,000 annually from January 2004 through June 2008 to CDRH and external grants totaling \$269,000 support the projects. Grants in the amount of \$866,147 have been submitted during the current fiscal year to external

funding agencies; these proposals are still under review.

Proposal regarding a Center for Digital Research in the Humanities August, 2005

Introduction

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln is exceptionally well positioned to take a national or international leadership role in the burgeoning arena of digital humanities research. In 2004, the University of Nebraska recognized the digital research initiatives of the University Libraries and the College of Arts and Sciences by granting Programs of Excellence funding to the Digital Research in the Humanities priority program. Led by Professors Kenneth M. Price (UNL English Dept.) and Katherine L. Walter (UNL Libraries), the program now houses eighteen scholarly projects involving faculty, staff, and students in English, History, Modern Languages and Literature, Classics, the University of Nebraska Press, the Plains Humanities Alliance, and the Center for Great Plains Studies. Creating a Center to house these activities would strengthen current initiatives, broaden collaborations within the University of Nebraska system and with other academic institutions, and leverage additional external funding to support a vigorous research agenda.

UNL's Digital Research in the Humanities Initiative has a successful record of coordinating interdisciplinary projects and attracting external funding to advance scholarship and other online projects support research, instruction and creative activities in programs across the institution. The proposed Center will serve to assist faculty in developing projects that are technologically sustainable and of considerable scholarly significance. In addition, the Center will serve as a magnet for grants and private donations.

Our experiences to date illustrate the potential of digital humanities projects to foster collaborative research, secure external funding, support graduate and undergraduate education, and attract visiting scholars. Creating a Center for Digital Research in the Humanities at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln will ensure that we capitalize upon this potential. Moreover, the proposed Center will become a resource within the University of Nebraska system for collaboration with the other campuses and with other higher educational institutions in Nebraska.

The success of the current initiative is illustrated by the following projects accessible from the UNL website: Walt Whitman Archive; Willa Cather Electronic Archive; Omaha Indian Artifacts and Images; and the Journals of the Lewis and Clark Expedition Online. About twelve more projects will be developed with seed monies from the Programs of Excellence (PoE) funds. Elevating the Digital Research in the Humanities program to the status of a Center will foster further interdisciplinary projects, attract increased international and congressional interest, and build on previous successes leveraging external funding.

The University Libraries will serve as the primary administrative unit, working collaboratively with the College of Arts & Sciences. Faculty working in the unit will continue to have their tenure home in their primary departments.

Evidence of Need and Demand

During the last decade, a handful of major digital humanities centers have emerged. Among the most notable are the Institute for Advanced Technology in the Humanities (IATH) at the University of Virginia and the Centre for Computing in the Humanities at King's College, London. One of these, IATH, is a partner with UNL on two grant projects. In our region, there is nothing comparable to the proposed scholarly center at UNL, although there are institutions digitizing library materials. This center will engage in some digitization of library materials, but its primary focus will be on scholarly interpretations of unique materials. The development of humanities digitization projects at UNL over the last four years

has been exponential, and creating a center for fostering these projects will allow the University of Nebraska to both fill a void and attract grant-funded projects of national and international significance.

The proposed center at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln is ready to work cooperatively with those interested in digital humanities research on other campuses of the University of Nebraska system and in higher education institutions in the state, region, and nation. External reviewers noted in the University Libraries' most recent Academic Program Review that the Libraries' experience in this arena is a strength and that UNL is well-positioned to take on a greater role.

Description and Purpose of the Proposed Unit:

The Center's main priority will be to broaden access to unique cultural resources and enrich interpretation of the human record. It will achieve these ends by fostering collaborative or interdisciplinary research that demonstrates high standards of digital scholarship in the humanities. The Center will distinguish itself by focusing on projects with potential for attracting national or international acclaim and by working with scholars to form interdisciplinary research teams.

The proposed co-directors of the Center are known for their commitment to digital scholarship and their success in creating digital research projects. Kenneth M. Price is co-director of the *Walt Whitman Archive*, and Katherine L. Walter is Chair of the Libraries' Digital Initiatives & Special Collections. The two have collaborated on three grant projects relating to the *Walt Whitman Archive*. Walter has also co-directed projects relating to Lewis and Clark (with Dr. Gary Dunham), Willa Cather (with the late Dr. Susan Rosowski), and was the primary author for an IMLS-funded proposal on Omaha Indian Artifacts and Images. Since 1997, Price has raised around \$1.3 million for Whitman projects alone, and Walter has raised about \$1.9 million in humanities grants since 1990.

Digital Research in the Humanities plans to aggressively pursue grants and research contracts as described in this proposal. The establishment of a center will position UNL to be competitive in obtaining grants from a wide range of funding agencies that support the humanities. Conversations with federal funding agencies such as IMLS and NEH, with congressional staff, and with foundations indicate that a center of this nature has a very high potential for external funding. Initially, these grants will center around the scholarly interests and expertise of UNL and University of Nebraska system faculty. Over time, the proposed center will build on its strong project base to emerge as a national resource center for faculty at other institutions engaged in similar research who are unable to find adequate technical or scholarly support on their home campuses. These collaborations will always be carefully considered and only undertaken when there is good programmatic justification for doing so; for example, an intellectually-rewarding and high-profile research initiative with good prospects of gaining federal grant funding that could be shared across institutions.

Adequacy of Resources

UNL's commitment to digital scholarship in the humanities has been demonstrated through the reallocation of resources, including faculty and staff lines, both within the UNL Libraries and the UNL College of Arts & Sciences. Investment in the long-term potential of this initiative has been demonstrated by the Office of Academic Affairs through the allocation of Programs of Excellence Funding.

Noteworthy investments in Digital Research in the Humanities include reallocations of faculty and staff positions in University Libraries, Program of Excellence Funding, significant external grants totaling approximately \$1.3 million, recruitment of a Named Professorship to this area, and allocation of space in the Libraries for these activities.

Avoidance of Unnecessary Duplication

The proposed center will use integrated research teams of scholars, librarians, archivists, and (when appropriate) publishers in the development of digital humanities research projects. Each of these communities possesses special expertise, and, in our experience to date, has made a significant difference in the outcomes of the projects. This melding of communities, and the emphasis on scholarly analysis rather than just on digitization, is different from the efforts of institutions involved in developing digital libraries. As noted earlier, there are no comparable centers in the region and only a handful in the nation.

Meeting the Needs of the State

One great advantage of online material is that it is easily accessible in rural areas, providing individuals in remote locations an even playing field for access to information and research. Major metropolitan areas are more likely to have archives and numerous research libraries. Thanks to the internet, researchers, students, and the public no longer need to travel to collections in major metropolitan areas. Occasionally, original primary materials must be examined in person. When this occurs, however, the availability of online resources can make travel more efficient by helping to identify the most important items ahead of time.

Meeting Educational Needs through Partnerships and Collaboration

The proposed Center will serve as a resource for faculty and students on all campuses within the University of Nebraska system who are interested in digital research in the humanities. Opportunities for partnerships among these and other higher education institutions in the state will increase as the Center matures and shares its expertise with others. Students involved in digital humanities research projects will have advantages in the workplace. University of Nebraska graduates will be brought into the forefront by learning skills that are increasingly necessary in the 21st century.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approval is requested for designation of the Center for ePortfolio-Based

Assessment at the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

PREVIOUS ACTION: None

EXPLANATION: The designation of this Center is appropriate given the fact that

UNO's work in ePortfolio development and research is already recognized nationally and internationally. UNO was one of only 21 institutions invited to participate in the National Coalition of Electronic Portfolio Research (NCEPR). Proposed Center faculty and staff have given national and international presentations, published and provided consultations on ePortfolios and ePortfolio assessment, and have been invited to edit and host the NCEPR newsletter,

National Coalition News.

Yet, the focus of CeBA is not limited to internal processes and local community engagement; it is equally focused on a national and international scope. Perhaps most importantly, the proposed Center structure consolidates and integrates current student, administrative, college, and departmental ePortfolio-related resources. Furthermore, the Center will conduct research and provide ePortfolio development resources to PK-16.

Moreover, the objectives and purpose of CeBA are firmly in line with the new NCA criteria for accreditation, and with AQIP standards for assessment and continuous improvement of student learning. In fact, the myMAPP system comprises the first of four action plans that UNO is undertaking as part of UNO's AQIP initiative.

In 2000, UNO developed an Institutional ePortfolio to demonstrate progress toward campus strategic goals and to proactively address the focus that accrediting organizations, governmental agencies, and other external partners are now giving learning outcomes and accountability in higher education. In 2005, the College of Education launched a faculty ePortfolio which supported the college's annual review process. COE faculty built and implemented the current COE web-based student ePortfolio. The COE student ePortfolio serves all teacher candidates throughout the multi-year completion of a Bachelor of Education degree program. In the past year, the COE Student ePortfolio was expanded to the Counseling and Educational Administration and Supervision departments. In the College of Arts and Sciences, at the department level, faculty directed the creation and implementation of Student Digital

Portfolio (SDP) versions of Composition I and II, which were piloted fall 2003 through spring 2004. Features of this ePortfolio include pre- and post-Technology Literacy Surveys administered through a course management system, which assess the effectiveness of SDP versions of Composition courses in facilitating student technological literacy.

PROJECT COSTS:

\$102,000, however funding is already committed for the activities of the Center through reallocation and reassignment of faculty and staff to this effort. No additional state funding is necessary for creation of CeBA, or for the unit's operation. Furthermore, in cooperation with various local, state, and federal agencies and officials, the unit will seek additional external grants and contracts to support future projects, programs, and activities consistent with CeBA's mission.

SUPPORT FOR THE: PROGRAM:

The COE student ePortfolio was originally developed as part of UNO's "Preparing Teachers to Use Technology" PT³ Project, and funded by U.S. Department of Education PT3 funds. The Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs has provided seed money to the office of assessment for the project. One aspect of support of the Center is the unique expertise proposed Center faculty bring to this project. For instance, one proposed member of CeBA faculty served during AY 2004-2005 on the NCA's Higher Learning Commission Assessment Think-Tank, and will serve in AY 2005-2006 on the Higher Learning Commission's Assessment Institute Design Team. Another proposed member of CeBA faculty's research in and development of ePortfolios in COE brought UNO the national recognition necessary for an invitation to join NCEPR's Cohort II. In addition, the concept of a Center has been approved by local school district administrators and is supported by the Nebraska Department of Education.

PROPOSAL TO ESTABLISH THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA CENTER FOR ePORTFOLIO-BASED ASSESSMENT (CeBA)

1. Purpose and Context for the Center

This proposal seeks creation of a Center for ePortfolio-Based Assessment (CeBA) at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Recent trends have put the spotlight on accountability and thus commitment to improved student learning in P-16 education. Public and private education systems are seeking better ways to document their impact on student learning, demonstrate continuous progress toward strategic goals and objectives, and address compliance with standards. Both external accrediting bodies and government agencies are insisting that educational systems demonstrate the value they add to the educational experience of students. Yet the quest for better accountability is driven by more than just a concern for compliance, it is also driven by the competitive desire of institutions to improve.

CeBA will lead UNO's continuing development and deployment of myMAPP (Mapping Academic Performance through ePortfolios), an integrated ePortfolio system that provides comprehensive documentation of the institution's continuous improvement of student learning and progress toward strategic objectives and standards, and addresses the aforementioned issues. CeBA activities will thus be focused on the research, development, and use of performance-based approaches to assessment which provide a baseline for building the contextualized assessment history necessary for assessing student learning and program improvement over time. This form of assessment is not only most appropriate for portfolios (as performance assessments), but is also particularly appropriate for UNO's institutional portfolio approach to university-wide assessment. The assessment results reported provide the reflective, site-based, collaborative results most useful for effecting and demonstrating continuous improvement.

Mission:

To develop, document, and research innovative, integrated ePortfolios that provide ways to illustrate progress from the individual student level to the level of an entire educational system. In addition, the center will conduct research on and provide ePortfolio development resources to P-16 education systems.

Historical Context:

In 2000, UNO developed an Institutional ePortfolio to demonstrate progress toward campus strategic goals and to proactively address the needs of accrediting organizations, governmental agencies, and external constituencies, particularly as they focus on outcomes and accountability in higher education.

Originally developed as part of UNO's U.S. Department of Education-funded PT³ Project "Preparing Teachers to Use Technology," the College of Education (COE)

built and implemented a web-based ePortfolio which serves all teacher candidates throughout the multi-year completion of a bachelor in education degree. In the past year, the COE student ePortfolio was expanded to the Counseling and Educational Administration and Supervision departments.

At the department level, UNO's College of Arts & Sciences (CAS) faculty have directed the creation and implementation of Student Digital Portfolio (SDP) versions of Composition I and II. The SDP sections were piloted in the department of English Fall 2003 through Spring 2004. Features of this ePortfolio included pre- and post-Technology Literacy Surveys, administered though a course management system, that assessed the effectiveness of SDP versions of Composition courses in facilitating student technological literacy.

Importantly, UNO's Information Technology Services staff were early pioneers in highly innovative web-based services in higher education. In 1995, UNO began development of a web-based system known as E-BRUNO (Electronic - Better Registration at UNO). The experiences gained from E-BRUNO development laid a solid foundation on which to build a faculty portfolio system by demonstrating ITS's ability to break new technological ground and develop critical systems to meet the campus needs when other options did not exist.

Need for the Center:

The proposed Center is poised to be a major contributor in the field of ePortfolio development and research. The proposed Center will bring together creative faculty, student, and staff researchers and practitioners with common interests in assessment and ePortfolios. It is anticipated that the facilitative environment of a Center will produce innovative collaborative research, as well as the development of partnerships with a wide range of local, regional, national, and international educational systems. In addition, the administrative structure of a Center is necessary for attracting external funding including grants and contracts.

Moreover, current calls for accountability and improvement of student learning pressing upon P-16 education have created a demand for the efficient documentation systems and practical methods of authentic assessment which are addressed by the ePortfolio system designed and implemented at UNO. While the need of some institutions for ePortfolio assessment is a documentation and compliance method, for others ePortfolios offer a practical strategy for continuous improvement of student learning, improvement of teaching methodology, and streamlining administrative functions and technological services. In either case, the proposed Center will offer to a broad educational constituency a pragmatic solution to their problems.

The cornerstone of the software to be used by the center is myMAPP, an integrated ePortfolio system developed by UNO's Information Technology Services. The web-based database is congruent with the strategic technical architecture of

interoperability, open standards, and use of common, cost-effective technologies available in higher education.

2. Organizational Structure and Administrative Arrangements for the Faculty and Staff

The proposed Center maximizes campus progress in the area of ePortfolio development and research by consolidating and integrating current administrative, college, and departmental ePortfolio-related resources. The Director, Dr. Sheri Rogers, Associate Vice-Chancellor of Academic Affairs, will report to the Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs. Center projects and research will involve UNO deans, chairs, faculty, staff and students currently including but not limited to:

Faculty:

Academic Affairs will administer the Center for ePortfolio-Based Assessment. During its initial year, Dr. Neal Topp and Dr. Marsha Watson will devote .5 FTE each to the Center.

Executive Council and myMAPP Steering Committee

This oversight body will be comprised of faculty, staff, and student representatives who will assist the Director in establishing and maintaining overall program direction and focus. The Executive Council and Steering Committee will also oversee the development and implementation of myMAPP, the cornerstone of the software system to be used by the Center.

3. Constituencies to be Served

The center will conduct research and provide the following ePortfolio development resources to local, national, and international P-16 education systems, as well as public and private agencies focused on educational accountability, streamlining of documentation systems, and the continuous improvement of student learning:

• Technical resources

- Support services which will guide other institutions through implementation and maintenance processes via the following:
 - Team-Based Workshops: In these 2-3 day workshops, an institutional team attends informational sessions and works through structured "team-time" working sessions to develop implementation plans that will work for the team's own campus. The workshops are designed to host both external institutional teams and departmental teams from UNO. National and international presentations and publications on myMAPP, as well as on-site consultations and a web presence will serve as highly effective ways to advertise these workshops.
 - o Online resources
 - Assessment Consultation: The Center will offer consulting services on integrating online assessments with the requirements of the Academic Quality Improvement Program (AQIP) and the Program to Evaluate and Advance Quality (PEAQ), the two accreditation paths offered by the North Central Association's Higher Learning Commission.
 - Open source Web software: An open-source approach allows UNO to contribute both nationally and internationally to the field of outcomes research in higher education.

4. Alterations in Existing Activities

Establishment of the Center will not significantly alter the activities of the faculty and students affiliated with it, except to more clearly focus their efforts and increase the efficiency of research administration, collaborations, and consultative services. Center faculty will continue to be intensely involved in teaching and research duties. However, the Center structure and activities will greatly enhance and expand the ability of faculty and staff to carry out research programs, collaborative projects, and to obtain external funding from government agencies and foundations. Thus, the establishment of CeBA will significantly advance improvement and documentation of student learning at UNO, and at local, national, and international P-16 institutions of learning as Center activities and research are disseminated.

5. Relationship of Center to the Mission of the University of Nebraska

The pioneering spirit has been a constant in Nebraska. The University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) continues this tradition with the development of an ePortfolio Center. The Center's comprehensive approach to electronic documentation of an institution's continuous progress toward improvement of student learning, as well as strategic objectives and standards, serves as a model that can be used by other educational systems, thus meeting the University of Nebraska's mission to serve the citizens of the state.

6. Measures of Success

Consistent with its mission, the ultimate success of the Center will depend on its ability to fully implement myMAPP on the UNO campus. Success will be evaluated in three domains: research, education, and application services. Initial research efforts will focus on four areas:

- Changes in program and the institutional culture facilitated by ePortfolios.
- Changes in instruction facilitated by ePortfolios.
- Changes in the ePortfolio process.
- Changes in the ePortfolio author's learning and thinking.

CeBA progress on the initial research agenda will naturally uncover even more important areas of research, as will the changing needs in academe and business, so it is expected that the Center's research agenda will be a matter of continuous evolution. The Center's mission will in this way reflect an enthusiasm for responding to the changing needs of our various constituencies.

The success of educational activities and application services will be reflected in the processes, products, papers, books, and articles Center faculty, staff, and student researchers produce, as well as in the production of "expert" services to external constituencies such as workshops and consulting services.

The Center will engage in a formal self-study and review process every three years. The review will be undertaken by a review team composed of CeBA faculty and staff, external faculty representatives from within and outside UNO, UNO students, and external constituents/community representatives. The review team will specifically review assessment results of CeBA research, education, and service activities, as well as programs to pinpoint areas for continuous improvement in these areas. In addition, the review team will assess the responsiveness of CeBA research, educational activities, and application services to the changing needs of internal and external constituencies.

8. Impact on Library and Technology Needs

The CeBA planning team is comprised of key players from the library and Information Technology Services (ITS) in order to positively impact meaningful connections while minimizing the negative impact.

9. Facility Needs

The Center will require ongoing use of office space in the Eppley Administration Building. Conference room space in the Milo Bail Student Center will be the primary location for service activities when Center faculty and staff conduct workshops for internal and external customers.

10. Anticipated Outcomes and Significance

Ultimately the Center's activities will lead to improvement in student learning. Center faculty, staff, and student researchers will utilize a consensus building process that involves department, college, campus, and educational system stakeholders in assessment, discussion, and analysis of design and content so that those who are using it gain an understanding and acceptance of the system as it is being developed. A key element of development is faculty engagement in the process. Design and content of application and application services will involve significant discussions with faculty, staff, students, and external stakeholders about categorization and prioritization of their needs and activities. These discussions are intended to uncover inconsistencies in approaches to teaching, application, and research that, once analyzed, will in some cases lead to changes in design, content, and practices. In addition, the Center will document student, faculty, and staff learning and illustrate growth for the purpose of quality improvement.

Tract One - Consists of approximately 42.35 irrigated acres used for production of corn and soybeans and approximately 29.57 sub-irrigated acres of meadow used for hay production located north of State Farm Road about 1 mile east of the WCREC office complex and adjacent to the North Platte city limits [within Section 16, Township 13 North, Range 30 West, Lincoln County, Nebraska]. Due to its location and configuration, Tract One has been identified as surplus because of increased car and truck traffic from commercial and urban development. The long, narrow configuration and slope of the cropland limits its usefulness in irrigation studies and access to the sub-irrigated meadow is limited to a road along the east side of a Nebraska Public Power District canal. The estimated value of Tract One is \$120,000.

Tract Two - Consists of a 640 acre section of rangeland used for yearling cattle research that has been part of beef systems work at the UNL Gudmundsen Sandhills Laboratory and WCREC in Lincoln County located about 19 miles north of WCREC on County Line Road [Section 11, Township 16 North, Range 30 West, Lincoln County, Nebraska]. Tract Two has been identified as surplus property because of poor access due to unimproved and poorly maintained roads, which hinder loading and unloading cattle within this rangeland. The estimated value of Tract Two is \$160,000.

There are no buildings or significant livestock handling equipment on either tract. Tract One has an irrigation well located on the southeast

corner. Tract Two has one new well with windmill and two stock tanks located on the south half of the property and one new well with windmill and stock tank located on the north half of the property.

Current research activities on the two tracts for sale would be relocated to the proposed additional land, allowing for new research and redirection of current research to water use and water efficiency research in cropping and livestock production systems.

Approval of this agenda item will authorize the sale of the tracts by public auction or sealed bids as provided in Regents Policies with the University having the right to reject any and all bids that are not responsive to the University's terms of sale, and to reject all bids if the highest bid price is determined at the discretion of the Vice Chancellor for Business and Finance to be inadequate.



educated and well-trained graduates.

Although not a licensure program, the MALT will provide rigorous language-specific graduate education opportunities for language teachers. No other program of this kind is offered either in Omaha or within reasonable commuting distance from Omaha. The University, therefore, is in the unique position of providing educational opportunities tailored to fit the interests and needs of area teachers. This program also responds to the changing demographics of the state by promoting multilingual and multicultural understanding. Feedback on a detailed openended survey sent to 175 language teachers in 2000, plus an additional 90 teachers in a second 2004 survey, demonstrates that Nebraska foreign language and ESOL teachers are in desperate search of a graduate program that provides an opportunity to improve their language skills, offers course variety (i.e., neither a purely literary program, nor an educationonly degree), offers renewed contact with the target culture, and includes courses in linguistics/second language acquisition.

The proposal has been reviewed and approved by the College of Arts and Sciences, the UNO Graduate Council, the University of Nebraska Executive Graduate Council, and the Council of Academic Officers.

UNO Master of Arts in Language Teaching (MALT) Executive Summary

Program Description

The Master of Arts in Language Teaching (MALT) is a multidisciplinary degree program to be offered by the UNO Department of Foreign Languages in conjunction with faculty members from the Department of English and the College of Education. The program draws from current faculty who teach French, German, Spanish, English, linguistics, literature, culture, TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages), foreign language methods, and instructional technology. Completion of this degree will greatly enhance the knowledge and preparation of individuals interested in teaching foreign languages and/or English as a second or other language.

As revealed by two needs-assessment surveys, our target population (future and practicing language teachers) specifically requests a program that will allow them to improve their language skills, offers course variety (i.e., neither a literature-, nor an education-only degree), provides renewed contact with the target culture, and offers courses in linguistics/second language acquisition. Armed with this information, the entire MALT proposal has been informed by the needs and interests of Nebraska language teachers. Indeed, MALT courses have been expressly crafted to give students a forum in which they will apply language teaching theory and methodology to the language, literature, and cultural experiences gained from language-specific coursework. Moreover, in final course projects and on the comprehensive exit exams, students will expand upon the fusion of content (language, literature, and culture) and language teaching methodology. Specifically, students will be asked to apply the research and methodology to the material and content gained in the advanced language/literature and culture courses; in other words, it provides a meaningful and interdisciplinary capstone experience.

<u>Audience / Potential Students</u>

The target audience for this program includes current and future K-12 second language and ESOL teachers in Nebraska and neighboring states such as lowa, South Dakota, and Kansas. The entire MALT program is designed--both in terms of curriculum and scheduling--to fit the needs of practicing teachers. Late afternoon/evening courses, summer courses, distance education, and the compact summer program abroad will allow practicing teachers to complete this program without disrupting their careers.

An additional audience for the MALT are students seeking a graduate program in language study, yet not interested in traditional literature-oriented MA and PhD programs.

Benefits

Since the primary mission of the MALT is instruction, it will enhance the knowledge and preparation of individuals interested in language teaching, providing the state with educated and competent graduates. Likewise, these graduates will continue to educate and stimulate communities in Nebraska and beyond. Indeed, students with deeper insights into their own language and culture, as well as those with knowledge of differing languages and cultures, will bring about a more educated and cultured metropolitan community and promote a richer understanding of ourselves and others.

With the Masters of Arts in Language Teaching, UNO will expand its participation in the community. For example, graduate students pursuing their degree in TESOL will interact with different school districts, establishing new links with numerous teachers and students. It will also contribute to improved relationships with the growing nonnative-English- speaking populations in Omaha and other areas.

This program responds to the changing demographics of the state by promoting multilingual and multicultural understanding. The MALT will also meet the needs of Nebraska's increasingly diverse student populations by promoting awareness of linguistic, cultural, and ethnic diversity. Coursework will allow students to renew and expand their knowledge of other languages, peoples, and cultures.

No other program of this kind is offered either in Omaha or within reasonable commuting distance. The University, therefore, is in the unique position of providing educational opportunities tailored to fit the interests and needs of area teachers. The existence of this unique graduate program—the only program of its kind in the region (Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, North and South Dakota) has the potential to retain language teachers and even attract new educators to Nebraska.

Demand / Need

Feedback on a detailed open-ended survey sent to 175 language teachers in 2000, plus an additional 90 teachers in a second 2004 survey, demonstrates that Nebraska foreign language and ESOL teachers are in desperate search of a graduate program that provides an opportunity to improve their language skills, offers course variety (i.e., neither a purely literary program, nor an education-only degree), offers renewed contact with the target culture, and includes courses in linguistics/second language acquisition.

There is considerable evidence of need on a statewide basis as well as on the local school district level for the MALT as indicated in the letter from the Director of Foreign Language Education at the Nebraska Department of Education (see Full Proposal, Appendix B). She not only points out the shortage of foreign

language teachers in the state, but also notes that this program "is especially important as it meets the needs of school districts not only in the metropolitan area, but statewide. The Master of Arts degree will allow teachers to enhance their knowledge base and skills through the advanced study of the target languages.

Demographic changes will make the need for this program even more evident. Due to the retirement of a large number of teachers in the next five to seven years and their replacement with new teachers, there will be an even greater need for the benefits of our planned program. Additionally, the immigrant population to our area and to our state has continued to grow rapidly, thus requiring school systems to respond to the needs of their students; they want to enhance all modalities of their English language capabilities.

Finally, businesses are increasingly demanding a multiculturally and multilinguistically educated workforce. The MALT not only meets this demand directly by educating MALT students but indirectly as well. Since the majority of MALT students will be language educators, the ultimate effect and scope of the MALT program on future generations is immeasurable.

Cost Efficiency

The proposed MALT is an efficient and cost-effective program. The Department of Foreign Languages already offers dually listed undergraduate and graduate level courses; these existing courses are designed to be used in conjunction with curricular requirements of the MALT. These courses, as well as existing graduate courses in the Department of English and the College of Education, will enjoy increased enrollments and greater economies of scale as a result of the MALT program. Select MALT courses will also support other existing UNO master's degree programs in English and Education by providing graduate electives to students of other programs of study.

Projected incremental expenses will likely include adjunct faculty salaries for lower division courses, supplies and materials, library resources, and other miscellaneous items for a total of \$28,750 requested in Year 1. Due to the specializations and diversity of the current faculty, no tenure-track 1.0 FTE positions are needed for this program. The program will result in increased enrollments for many existing courses. Additionally, 6 credit hours (2 courses) in each target language will be offered via a study abroad component that requires no financial commitment from UNO.

Hospitality, Restaurant and Tourism Management Undergraduate Major Proposal Executive Summary

Description and Purpose of the Proposed Program: The program prepares individuals to serve as general managers and directors of comprehensive hospitality operations. It will be uniquely structured to identify several national and international niches:

- a holistic approach to hospitality management with a common theme found in all options environmental responsibility;
- the development of sustainable tourism through proper ecological utilization and management of the natural resources that serve as tourist attractions;
- guidance for small communities to identify and develop entrepreneurial enterprises;
- an extension education component to enhance professionals in the hospitality industry;
- the first nationally to integrate a CulinologyTM program accredited by the Research Chefs Association into a hospitality program;
- focus on the leadership and team building skills required to successfully manage a hospitality, restaurant and/or tourism enterprise and its staff;
- enhance economic development opportunities by developing event and conference planning professionals;
- support marketing/promotion opportunities through coursework in advertising, broadcasting and news writing; and,
- focus on unique cultural opportunities in Nebraska.

We expect hospitality demands to expand in metropolitan Nebraska and niche markets to be developed in rural areas. University of Nebraska-Lincoln is the premier research and undergraduate institution in the state and as such is well poised to provide four-year undergraduate and graduate programs to educate professionals for the hospitality industry. The land grant mission mandates outreach programming for practicing professionals. Including Nebraska Extension faculty in the plan will strengthen the existing hospitality workforce.

The hospitality management program at UNL will be multi-disciplinary among the College of Education and Human Sciences (CEHS), the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR), and the Nebraska Extension Division, as well as course offerings by the College of Business Administration (CBA). The Department of Nutrition and Health Sciences will assume a leadership role in the development and implementation of this program, building on existing options in Restaurant Management, Dietetics and Culinology. Units within the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources will provide instruction, research and outreach directed at all aspects of ecosystem management for sustainable tourism, focused on Nebraska ecosystems. Nebraska extension faculty in the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources (IANR) who have an interest in statewide economic development will provide support by working with restaurant, lodging and tourism professionals.

Two goals of the program are to provide expanded career opportunities for Nebraska students and to enlarge the pool of Nebraska professionals available to the hospitality industry. A quality assurance goal is accreditation by the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality.

Program of Study: The new major includes instruction in principles of operations in the travel and tourism, hotel and lodging facilities, convention and meeting planning, food services and recreation

facilities industries. It will integrate hospitality marketing strategies, personnel management, accounting and financial management into a curriculum focused on managing facilities and operations that provide lodging, convention, tourism and food services to the public. The proposed curriculum includes 40 credit hours of general education requirements and a hospitality management core of 32 credit hours. There are eight proposed areas of specialization: Food and Beverage, Lodging, Ecotourism, Human Resources, Convention/Meetings, Parks and Recreation, Public Relations and Journalism.

Partnerships with Business. External partners include the Nebraska Hotel-Motel Association and the Nebraska Restaurant Association. Members of both associations can provide and will receive substantial benefits. (For example, The Nebraska Hotel-Motel Association has a proposal pending that would provide a one-time commitment of \$400,000 for the program.) A 2004 Nebraska Hotel-Motel Association industry study revealed that most respondents offered or plan to offer internships in the hospitality, restaurant and tourism management area.

Collaborations Within the University. UNL departments that will provide course work are: Management; Finance; Accountancy; Economics; Marketing; Agricultural Economics; Agriculture Leadership, Education and Communication; Food Science and Technology; Agronomy and Horticulture; and the College of Journalism and Mass Communications. Nebraska Extension faculty in the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources (IANR) will play a key role in the program.

Preliminary discussions to establish a partnership with the University of Nebraska at Kearney (UNK) College of Education, Department of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Leisure Studies are underway. CASNR has existing A to B programs in Pre-Agricultural Sciences, Pre-Natural Resources, Pre-Food Science and Technology and Pre-Horticulture at the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO). Plans are being developed for a pre-hospitality management program on the UNO campus.

Collaborations External to the University. Discussions regarding this program have occurred with Metropolitan Community College's (Omaha; Metro) Culinary Institute department chair and Southeast Community College's (Lincoln; SECC) department chair in Food Service/Hospitality. Subsequent to approval for the Hospitality Management program, articulation agreements with Metro and SECC will be developed and will be sought with the other schools in Nebraska's Community College system and with Iowa Western Community College.

Evidence of Need: Tourism is Nebraska's third largest revenue producer from outside the state (Nebraska Department of Economic Development, 2003). Travelers spent over \$2.8 billion in Nebraska overnight stays in paid accommodations and on day trips. About 46,000 jobs are attributable to travel spending in Nebraska. The state has over 26,000 hotel, motel and bed and breakfast rooms. In Nebraska (2003 data) there are 4,578 restaurants, employing 58,300 people, with a projected growth at 4% per year (National Restaurant Association website: www.restaurant.org). The restaurant industry share of the national food dollar is 46.4%, to be 53% in 2010. The projected total restaurant industry employment increases from 9.4 million in 1994 to 12.0 million in 2004, and to 13.5 million in 2014. Nationally, there were 386,000 Foodservice Management Jobs in 2002. Growth in jobs will be as fast as average growth for all occupations through 2012: an increase of 10 to 20% (U.S. Department of Labor). A 2004 Nebraska Hotel-Motel Association industry survey found a need for qualified applicants in hospitality across entry, middle and top management positions.

Evidence of Student Demand: Interest in hospitality careers is increasing as evidenced by growth in the *ProStart Program*, a secondary education program sponsored by the Education Foundation of the National Restaurant Association and supported by Nebraska Extension. In 2004, there were 34 ProStart Programs in schools across Nebraska with approximately 1,200 students enrolled. In 2005, additional Nebraska schools are planning to initiate ProStart programs. ProStart will help recruit students into

UNL's hospitality program and encourage these students to pursue a post-secondary program in Nebraska. Currently, Denver area two and four-year schools are recruiting heavily in the Scottsbluff area for students interested in hospitality. Enrollment in similar programs in other states varies from 50 at South Dakota State to 300 at the University of Missouri. Universities with total enrollments similar to UNL have hospitality enrollments of 200 to 300 students. We expect ultimate enrollments of about 200 at UNL, given the size of the hospitality industry in Nebraska.

Faculty and Staff Resources. Current faculty FTE of 2.25 and 3 graduate teaching assistants support Restaurant/Foodservice Administration, Dietetics and CulinologyTM. Through IANR reallocation, three additional faculty members will be hired (one in lodging, convention and meeting planning; one in tourism; and one in hospitality accounting). These positions will include Extension or Agriculture Research Division appointments as well as teaching responsibilities. Additional resources will be needed to cover administrative non-teaching staff (1.0 FTE); graduate teaching and research assistants. If student enrollment increases as expected, additional faculty and assistantships will be needed in the Department of Nutrition and Health Sciences. To meet program demands, a fourth faculty position (projected, year 4) would be added. This position will be targeted toward the emphasis area of greatest growth and may be a shared position external to the partnering colleges. This fourth position would allow for reassignment of responsibilities within the faculty with the creation of a program director (0.5 FTE) position.

Physical Facilities, Instructional Equipment and Informational Resources. Students enrolled in this major will take courses already offered at UNL. Initially we have adequate classrooms, laboratory space, kitchens, conference and office space, computer access and library resources for the program. Housing Dining Services I provide additional facilities for student-planned catered events. A catering/product innovation lab is needed to support CulinologyTM and Restaurant/ Foodservice Administration. Funding for renovations, additional space and equipment will be provided through a one-time investment of the Nebraska Hotel-Motel Association. These updates will occur in Years Two and Three. Additional instructional resources such as computers, software and library resources will occur as the program grows. These will be acquired by reallocating departmental resources as needed.

Program Costs. IANR reallocations will fund three new faculty positions—two positions in Year One (\$170,000), one position in Year Two (\$65,000). As growth warrants, a fourth faculty position will be added (\$55,000). This will be a program director (0.5 FTE). Funding for an administrative staff person will occur Year One (\$36,200). Masters and doctoral-level graduate assistants are planned into the first five years (\$72,000 total). Additional assistantships will be supported through external grant funding. Additional faculty will be funded as needed through reallocation of positions and from new funding as it becomes available. General operating expenses are expected to fluctuate from years one (\$40,000) through five (\$15,000).

Equipment and facility costs in Years Two and Three are pending through external support in the amount of \$400,000 from the Nebraska Hotel-Motel Association. Nebraska Extension and research positions will generate revenues through industry-related educational program fees and research funding. In addition, this program should result in new UNL admits and subsequent tuition dollars, as a hospitality program of this scope is not offered elsewhere in the state.

Bachelor of Science Landscape Architecture Undergraduate Degree Program University of Nebraska-Lincoln

Overview

Landscape Architecture is a diverse profession focusing on the creative and environmentally sensitive design, planning, development, preservation, and management of land. It has a concern for integrating existing aesthetic, social, and natural systems that range from a multi-state region to an individual garden. These factors require that landscape architects be broadly educated, inclusive in their views and inter-disciplinary in their problem-solving.

Like the task force that examined it, the proposed major is to be a collaborative endeavor that draws upon and furthers twenty-five years of cooperation between the Colleges of Architecture and Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources. The College of Architecture will operate the Landscape Architecture program. Core faculty, however, will be drawn from Architecture, Community and Regional Planning, and Agronomy and Horticulture Departments.

The mission of the proposed program states that:

The interdisciplinary Landscape Architecture degree program will combine art and science in a studio-based curriculum addressing planning, design, development, management, rehabilitation and preservation of the land.

The proposed major would be five years -- a two-year pre-landscape architecture program with select entry into its last three years. This structure and sequence allows flexibility for movement of students between CARCH and CASNR to the degree program that most fits a students needs. It is expected this flexibility will improve student retention in both colleges.

Accreditation is necessary to meet one of the prerequisites for professional licensure in the State of Nebraska and 46 other states. Accredited Landscape Architecture programs must meet a host of criteria, pay a sustaining fee and are reviewed every 6 years for re-accreditation. In addition to meeting the University of Nebraska-Lincoln requirements for Essential and Integrated Studies courses, accreditation requires the following areas of course work.

The minimum professional program content shall generally include:

Landscape Architecture History and Theory

Professional Practice

Landscape Planning, Design and Management

Design Implementation

With these specified areas of instruction:

History, art, and communication

Natural and social systems

Landscape management theories, planning, design, and processes

Plants and their ecosystems

Construction materials and implementation techniques

Professional practice methods and ethics

Applications of computers and advanced technology

Allied disciplines

The goal of the proposed major is to produce skilled and knowledgeable Landscape Architecture graduates who are:

- interdisciplinary solvers of complex, land-based, urban and rural environmental problems
- analysts of natural and human resource data and synthesizers of solutions aided by technology for the preservation, development and management of public and private land
- communicators and leaders helping public and private entities to visualize a shared sustainable future habitat
- designers creating art, science, and human systems, especially those that are sustainable into the future

EXPLANATION: This proposed ConE degree replaces the current Construction Engineering

and Technology degree which is offered exclusively at UNO and is non-accredited. This new degree, through collaboration of the departments of Construction Management and Civil Engineering in Lincoln and the Construction Systems department in the Peter Kiewit Institute at UNO, will allow students in both Omaha and Lincoln the opportunity to enter either the Construction Management or Construction Engineering degree program and

to become licensed engineers in both programs.

In addition to meeting the needs of students through the addition of this degree program, we are also serving the need for construction engineers

both in our city, state and universe.

The program will be permanently housed in the Charles W. Durham School of Architectural Engineering and Construction and will enhance the education of construction students in this state and will provide greater

opportunities for our graduates.

This proposal has the approval of the collaborating units of Construction Systems, Construction Management, and Civil Engineering, the Dean of the College of Engineering and Technology, and the UNL Academic Planning

Committee.

PROGRAM COSTS: Cost is \$81,900, although it is proposed that the creation of this degree

program will not require new additional cost. Through the reallocation of existing resources there is no immediate requirement for new faculty,

Bachelor of Science Construction Engineering Undergraduate Degree Program University of Nebraska-Lincoln

The Bachelor of Science degree in Construction Engineering (B.S.Con.E.) is a program which develops the expertise of its graduates to function in an operational capacity in a wide range of increasingly complex and challenging construction situations. These situations occur in Nebraska, nationally, internationally, and most recently in space. Graduates of this program possess the structural and geotechnical knowledge of a civil engineer and the business management knowledge of a general manager in the construction industry, which is one of the largest contributors (10-12 percent) to gross domestic product.

The School of Architectural Engineering and Construction is a unit within the College of Engineering and Technology (COET) that was approved in Spring 2003 and renamed the Charles W. Durham School of Architectural Engineering and Construction in August 205. It includes the two departments of construction described below and Architectural Engineering (AE). The School proposal specifically includes the development of Construction Engineering as a new initiative to enhance construction education in Nebraska and improve the credibility of the School.

The proposed Construction Engineering program is a joint effort involving Construction Systems (Construction Engineering Technology), Construction Management, and Civil Engineering to enhance construction education in the State of Nebraska and provide greater opportunities for graduates. These three units are most affected by this proposal and are also joint sponsors. Construction Engineering Technology (CET) is offered on the Omaha campus in the Peter Kiewit Institute and includes a blend of engineering and management. Construction Management (CM) is offered on the Lincoln campus and is more focused on the management aspects of construction. The baccalaureate degree in ConE is more closely aligned in terms of academic rigor with the other engineering programs in the College of Engineering and Technology (COET) when compared with CET and CM. This degree will meet the standard engineering accreditation requirements of the Engineering Accreditation Commission-Accreditation Board Engineering and Technology (EAC-ABET). The program uses a number of courses common to many branches of engineering, most notably affecting Civil Engineering, a co-sponsor of the proposal. It adds its own construction courses similar to those taught in CET but revised to include the engineering rigor necessary to prepare students for professional engineering registration.

There is currently no construction program in the state that allows for professional engineering registration as desired by the construction industry and government agencies such as Nebraska Department of Roads and the Army Corps of Engineers. This proposal includes a mechanism whereby construction engineering is offered in both Lincoln and Omaha through the College of Engineering and Technology. Further, it maintains a single non-engineering construction program (CM) in Lincoln and provides for CM delivery in Omaha through the faculty currently in the CET program. There is no immediate demand for new faculty until the program increases existing enrollments since the greatest majority of courses are already in existence in the three proposing units.

The two existing construction programs have nearly 500 students between them. It is anticipated that approximately 1/3 of these students will seek the engineering education and 2/3 the management. This provides the students with the opportunity to get an EAC-ABET accredited construction engineering degree or construction management degree in Lincoln or Omaha by redistributing faculty teaching assignments using existing courses from CET, CM, and CE programs.

1. Additional Faculty: Show the number of additional full-time equivalent faculty and related salary and fringe benefit expenditures needed to implement the program. Each year should represent any new additional faculty above the prior year's level.

2. Additional Non-Teaching Staff: Show the number of additional full-time equivalent administrative, professional and support or other staff and related salary and fringe benef expenditures needed to implement the program. 5. Facilities: Show projected expenditures for any special facilities (general classroom, laboratory, office, etc.) that will be required for the proposed program. Include renovation of existing facilities and construction of new facilities.

6. Additional Library Resources: Show anticipated expenditures for library material directly attributable to the new program

7. Additional Other Expenses: Show other expenses not appropriate to another category.

9	1 INTRODUCTION
10	
11	1.1 Responsibilities of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities Committee. The Academic Rights
12	and Responsibilities Committee (ARRC) and its responsibilities are created by UNL Academic Senate,
13	are described in its Syllabus of Campus-Wide Committees, and are approved by the University of Nebraska
14	Board of Regents. Its Foundational Instruction, set forth in Section 3.4 of the UNL Bylaws, gives the
15	ARRC both informational and quasi-judicial responsibilities.

17	1.1.1 The ARRC has significant responsibility to ensure that faculty members and administrators
18	are appropriately apprised of rights, responsibilities, principles and procedures pertaining to matters
19	of professional relationships.

21	1.1.2 The ARRC has primary responsibility to ensure and to arrange an appropriate investigation

- 1.1.2 The ARRC has primary responsibility to ensure and to arrange an appropriate investigation or hearing when concerns or problems arise between a faculty member and the University and/or when concerns or problems related to academic freedom and tenure, grievance and professional conduct occur in the professional relationships between faculty members and others in the University community, as stated in the Syllabus of Campus-Wide Committees and the Bylaws of the Board of Regents.
- **1.1.3** The ARRC has other responsibilities assigned from time to time by the Academic Senate, including but not limited to those set forth in UNL Bylaw 3.4.1.2.¹

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¹ UNL Bylaw 3.4.1.2 sets forth these additional responsibilities:

^{3.4.1.2.1} to determine whether and to what extent recommendations of Special Committees have been acted upon, and to report status of cases to the President of the Academic Senate;

^{3.4.1.2.2} to provide for an effective process in representing the academic rights and responsibilities of the faculty;

^{3.4.1.2.3} to act with respect to matters of general policies concerning academic freedom and tenure;

^{3.4.1.2.4} to recommend actions to appropriate bodies in order to ensure academic rights and responsibilities of faculty members;

^{3.4.1.2.5} to communicate to all members of the University community appropriate channels for conveying and dealing with concerns about actual or perceived violations of faculty rights and responsibilities;

^{3.4.1.2.6} to propose to the Academic Senate changes in operating procedures and guidelines for each of the Special Committees in accord with relevant provisions of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents; **3.4.1.2.7** to submit committee minutes and make an annual report to the Academic Senate, while maintaining confidentiality concerning individual cases.

1.2 Relationship of ARRC and ARRC Procedures to Special Committees and Codes of 1 Procedures for Special Committees. Chapter 4 of the Regents Bylaws authorizes the faculty governing 2 agency of each major administrative unit to create a faculty Grievance Committee, a faculty Committee 3 4 on Academic Freedom and Tenure, and a faculty Professional Conduct Committee. The UNL Academic Senate, with the approval of the University of Nebraska Board of Regents, has vested that authority in 5 Special Committees established under the aegis of the ARRC. A description of the committees can be 6 found in the Syllabus of Campus-Wide Committees of the Academic Senate, available from the Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. 8

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This document ("ARRC Procedures") indicates how complaints are to be received by the ARRC, assessed by it for sufficiency and jurisdiction, and transmitted to a Special Committee.

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Other documents indicate how a complaint is to be handled after it has been transmitted to a Special Committee. Those documents are:

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Code of Procedures for Special AFT-A Committees, applicable to Special Academic Freedom and Tenure Committees considering complaints by a member of the professional staff alleging that action taken or threatened violates the complainant's academic freedom or academic tenure;

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Code of Procedures for Special AFT-B Committees, applicable to Special Academic 1.2.2 Freedom and Tenure Committees considering complaints in which the President or the Board of Regents seeks to terminate a faculty member's Continuous Appointment or a faculty member's Special or Specific-Term Appointment prior to its termination date:

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Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees, applicable to Special Professional 1.2.3 Conduct Committees investigating complaints charging a member of the professional staff with professional misconduct other than misconduct as defined by Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations, complaints against UNL as an institution seeking institutional action as a remedy to alleged discrimination, and complaints alleging that the complaining member of the professional staff has been wrongly accused of professional misconduct; Code of Procedures for Special PC-B Committees, applicable to Special Professional

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Conduct Committees investigating complaints by the Vice-Chancellor for Research charging a member of the professional staff with Professional Misconduct in Science: 1.2.5 Code of Procedures for Special Grievance Committees, applicable to Special Grievance Committees considering complaints by a faculty member alleging a grievance not governed by any of the Codes of Procedures identified in Sections

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> The rules for determining applicability of these Codes of Procedures are set out in Section 5 of this document.

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Any person contemplating filing a complaint with the ARRC should first consult not only this document but also the Codes of Procedures for the various Special Committees, and, in appropriate circumstances. the UNL "Policy and Procedures on Unlawful Discrimination, Including Sexual and Other Prohibited Harassment" administered by the UNL Office of Equity, Access and Diversity Programs (EAD).

All of these documents in their current form are available from the Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. For information and advice concerning these procedures, contact the Chair of the ARRC.

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1.3 Academic Rights and Responsibilities. All professional staff (including administrators and faculty members) of the University of Nebraska are entitled to enjoy and to exercise, without penalty, all the rights of an American citizen and the rights of academic freedom as specified in Regents Bylaw 4.2. It is essential to the University that all administrators and professional staff exercise and respect the exercise of these rights by others, and uphold the attendant responsibilities outlined in Regents Bylaw 4.1.

- 1.4 Duty of University Officials To Investigate and To Take Action on Known or Alleged Discrimination. University Officials have a duty promptly to investigate and to take appropriate action on all known or alleged incidents of illegal discrimination. University officials in this context shall be defined as any individual employed by UNL with job authority or responsibility to
 - 1.4.1 supervise, hire, assign or reassign responsibilities;
 - 1.4.2 recommend or grant promotion or demotion; and/or
 - 1.4.3 recommend or take any disciplinary or corrective actions.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this document, unless the context otherwise requires:

2.1 Chancellor shall mean the Chancellor of UNL.

Days shall mean days on which University offices are open for business.

2.3 EAD shall mean the UNL Office of Equity, Access and Diversity Programs.

2.4 Faculty Member shall mean any staff member of UNL holding the academic rank of lecturer or above or equivalent rank (Regents Bylaws 3.1.1.1 and 4.4).

2.5 Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations shall mean regulations covering misconduct in federally sponsored scientific research, particularly, but not exclusively, that funded by the Public Health Service. The Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research provides guidance concerning which projects may be covered by these regulations.

2.6 In Writing and Written, when used to describe a communication, shall mean that the communication so described shall be either a paper document signed by the sender or an electronic communication that can be readily accessed by the sender and by the recipient.

2.7 Parties shall mean the complainant(s) and the respondent(s).

2.8 President shall mean the President of the University of Nebraska and shall include the authorized 1 representative of the President. The President shall not extend such authorization to the Chancellor or staff 2 members of any campus of the University. 3 4 5 2.9 **Professional Staff** shall mean all UNL personnel defined as professional staff by Regents Bylaw 6 3.1.1. 7 8 2.10 **Section**, unless otherwise noted, refers to a section of this document, ARRC Procedures. 9 Vice Chancellor for Research shall mean the Vice Chancellor for Research of UNL and shall 10 2.11 include the authorized representative of the Vice Chancellor. The Vice Chancellor shall not extend such 11 authorization to Deans with collegiate or divisional responsibility or to a staff member of any such college 12 or division. 13 14 15 3 THE ARRC AND THE ARRC PANEL 16 17 of the ARRC. The ARRC shall be composed of five tenured faculty members 3.1 Membership elected for staggered three year terms by and from the Academic Assembly,² and if appointed by the 18 President of the Academic Senate in accordance with the Syllabus of Campus-Wide Committees, a non-19 voting liaison member. At the time of their election, no two members of the Committee shall have a 20 primary academic appointment in the same college or division of UNL. No member of the faculty who 21 holds any administrative appointment higher than department head or chair shall be eligible to serve as a 22 member of the Committee during the term of such administrative appointment. Committee members may 23 succeed themselves. The Chair and Vice-Chair of the ARRC shall be elected annually by the ARRC. 24 25 26 **3.1.1 Voting.** The ARRC may take action only on concurrence of at least three members of the ARRC. The Chair of the ARRC may vote. 27 28 29 **3.1.2 Closed Meetings.** Meetings of the ARRC are not open to the public. 30 31 3.1.3 Conflict of Interest for Members of the ARRC. Conflict of interest occurs when a member of the ARRC 32 33 **3.1.3.1** is in the same department or equivalent unit as a party; or 34 **3.1.3.2** answers directly to a party; or 35 **3.1.3.3** has a direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party; or 3.1.3.4 has, or reasonably appears to have, a personal interest in the case or its outcome; or 36 37 **3.1.3.5** has provided counsel or assistance to a party relating to the case; or 3.1.3.6 has participated in the efforts of an organization to provide counsel or assistance 38 to a party relating to the case; or 39 **3.1.3.7** has any other relationship with a party that might prevent impartiality. 40

² Rules governing eligibility and representation are set forth in the Syllabus of Campus-Wide Committees of the Academic Senate.

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When a member of the ARRC has a conflict of interest, the member shall voluntarily withdraw from participation in matters related to that case. When a member of the ARRC is alleged to have a conflict of interest and does not voluntarily withdraw, the other members of the ARRC shall review the allegation and, if a conflict of interest is found by a majority of the other members of the ARRC, shall bar that person from further participation in matters related to that case. If more than one member of the ARRC withdraws or is barred, the President of the Academic Senate shall appoint experienced temporary replacements for matters related to that case.

- **3.2 Membership of the ARRC Panel.** Each year the Academic Assembly shall elect 12 faculty members to three-year terms on the ARRC Panel. Of the 36 panel members, 32 must be tenured faculty and 4 must be faculty extension educators with equivalent rank of associate or full professor. Panel members may succeed themselves.
- 3.3 Membership of Special Committees and of the Special Resource Group.
 - 3.3.1 Early in the fall semester of each academic year the ARRC shall designate six members of the ARRC Panel for each of five Special Committees and for a Special Resource Group. At least one member of the Special Resource Group shall be an Extension Educator. To the extent possible, assignment to Special Committees and to the Special Resource Group shall be based on a fair distribution of ARRC Panel members by college, discipline, ethnicity, sex, and experience with cases involving academic freedom and tenure, grievance, or professional conduct. As soon as possible thereafter, the Chair of the ARRC shall determine which members of the ARRC Panel have terms that will expire at the end of the current year. The Chair of the ARRC shall then assess the distributional needs for constructing Special Committees and the Special Resource Group for the succeeding year as set forth in this Section 3.3.1, provide that information to the Chair of the Committee on Committees, and work with the Committee on Committees on behalf of the ARRC to ensure that the election for the succeeding year will return an ARRC Panel sufficiently diverse that Special Committees and the Special Resource Group will be broadly representative of the faculty.
 - **3.3.2** Each Special Committee shall be assigned a number from 1 to 5. Cases shall be assigned to the Special Committees in numerical order. Only when the ARRC decides to convene a Special Committee as provided in Section 5 shall its membership be announced and its Chair and Vice-Chair elected.
 - **3.3.3** If a Special Committee to be convened as a Special AFT-A Committee or a Special AFT-B Committee includes an extension educator, that extension educator shall be ineligible to serve and shall be replaced on the Special Committee as provided in Section 3.3.5.
 - **3.3.4** If a Special Committee to be convened as a Special Grievance Committee, as a Special Professional Conduct-A Committee, or as a Special Professional Conduct-B Committee to consider a case to which an extension educator is a party does not include an extension educator, the Chair of the ARRC shall by lot identify one member of the Special Committee to be replaced by an extension educator as provided in Section 3.3.5.

- **3.3.5** If any member of a Special Committee is ineligible or unable to serve, the Chair of the ARRC prior to the commencement of the Special Committee Hearing may appoint an eligible temporary substitute from the ARRC Panel. If no member of the ARRC Panel is available, the ARRC with the approval of the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate may appoint an eligible temporary substitute from faculty members with experience as an elected member of ARRC or as a member of a Special Committee.
- 3.3.6 If a Special Committee to be convened as a Special PC-A Committee is to hear a discrimination complaint filed by other than a member of the Academic/Administrative or Other Academic Staff, the Special PC-A Committee shall be augmented by the addition of three members of the committee to which the complaint would have been referred had the complainant been formally charged under the UNL "Policy and Procedures on Unlawful Discrimination, Including Sexual and Other Prohibited Harassment." If the additional members are to be students or staff members, the Chair of the ARRC shall consult with the chair of the committee from which the augmenting members are to be drawn before making the selections. Students or staff added to a Special PC-A Committee may participate fully in discussions, hearings, and deliberations of the Special PC-A Committee, but may not vote. If the opinion of the students or staff added to the Special PC-A Committee differs from that of the regular members of the Special PC-A Committee, their opinion and the rationale for that opinion shall be included in the report of the Special PC-A Committee.
- **3.4** Functions of the Special Resource Group. Members of the Special Resource Group may be appointed by the ARRC to perform the following functions:
 - **3.4.1** to serve as Special Conciliators;
 - **3.4.2** to serve as a resource when persons seeking relief under these procedures need advice or help in focusing issues or drafting formal complaints;
 - **3.4.3** to consult with the administration concerning possible summary suspensions under Section 7:
 - **3.4.4** to serve as a temporary replacement for a member of a Special Committee as provided in Section 3.3.5.
- **3.5** Communications. The Chair of the ARRC receives communications for the ARRC and speaks for it. All communications with the ARRC shall be addressed or redirected to the Chair of the ARRC. Other members of the ARRC should discourage contacts outside the regular process, and should direct those who make them to the Chair of the ARRC.
- 3.6 Dissemination of Personnel Information. Service on the ARRC makes members privy to sensitive information and allegations involving the personal and professional lives of members of the University community. UNL Bylaw 2.9 describes limitations on the collection and dissemination of personnel information. In addition, Federal Regulations Governing Misconduct in Science require great care to protect the interests of informants and the accused. Some information received by members of the ARRC may be protected by this Bylaw and these regulations. Violators of these requirements could be subject to sanctions for professional misconduct.

- General Responsibilities of the Chair of the ARRC. The responsibilities of the Chair of the 3.7 1 2 ARRC include:
- 3 **3.7.1** convening and presiding over meetings of the ARRC;
- 3.7.2 serving as contact person and spokesperson for the ARRC; 4
- 3.7.3 employing informal methods of dispute resolution under Section 4.1; 5
- 3.7.4 reporting results of ARRC and Special Committee elections, and reporting ARRC 6 7 and Special Committee vacancies requiring replacements under Section 3.1.3 or Section 8
 - 3.3.5, to the President of the Academic Senate;
- 9 3.7.5 maintaining committee files and protecting confidential material;
- 10 3.7.6 reporting to the Committee on Committees which members of the ARRC Panel will
- be leaving the Panel, and working with the Committee on Committees on behalf of the 11
- 12 ARRC to identify prospective nominees for the ARRC Panel who would satisfy the membership criteria set out in Section 3.3.1; 13
- 3.7.7 ensuring that Special Committees are properly instructed about hearing procedures 14 15 at the beginning of a case;
- 16 3.7.8 appointing substitutes to serve on Special Committees when vacancies occur, as provided in Section 3.3.5; 17
- 3.7.9 advising persons alleging misconduct in science to make the allegation to the Vice 18 19 Chancellor for Research;
- 20 3.7.10 ensuring that the ARRC conducts the follow up activities specified in Section 8:
- 3.7.11 ensuring that the Academic Senate Office and the Academic Senate website have available 21 22 complete and current copies of the ARRC Procedures and the Codes of Procedures for the various Special Committees; and 23
 - 3.7.12 keeping accurate records of expenditures for activities of the ARRC and arranging for reimbursements from the Chancellor's office.
- 27 3.8 Observer. The ARRC may appoint an Observer to observe the process of a Special Committee 28 and to report concerns to the Chair of the ARRC. The role of Observer is open to anyone who:
 - 3.8.1 is a member of the UNL Professional Staff (Regents Bylaw 3.1.1) eligible for election to the UNL Academic Senate (UNL Bylaw 3.3.1);
 - 3.8.2 does not serve in the same department or equivalent unit with any party, witness, or Special Committee member:

- **3.8.4** does not answer directly to a party or a witness; 35
 - 3.8.5 has no direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or a witness;
- 3.8.6 does not have, and does not reasonably appear to have, a personal interest in the case or in 37 its outcome; 38
- 39 3.8.7 has not provided counsel or assistance to either party relating to the complaint; and
- 40 3.8.8 has no other relationship with a party, organization, or a witness that might interfere with the investigative process or prevent the person from impartially carrying out the duties of Observer. 41
- Members of ARRC, Special Committees, the Special Resource Group and Other Participants 43 3.9 44 Protected by Regents Bylaw Section 6.8. Participation in the work of the ARRC, Special Committees.

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and the Special Resource Group shall be deemed part of the duties of faculty members and thus subject to the protections afforded by Section 6.8 of the Regents Bylaws.

3.10 ARRC Attorney.

3.10.1 Because of potential conflicts of interest, the ARRC shall not seek or accept advice from anyone to whom a party is answerable or who may be in a position of giving advice or legal counsel to a party or to any person or body that may later act on a Report of a Special Committee.

3.10.2 The ARRC may select and hire an independent attorney, subject to the approval of the General Counsel of the University and the President of the Academic Senate. Bills for the attorney's services shall be processed through the office of the General Counsel of the University.

4 PROCEDURES FOR INITIATING ACTIONS BY THE ARRC

Initial contacts with the Chair of the ARRC usually are informal and confidential. However, the Chair of the ARRC may be obligated to report certain information, including but not limited to known or alleged incidents of illegal discrimination and known or alleged violations of Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations.

The ARRC itself shall not investigate the substance of complaints or conduct hearings. No formal action to initiate Special Committee proceedings shall be taken by the ARRC unless a Formal Written Complaint is filed by the person seeking relief and is approved by the ARRC under Section 4.6.

When initially approached by a person seeking relief under these procedures, the Chair of the ARRC first shall determine whether the allegations potentially are governed by Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations,³ and if so, shall refer the person seeking relief to the Vice Chancellor for Research.

4.1 Informal Efforts to Resolve Disputes.

4.1.1 If the allegations are not governed by Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations, the Chair of the ARRC shall explain available options, including the following:

4.1.1.1 With the permission of the person seeking relief and after notice to the person(s) with whom conciliation is sought, the Chair of the ARRC may attempt an informal conciliation:

³ Initial allegations of misconduct potentially governed by Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations should be made to the Vice Chancellor for Research. If someone instead approaches the Chair of the ARRC with allegations potentially governed by Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations, the Chair of the ARRC shall consult with the Vice Chancellor for Research to determine whether Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations apply. If they do apply, the Chair of the ARRC shall refer the person making the allegations to the Vice Chancellor for Research. The Vice Chancellor for Research is then obligated to conduct an inquiry in accordance with applicable federal and University Regulations. Information concerning current regulations may be obtained from the office of the Vice Chancellor for Research.

4.1.1.2 With the permission of the person seeking relief and after notice to the 1 2 person(s) with whom conciliation is sought, the ARRC may appoint a member of 3 the Special Resource Group to attempt an informal conciliation; 4 **4.1.1.3** With the permission of the person seeking relief and the person against 5 whom relief is sought, the ARRC may request that the Chancellor appoint a 6 professional mediator (if the Chancellor approves the appointment of a paid 7 mediator, the Chancellor shall designate funds for this service); 8 **4.1.1.4** Where applicable, the person seeking relief may pursue the informal and formal 9 procedures set forth in "UNL Policy and Procedures on Unlawful Discrimination, Including 10 Sexual and Other Prohibited Harassment"; **4.1.1.5** Where applicable, the person seeking relief may seek relief in another forum; 11 12 **4.1.1.6** The person seeking relief may submit a Formal Written Complaint to the ARRC as provided in Section 4.2.  - **4.3.4** If the Formal Written Complaint includes a charge of professional misconduct against a member of the professional staff or a charge that a member of the professional staff has been wrongly accused of professional misconduct, but does not fall within Section 4.3.1, 4.3.2, or 4.3.3, the Formal Written Complaint shall be assigned to a Special PC-A Committee and the Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees shall be applicable.

4.4 Discretion to Assign Two or More Complaints to a Single Special Committee. If two or more Formal Written Complaints before the ARRC at the same time involve common core issues that might efficiently and fairly be resolved in a single proceeding, the ARRC may, with the consent of all parties, assign those Formal Written Complaints to a single Special Committee for resolution of the issues that are common to both and of those that are not.

4.5 Deadlines for ARRC Action on Formal Written Complaints.

- **4.5.1** If the Formal Written Complaint was filed by the President or by the Board of Regents under Regents Bylaw 4.14.2 seeking to terminate the appointment of a faculty member, the ARRC immediately shall convene a Special AFT-B Committee as provided in Section 5.
- **4.5.2** If the Formal Written Complaint was filed by the Vice Chancellor for Research alleging violation of Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations, the ARRC immediately shall convene a Special PC-B Committee as provided in Section 5.
- **4.5.3** If the Formal Written Complaint includes allegations of unlawful or unprofessional discrimination, the ARRC immediately shall
 - **4.5.3.1** provide a copy of the Formal Written Complaint to the EAD for preliminary investigation of the allegations of discrimination; and
 - **4.5.3.2** without waiting for the results of the EAD preliminary investigation, decide whether to convene a Special Committee as provided in Section 4.5.4. In deciding whether to convene a Special Committee, the ARRC shall not consider the results of any EAD preliminary investigation; if the ARRC decides to convene a Special Committee, the results of any EAD investigation may be considered by the Special Committee.⁴
- **4.5.4** Within 30 days after receipt of a Formal Written Complaint that does not fall within Sections 4.5.1 or 4.5.2, the ARRC shall either

Within 15 working days of the receipt of the complaint from either the complainant or the hearing committee, the EAD shall determine through a preliminary investigation whether it finds a basis for a complaint under this policy. 4.10 Finality of ARRC Decisions Not to Convene A Special Committee. If no complainant files an amended Formal Written Complaint or requests reconsideration, or if the ARRC decides not to convene a Special Committee after considering an amended Formal Written Complaint or a request for reconsideration, the decision not to convene a Special Committee shall be final.

5 CONVENING SPECIAL COMMITTEES

- **5.1 Convening a Special Committee.** When the ARRC decides to convene a Special Committee, the Chair of the ARRC shall:
 - **5.1.1** ascertain whether the predesignated members of the Special Committee satisfy the membership requirements for a Special Committee of that type, and if not, appoint substitutes as provided in Section 3.3.5;
 - **5.1.2** ascertain from the predesignated members of the Special Committee whether they are available to serve and whether their participation would present a conflict of interest, and, if any predesignated member of the Special Committee cannot serve, appoint a substitute as provided in Section 3.3.5;
 - **5.1.3** convene the Special Committee, provide the applicable Code of Procedures to the members of the Special Committee and to the ARRC Observer, if any, discuss the applicable Code of Procedures with the Special Committee, preside over the election of the Chair of the Special Committee, and, without further commentary or discussion, present the complaint to the Special Committee;
 - **5.1.4** forward names as follows:
 - **5.1.4.1** If the Special Committee is an AFT-B Committee, forward the name of the Chair of the AFT-B Special Committee to the President of the University of Nebraska, to the Chancellor, and to the Senate President;
 - **5.1.4.2** If the Special Committee is a PC-B Committee, forward the name of the Chair of the PC-B Special Committee to the Chancellor, to the Vice Chancellor for Research, and to the Senate President; and
 - **5.1.4.3** In all other instances, forward the names of the parties and their departments and the name of the Chair of the Special Committee to the Senate President and to the Chancellor or, if the Chancellor is a party, to the President of the University of Nebraska.

5.2 Agreement Reached Informally. If, after a matter is brought to the ARRC, it is resolved by mutual agreement among the parties, the complainant shall file a written notice that a resolution has been reached with the Chair of ARRC, and if a Special Committee has been convened, with the Chair of the Special Committee. Any party to a written agreement signed by each of the parties may file a copy of the written agreement with the Chair of the ARRC. The Chair of the ARRC shall deliver the written agreement to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate for inclusion in the ARRC archives in the Academic Senate Office under specified conditions of access.

6 ADHERENCE TO PROCEDURES

- 6.1 If a party has good reason to believe that a Special Committee is out of compliance with applicable procedures, the matter should be brought to the attention of the Chair of the Special Committee. Procedural questions that the Chair of the Special Committee cannot resolve promptly and that are so important that failure to resolve them would undermine the credibility of the Special Committee may be referred by the Chair of the Special Committee or by a party to the ARRC for resolution. The ARRC shall resolve the issues after obtaining the views of the parties and of the Special Committee. The Chair of the ARRC shall inform the parties and the Special Committee of the ARRC decision and direct them to follow the decision.
- 6.2 If a party has good reason to believe that the ARRC is out of compliance with these procedures, the matter should be brought to the attention of the Chair of the ARRC. If the Chair cannot resolve the question quickly and informally after consultation with all parties, it should be presented to the President of the Academic Senate as the guarantor of the procedures.

ROLE OF ARRC IN SUMMARY SUSPENSIONS IN ANTICIPATION OF DISMISSAL 7

Suspension in anticipation of dismissal is appropriate only pending an AFT hearing. When a question arises concerning dismissal, faculty members shall not be suspended from duties assigned by their University appointment during the time needed to resolve the question, unless there is the clear threat of physical harm or serious disruption of University programs by the person to be suspended. Before suspending the faculty member the Chancellor (or the Vice Chancellor designated by the Chancellor) shall contact the Chair of the ARRC to arrange a meeting with three members of the Special Resource Group selected by the Chair of the ARRC. This meeting shall occur prior to suspension, if possible, but in any case within 48 hours of the suspension. The purpose of this procedure is three-fold: first, to ensure that less stringent action has been considered; second, to protect against claims of arbitrary or capricious action; and third, to ensure that the faculty member is informed of the right to due process. If possible, the Chancellor (or the designated Vice Chancellor) shall reassign the faculty member to other appropriate duties should suspension occur. Pursuant to Regents Bylaw 4.14.2(I), the suspended faculty member's salary will continue during any period of suspension and an assignment to other duties shall not diminish the faculty member's salary.

8 FOLLOW UP BY THE ARRC

- Chancellor's (or President's) Response to Special Committee Recommendations. In response to recommendations made by a Special Committee, the Chancellor (or, if the Chancellor is a party, the President) shall within 30 days provide a written response to the Chair of the ARRC indicating:
 - **8.1.1** the recommendations that have been accepted and the action taken;
 - **8.1.2** the recommendations that have been rejected in part or completely; and
 - 8.1.3 for each recommendation rejected, reasons responsive to the Committee's rationale for proposing it.
- Copies shall be sent to the parties and to the Academic Senate President. If the response rejects or changes 41 42 the recommendations made by the Special Committee, the ARRC shall inform the President of the Academic Senate who shall provide each member of the Senate Executive Committee with a copy of the 43 Final Report and of the response and shall put the matter on the agenda of the next Senate Executive
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 - Committee meeting for whatever action the Senate Executive Committee may deem appropriate.

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8.3 ARRC Meeting with the Special Committee. After the Final Report has been filed, the ARRC shall meet with the Special Committee and any others considered appropriate by the Chair of the ARRC to thank the Special Committee for its work, to collect all copies of documents, and to hear from the Special Committee any suggestions about how the work of the ARRC and its Special Committees might be improved.

Code of Procedures for Special AFT-A Committees

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1 CODE OF PROCEDURES FOR 2 SPECIAL ACADEMIC FREEDOM & TENURE - A (AFT-A) COMMITTEES 3 University of Nebraska-Lincoln 4 5 6 1 INTRODUCTION 7 8 1.1 Academic Rights and Responsibilities. All professional staff (including administrators 9 and faculty members) of the University of Nebraska are entitled to enjoy and to exercise, without penalty, all the rights of an American citizen and the rights of academic freedom as specified in 10 Regents Bylaw 4.2. It is essential to the University that all administrators and professional staff 11 exercise these rights and respect their exercise by others, and uphold the attendant 12 13 responsibilities outlined in Regents Bylaw 4.1. 14 15 Duty of University Officials to Investigate and to Take Action on Known or Alleged **Discrimination.** University Officials have a duty promptly to investigate and to take appropriate 16 17 action on all known or alleged incidents of illegal discrimination. University officials in this context shall be defined as any individual employed by UNL with job authority or responsibility 18 19 20 1.2.1 supervise, hire, assign or reassign responsibilities: 21 1.2.2 recommend or grant promotion or demotion; and/or 22 1.2.3 recommend or take any disciplinary or corrective actions. 23 24 1.3 Authority and Jurisdiction of Special AFT-A Committees. 25 26 1.3.1 Regents Bylaw 4.14 authorizes a Faculty Academic Freedom and Tenure Committee to consider complaints by any faculty member alleging any procedural or 27 substantive grievance that constitutes an allegation that action taken, or threatened, 28 violates the complainant's academic freedom or academic tenure. The UNL Academic 29 30 Senate, with the approval of the University of Nebraska Board of Regents, has vested that authority in Special AFT-A Committees established under the aegis of the Academic 31 32 Rights and Responsibilities Committee (ARRC). A description of the committees can be found in the Syllabus of Committees of the Academic Senate, available from the 33 Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. 34 35 36 1.3.2 The Code entitled "Responsibilities of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities" Committee and Procedures for Handling Matters of Academic Freedom and Tenure, 37 Grievance and Professional Conduct" ("ARRC Procedures") indicates how complaints 38 39 are to be received by the ARRC, assessed for sufficiency and jurisdiction, and 40 transmitted to a Special Committee. 41 42 1.3.3 This "Code of Procedures for Special AFT-A Committees" indicates how a 43 complaint is to be handled after the ARRC has transmitted it to a Special AFT-A

Committee.

1.3.4 The ARRC Procedures and the Code of Procedures for Special AFT-A Committees in their current form are available from the Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. Any faculty member contemplating filing a complaint with the ARRC should first consult both documents. For information and advice concerning these procedures, contact the Chair of the ARRC.

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2 **DEFINITIONS**

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As used in this Code of Procedures for Special AFT-A Committees, unless the context otherwise requires:

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12 2.1 Chancellor shall mean the Chancellor of UNL.

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14 **2.2 Days** shall mean days on which University offices are open for business.

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16 2.3 Faculty Member shall mean any staff member of UNL holding the academic rank of lecturer or above or equivalent rank (Regents Bylaws 3.1.1.1 and 4.4). 17

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2.4 In Writing and Written, when used to describe a communication, shall mean that the communication so described shall be either a paper document signed by the sender or an electronic communication that can be readily accessed by the sender and by the recipient.

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2.5 **Parties** shall mean the complainant(s) and the respondent(s).

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2.6 **President** shall mean the President of the University of Nebraska and shall include the authorized representative of the President. The President shall not extend such authorization to the Chancellor or staff members of any campus of the University.

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Section, unless otherwise noted, refers to a section of this Code of Procedures for Special 29 2.7 AFT-A Committees. 30

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3 GENERAL RULES GOVERNING SPECIAL AFT-A COMMITTEES

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- Quorum. Each Special AFT-A Committee has six tenured members. If a member of the
- 35 Special AFT-A Committee withdraws or is barred prior to commencement of the Hearing, the
- Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall notify the Chair of the ARRC, and the Chair of the 36 ARRC shall make every reasonable effort to appoint a suitable replacement as provided in 37
- Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures. In an emergency, and with the consent of the parties, a 38
- hearing may be conducted with one member absent, but a member absent from the hearing may 39
- 40 not participate in subsequent deliberations. In no case may the Special AFT-A Committee
- 41 proceed with the Hearing with fewer than five members present.

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43 3.2 Voting. The Special AFT-A Committee may take action only on concurrence of four members. The Chair may vote. 44

- **3.3** Expiration of Term. A member of the Special AFT-A Committee whose term on the ARRC Panel expires during a case shall continue to serve until the case is concluded.

- **3.4 Conflict of Interest.** Conflict of Interest occurs when a member of the Special AFT-A Committee
 - **3.4.1** is in the same department or equivalent unit as a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.2 answers directly to a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.3 has a direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.4 has, or reasonably appears to have, a personal interest in the case or its outcome; or
 - 3.4.5 has provided counsel or assistance to a party relating to the grievance; or
 - **3.4.6** has participated in the efforts of an organization to provide counsel or assistance to a party relating to the case; or
 - 3.4.7 has any other relationship with a party that might prevent impartiality.

 When a member of the Special AFT-A Committee discovers that the member has a conflict of interest, the member shall voluntarily withdraw from participation. When a member of the Special AFT-A Committee is alleged to have a conflict of interest and the member does not voluntarily withdraw, the ARRC shall review the allegation and, if a conflict of interest is found, shall bar that person from further participation.

3.5 Communications.

3.5.1 The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee receives communications for the Committee and speaks for it. Both complainant and respondent shall address communications concerning the case only to the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee. Special AFT-A Committee members should discourage contacts outside the regular process, and should direct those who make them to the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee.

3.5.2 The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall keep all parties informed of any substantive communications and contacts, including those that arise outside the normal process.

3.5.3 If the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee has difficulty communicating with a party or other necessary participant, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee may consult with the Chair of the ARRC about ways to resolve the communication problem.

3.6 Dissemination of Personnel Information. Participation in Special AFT-A Committee proceedings makes participants privy to sensitive information and allegations involving the personal and professional lives of members of the University community. UNL Bylaw 2.9 describes limitations on the collection and dissemination of personnel information. Some information obtained as part of a AFT-A proceeding may be protected against broader dissemination by this Bylaw. Violators of this Bylaw could be subject to sanctions for professional misconduct.

- **3.70 pen Hearings.** AFT-A Hearings, but not Pre-Hearing Conferences or other AFT-A proceedings, ordinarily are open to the public. However, the Special AFT-A Committee may order a Hearing closed if
 - **3.7.1** prior to the Pre-Hearing Conference, a party in writing requests that the Hearing be closed;
 - **3.7.2** all parties consent; and
 - **3.7.3** the Special AFT-A Committee determines that there is good cause why the Hearing should be closed.
 - If the Hearing is closed, only those persons identified in Section 6.1 may be present.

- **3.8** Academic Advisors. Each party may choose an Academic Advisor who may accompany and advise the party at the Pre-Hearing Conference and the Hearing. The role of Academic Advisor is open to any person who:
 - **3.8.1** is a member of the UNL Academic Assembly (UNL Bylaw 3.3.1) or has emeritus faculty status at UNL;
 - **3.8.2** is not in the same department or equivalent unit as a witness (other than the party being advised) before or a member of the Special AFT-A Committee;
 - **3.8.3** has no other relationship with a member of the Special AFT-A Committee that might create, or reasonably might seem to create, a conflict of interest for that Special AFT-A Committee member;
 - 3.8.4 has no direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; and
 - **3.8.5** has no other relationship with a party, an organization, or a witness that might interfere with the investigative process.

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- 3.9.1 Because of potential conflicts of interest, the Special AFT-A Committee shall not seek or accept advice from anyone to whom a party is answerable or who may be in a position of giving advice or legal counsel to a party or to any person or body that may later act on the Report of the Special AFT-A Committee.

Counsel and Advice for the Special AFT-A Committee.

32 3.9.2 The Special AFT-A Committee may receive advice from the ARRC attorney selected pursuant to section 3.10.2 of the ARRC Procedures.

3.9.3 Nothing in this Section 3.9 shall prevent full participation by a member of the Special AFT-A Committee who is also an attorney.

3.10 Termination of Pending AFT-A Proceedings.

 3.10.1 If at any time all complainants in writing ask the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee that the Formal Written Complaint be withdrawn, or all parties in writing notify the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee that they have reached a settlement of the case, the Special AFT-A Committee shall terminate the proceedings and shall not deliver the Final Report described in Section 8. However, in such circumstances the

Special AFT-A Committee may, on its own initiative, make written recommendations authorized by Sections 8.2.2 and 8.2.3

3.10.1.1 concerning ways to prevent recurrence of acts, decisions, or circumstances which may have contributed to the filing of the grievance; and

3.10.1.2 concerning ways to correct any deficiencies or anomalies found in the substance or application of bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, procedures, or customs which may have contributed to the filing of the grievance.

Termination of the proceedings under this section shall not preclude the Special AFT-A Committee, or members of the Special AFT-A Committee, from making the "Communications Regarding Matters Outside the Scope of the Formal Written Complaint" authorized by Section 10.

3.10.2 Resignation from the University by any party shall not necessarily prevent the Special AFT-A Committee from completing its deliberations and delivering the Final Report described in Section 8.

3.11 Timely Complet ion. Unless the ARRC, for good cause shown, authorizes a longer period of time, the Special AFT-A Committee shall complete its investigation and deliver its report within 150 days of receiving the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the ARRC.

3.12 Adherence to Procedures.

3.12.1 If a party has good reason to believe that the Special AFT-A Committee is out of compliance with these procedures, the matter should be brought to the attention of the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee. Procedural questions that the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee cannot resolve promptly and that are so important that failure to resolve them would undermine the credibility of the Special AFT-A Committee may be referred by the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee or by a party to the ARRC for resolution. The ARRC shall resolve the issues after obtaining the views of the parties and of the Special AFT-A Committee. The Chair of the ARRC shall inform the parties and the Special AFT-A Committee of the ARRC decision and direct them to follow the decision.

3.12.2 If a party has good reason to believe that the ARRC is out of compliance with these procedures or the ARRC Procedures, the party may invoke Section 6.2 of the ARRC Procedures.

4 GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CHAIR OF THE SPECIAL AFT-A COMMITTEE, NOTICE, RESPONSE, ALLEGATIONS OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST, AND CHALLENGES TO THE ELIGIBILITY OF PROPOSED ACADEMIC ADVISORS

4.1 General Responsibilities of the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee. The responsibilities of the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee include:

4.1.1 convening and presiding over meetings of the Special AFT-A Committee;

- 2 4.1.2 receiving communications for the Special AFT-A Committee and speaking for it;
- 3 4.1.3 ensuring that all substantive communications are made available to all parties;
 - **4.1.4** maintaining a complete case file, including a record of all substantive communications, documents, verbatim transcripts of hearings, committee actions, and committee reports;
 - **4.1.5** providing a copy of the Formal Written Complaint, the Formal Written Response, the current ARRC Procedures, and the current Code of Procedures for Special AFT-A Committees to each member of the Special AFT-A Committee, and to the ARRC Observer, if any;
 - **4.1.6** arranging for accommodations for the Pre-Hearing Conference and for the Hearing, taking into account such factors as the time needed, the space needs of the Special Committee and parties and witnesses, the need for a separate accommodation for witnesses while waiting to testify, and access to other facilities that may be needed;
 - **4.1.7** moving the proceedings toward a conclusion as expeditiously as reasonably possible while respecting the rights and needs of all participants;
 - **4.1.8** notifying the Chair of the ARRC of any withdrawal from the Special AFT-A Committee to permit timely appointment of a substitute as provided in Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures;
 - **4.1.9** reminding participants of limitations on the dissemination of personnel information set forth in Section 3.6;
 - **4.1.10** arranging for timely consultation with the Chair of ARRC should procedural disputes arise;
 - **4.1.11** keeping accurate records of expenditures for activities of the Special Committee and arranging for reimbursements from the Chancellor's office; and
 - 4.1.12 arranging for the court reporter and verbatim transcript required by Section 6.5.
 - **4.2 Written Notice to the Parties.** Within 7 days after the Special AFT-A Committee has been convened, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall send to each party the following:
 - **4.2.1** a copy of the Formal Written Complaint;
 - **4.2.2** a copy of the current Procedures of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities Committee;
 - **4.2.3** a copy of the current Code of Procedures for AFT-A Committees;
 - **4.2.4** a list of the members of the Special AFT-A Committee;
 - **4.2.5** the name of the ARRC Observer or, if no ARRC Observer has been appointed, notice to the parties that they are entitled to request that an ARRC Observer be appointed; and
 - **4.2.6** notice of the deadlines established in Section 4.3 and 4.4.
 - 4.3 Formal Written Responses from Respondents: Mandatory Elements and Deadline for Filing. Within 20 calendar days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee, each respondent shall file a Formal Written Response with the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee. In addition, if a Formal Written Complaint was filed by an attorney for a complainant, each respondent shall within 20 calendar

days from date of receipt of the complaint mail a copy of the Formal Written Response to said attorney by regular United States mail with sufficient postage attached, properly addressed to said attorney.

4.3.1 Mandatory Elements. Each Formal Written Response shall contain a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the facts alleged in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest and a clear and concise statement indicating any ameliorating or other additional facts the respondent wishes to allege. Under Sections 4.5 and 7.2, if a respondent fails to file a timely Formal Written Response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.

4.3.2 Optional Elements. In addition, the Formal Written Response may include the following:

following:

4.3.2.1 a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the standards

- identified in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest; 4.3.2.2 a clear and concise statement of the standards, if any, the respondent
- believes to be appropriate for evaluating the complaint;

 4.3.2.3 a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the violations
- 4.3.2.3 a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the violations alleged in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest;
- **4.3.2.4** a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the proposed remedies, sanctions, or other personal relief or prospective institutional change the respondent believes would be inappropriate.

The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.

4.4 Deadline for Requests from Any Party Requesting an Academic Advisor, an ARRC Observer, and for Allegations of Conflict of Interest. Within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee.

4.4.1 any party wishing to be advised by an academic advisor shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee identifying the proposed academic advisor:

- **4.4.2** any party wishing to request that the ARRC appoint an ARRC Observer shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee;
- **4.4.3** any party wishing to allege that a member of the Special AFT-A Committee has a conflict of interest shall file a written statement with the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee setting forth the basis for the challenge.

The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.

4.5 Procedure If No Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If no respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the uncontested allegations of fact in the Formal Written Complaint shall be deemed to be true, and the Chair of the Special Committee shall so notify the parties and shall schedule a meeting of the Special AFT-A Committee to prepare the Final Report required by Section 8.

- 4.6 Procedure If a Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If any respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall
 - **4.6.1** determine whether proposed academic advisors are eligible under Section 3.8, and if any party's proposed academic advisor is not eligible, invite that party to propose an eligible academic advisor;
 - **4.6.2** forward to each complainant and to each respondent a copy of each Formal Written Response and the names of proposed academic advisors; and
 - **4.6.3** forward to the Chair of the ARRC any request that an ARRC Observer be appointed.

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4.7 Party Challenges to Proposed Academic Advisors or ARRC Observer.

4.7.1 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed academic advisor by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed academic advisor. If a challenged proposed academic advisor does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall determine whether the proposed academic advisor is eligible. If the proposed academic advisor is not eligible, the party may propose another academic advisor. If the new proposed academic advisor appears to be eligible, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall notify parties of the new proposed academic advisor and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed academic advisor.

4.7.2 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed ARRC Observer by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed ARRC Observer. The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall forward the challenge to the Chair of the ARRC. If a challenged ARRC Observer does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the ARRC shall determine whether the proposed ARRC Observer is eligible. If the proposed ARRC Observer is not eligible, the ARRC may in writing propose another ARRC Observer to the Chair of the Special Committee. The Chair of the Special Committee shall in writing notify parties of the new proposed ARRC Observer and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed ARRC Observer.

5 PRE-HEARING CONFERENCE

- **5.1 Purpose.** As soon as possible after giving notice of a Formal Written Response contesting any allegations of the Formal Written Complaint and resolving any issues involving conflicts of interest and eligibility of proposed academic advisors and ARRC Observers, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall arrange a Pre-Hearing Conference with all parties in attendance
 - **5.1.1** to clarify the issues involved;
 - **5.1.2** to identify uncontroverted facts;
 - **5.1.3** to explore the possibility of a voluntary settlement of the case;
 - **5.1.4** to explain procedures applicable to the Hearing;

1 5.1.5 to explain deadlines for identifying witnesses to be called and documents to be 2 offered in accordance with Section 5.3; and 3 **5.1.6** to establish procedures for setting the date, time, and place of the Hearing. 4 5 Persons Who May Attend and Participate in the Pre-Hearing Conference: 5.2 6 **5.2.1** the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee; 7 5.2.2 the parties; 8 5.2.3 each party's attorney, if any; 9 **5.2.4** each party's academic advisor, if any; 5.2.5 the ARRC attorney, if requested by the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee; 10 11 and 12 **5.2.6** the ARRC Observer, if any. 13 14 5.3 Notice of Hearing and Deadlines for Identification of Witnesses and Documents. 27		6.3.1 Testimony shall be taken under oath. Each party shall have the right to cross-	
28		examine witnesses who testify and shall have the right to submit rebuttal testimony.

40		6.3.3 In the event any party to the proceedings desires the issuance of a subpoena, such

- **6.3.4** Witnesses not able to attend the hearing may present testimony taken by deposition in the manner provided for depositions in the Nebraska Courts.
- **6.3.5** The Special AFT-A Committee may admit and give probative effect to evidence which possesses probative value commonly accepted by reasonably prudent persons in the conduct of their affairs. It may exclude incompetent, irrelevant, immaterial, and unduly repetitious evidence; provided, that a complainant may file with the Committee at least 3 days before the hearing a written request that the rules of evidence followed by the District Courts in the State of Nebraska shall be applicable. If such a written request is filed, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall notify the parties that the proceedings shall comply with the principles of law with respect to proceedings in the District Courts in Nebraska, and all counsel and parties shall be bound by such rules and standards of ethics and codes of trial conduct as are applied in the District Courts.
- **6.3.6** The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee may in appropriate circumstances temporarily adjourn the Hearing.
- **6.4** Format of Presentations and Questions. To preserve orderly and civil proceedings, the Hearing shall be conducted by the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee as follows:
 - **6.4.1** No person shall speak without prior recognition by the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee.
 - **6.4.2** Each party and each witness may be questioned by members of the Special AFT-A Committee after the end of the presentation of that party or witness.
 - **6.4.3** When the Special AFT-A Committee has finished questioning a party or witness, each party may question that party or witness; alternatively, the parties may submit questions to the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee which the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee may ask on their behalf.
 - **6.4.4** The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee may bar questions under Section 6.3.5. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar a question may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special AFT-A Committee
 - **6.4.5** A party's academic advisor may consult privately with that party, may respond to questions from the Chair, and may address procedural questions to the Chair, but under ordinary circumstances may not otherwise participate in the Hearing.

6.5 Record of Hearing

1 2

The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall arrange for a court reporter to be present at the Hearing to produce a verbatim record of the Hearing. Bills for the court reporter's services shall be processed through the office of the General Counsel of the University. The verbatim record shall be made available to the parties and to the Special AFT-A Committee prior

to the deliberations and decision of the Special AFT-A Committee required by Section 7. The verbatim record also shall be made available for inspection by the public as set forth in Section 8.3.

7 DELIBERATIONS AND DECISION

7.1 All deliberations shall be conducted in executive session with no one present except members of the Special AFT-A Committee, and the ARRC attorney, if invited.

7.2 The complainant bears the burden of proving relevant facts by a preponderance of the relevant evidence. If a respondent fails to file a timely written response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.

7.3 Refusal by anyone to provide documents or to testify obstructs the process and shall be taken into consideration by the Special AFT-A Committee in its deliberations and preparation of the Final Report.

7.4 The standards against which the charges are to be judged include applicable state and federal law; University bylaws, rules and regulations; established policies of the relevant administrative unit; appropriate professional and discipline based standards; applicable contracts; and academic principles and tradition. In the event of conflict between different University bylaws, rules or regulations, those of the more inclusive administrative unit shall prevail.

8 THE FINAL REPORT

When the Special AFT-A Committee has completed its deliberations it shall prepare a Final Report setting forth the Special AFT-A Committee's disposition of each grievance alleged in the Formal Written Complaint. Communications regarding matters outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint shall be addressed in accordance with the rules set forth in Section 10 below. The Final Report shall be limited to the following mandatory and optional elements.

- **8.1 Mandatory Elements of the Final Report.** The Final Report shall contain, with respect to each grievance alleged in the Formal Written Complaint:
 - **8.1.1** specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based;
 - 8.1.2 identification of the standards against which the grievance is being judged; and
 - **8.1.3** the Special AFT-A Committee's conclusions concerning whether applicable standards have been violated.

Before preparing the elements of the Final Report required by Sections 8.1.2 and 8.1.3, the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall send to each party a copy of a provisional draft of the specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based required by Section 8.1.1. Each party shall have five days after receipt of the provisional draft to submit written comments to the Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee

suggesting specific changes to correct specific alleged inaccuracies in the provisional draft. No changes based upon such comments shall be made to the provisional draft without first providing 2 3 other parties an opportunity to respond to the comments. If the Special AFT-A Committee decides not to make changes suggested in a written comment, that written comment and the Special AFT-A Committee's reasons for that decision shall be appended to the Final Report. 5 6 7 8.2 Optional Elements of the Final Report. In addition, the Final Report may contain one 8 or more of the following: 9 **8.2.1 Recommendations.** The Final Report may include recommendations: 10 8.2.1.1 concerning ways to redress any complaint the Special AFT-A Committee has determined to be justified; 11 8.2.1.2 concerning ways to prevent recurrence of acts, decisions, or circumstances 12 which may have contributed to the filing of the complaint; 13 8.2.1.3 concerning correction of any deficiencies or anomalies found in the 14 substance or application of bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, procedures, or 15 customs which may have contributed to the filing of the complaint. 16 8.2.2 Concurring or Dissenting Opinions. The Final Report may include concurring or 17 dissenting opinions, or both, concerning any mandatory or optional element of the 18 19 report. 20 21 8.3 Delivery and Archiving of Verbatim Record, Case File, and Final Report. 22 23 **8.3.1** The Chair of the Special AFT-A Committee shall 8.3.1.1 deliver a copy of the Final Report, a copy of the verbatim record of the 24 25 Hearing, and a copy of all exhibits to the Board of Regents; **8.3.1.2** deliver a copy of the Final Report to each party, to the Chancellor, to the 26 27 President, to the Chair of the ARRC, and to the President of the Academic Senate: 28 and 29 **8.3.1.3** deliver a copy of the Final Report and of the case file required by Section 30 4.1.4 to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate. 31 32 **8.3.2** The Coordinator of the Academic Senate shall 33 **8.3.2.1** obtain from the Corporate Secretary of the Board of Regents a copy of any 34 committee report considered by the Board of Regents and a copy of the official 35 record of the Board of Regents action; 8.3.2.2 deposit any committee report considered by the Board of Regents, the 36 official record of the Board of Regents action, a second copy of the Final Report. and the case file in the Academic Senate Office under specified conditions of 38 39 access; and 40 8.3.2.3 deposit any committee report considered by the Board of Regents, the official record of the Board of Regents action, a second copy of the Final Report, 42 and the case file in the University Archives under specified conditions of access.

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9 FOLLOW UP TO THE REPORT

- **9.1** Chancellor's (or President's) Response to Recommendations. In response to recommendations made by the Special AFT-A Committee, the Chancellor (or, if the Chancellor is a party, the President) shall within 30 days provide a written response to the Chair of the ARRC indicating:
 - 9.1.1 the recommendations that have been accepted and the action taken;
 - 9.1.2 the recommendations that have been rejected in part or completely; and
 - **9.1.3** for each recommendation rejected, reasons responsive to the Committee's rationale for proposing it.
- Copies shall be sent to the parties, to the President of the Academic Senate, and to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate for inclusion in the case files in the ARRC archives and in the University Archives. If the response rejects or changes the recommendations made by the Special AFT-A Committee, the ARRC shall inform the President of the Academic Senate who shall provide each member of the Senate Executive Committee with a copy of the Final Report and of the response and shall put the matter on the agenda of the next Senate Executive Committee meeting for whatever action the Senate Executive Committee may deem appropriate.

9.2 ARRC Review of Implementation of Recommendations. The ARRC shall determine the extent to which recommendations of the Special AFT-A Committee have been implemented, and shall report its findings to the President of the Academic Senate and in its annual report to the Senate.

 9.3 ARRC Meeting with the Special AFT-A Committee. After the Final Report has been filed, the ARRC shall meet with the Special AFT-A Committee and any others considered appropriate by the Chair of the ARRC to thank the Special AFT-A Committee for its work, to collect all copies of documents, and to hear from the Special AFT-A Committee any suggestions about how the work of the ARRC and its special committees might be improved.

10 COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING MATTERS OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF THE FORMAL WRITTEN COMPLAINT

10.1 In the course of an investigation, one or more members of the Special AFT-A Committee may conclude that the Special AFT-A Committee has heard allegations or otherwise discovered information which, though outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint and thus not subject to full investigation and evaluation by the Special AFT-A Committee, nonetheless suggests that actions or decisions have been taken or may be taken in violation of law, University policy, or academic principle.

10.2 Such concerns shall not be addressed in the Final Report of the Special AFT-A Committee required by Section 8.0. However, the Special AFT-A Committee acting though its chair, or any member or members of the Special AFT-A Committee, may communicate those concerns in writing to the appropriate administrator for investigation and for whatever corrective action may be appropriate. In shaping the contents of and determining the recipients for such communications, those preparing the communications shall consult with the Chair of the ARRC.

All professional staff (including administrators and faculty members) of the University of Nebraska are entitled to enjoy and to exercise, without 9 10 penalty, all the rights of an American citizen and the rights of academic freedom as specified in Regents Bylaw 4.2. It is essential to the University that all administrators and professional staff 11 12 exercise these rights and respect their exercise by others, and uphold the attendant responsibilities outlined in Regents Bylaw 4.1. 13 14 15 1.2 Duty of University Officials to Investigate and to Take Action on Known or Alleged 16 **Discrimination.** University Officials have a duty promptly to investigate and to take appropriate action on all known or alleged incidents of illegal discrimination. University officials in this context 17 shall be defined as any individual employed by UNL with job authority or responsibility to 18 19 1.2.1 supervise, hire, assign or reassign responsibilities; 1.2.2 recommend or grant promotion or demotion; and/or 20 1.2.3 recommend or take any disciplinary or corrective actions. 21 22 23 1.3 Authority and Jurisdiction of Special AFT-B Committees. 24 25 1.3.1 Regents Bylaw 4.14 authorizes a Faculty Academic Freedom and Tenure Committee to consider complaints filed by the President or by the Board of Regents against any member 26 27 of the faculty seeking to terminate his or her Continuous Appointment, Appointment for a Specific Term prior to the termination date stated in the appointment, or Special 28 29 Appointment prior to its termination date. The UNL Academic Senate, with the approval 30 of the University of Nebraska Board of Regents, has vested that authority in Special AFT-B Committees established under the aegis of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities 31 32 Committee (ARRC). A description of the committees can be found in the Syllabus of Committees of the Academic Senate, available from the Academic Senate Office and on the 33 34 Academic Senate website. 35 36 1.3.2 The Code entitled "Responsibilities of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities 37 Committee and Procedures for Handling Matters of Academic Freedom and Tenure. Grievance and Professional Conduct" ("ARRC Procedures") indicates how complaints are 38 39 to be received by the ARRC, assessed for sufficiency and jurisdiction, and transmitted to a Special Committee. 40 41 42 This "Code of Procedures for Special AFT-B Committees" indicates how a complaint filed by the President or by the Board of Regents against any member of the 43 faculty seeking to terminate his or her Continuous Appointment, Appointment for a Specific 44 45 Term prior to the termination date stated in the appointment, or Special Appointment prior

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to its termination date, is to be handled after the ARRC has transmitted it to a Special AFT-B Committee.

1.3.4 The ARRC Procedures and the Code of Procedures for Special AFT-B Committees in their current form are available from the Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. For information and advice concerning these procedures, contact the Chair of the ARRC.

2 DEFINITIONS

As used in this Code of Procedures for Special AFT-B Committees, unless the context otherwise requires:

2.1 Chancellor shall mean the Chancellor of UNL.

2.2 Days shall mean days on which University offices are open for business.

2.3 Faculty Member shall mean any staff member of UNL holding the academic rank of lecturer or above or equivalent rank (Regents Bylaws 3.1.1.1 and 4.4).

2.4 In Writing and Written, when used to describe a communication, shall mean that the communication so described shall be either a paper document signed by the sender or an electronic communication that can be readily accessed by the sender and by the recipient.

2.5 Parties shall mean the complainant(s) and the respondent(s).

2.6 President shall mean the President of the University of Nebraska and shall include the authorized representative of the President. The President shall not extend such authorization to the Chancellor or staff members of any campus of the University.

2.7 Section, unless otherwise noted, refers to a section of this Code of Procedures for Special AFT-B Committees.

3 GENERAL RULES GOVERNING SPECIAL AFT-B COMMITTEES

3.1 Quorum. Each Special AFT-B Committee has six tenured members. If a member of the Special AFT-B Committee withdraws or is barred prior to commencement of the Hearing, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall notify the Chair of the ARRC, and the Chair of the ARRC shall make every reasonable effort to appoint a suitable replacement as provided in Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures. In an emergency, and with the consent of the parties, a hearing may be conducted with one member absent, but a member absent from the hearing may not participate in subsequent deliberations. In no case may the Special AFT-B Committee proceed with the Hearing with fewer than five members present.

3.2 Voting. The Special AFT-B Committee may take action only on concurrence of four members. The Chair may vote.

3.3 Expiration of Term. A member of the Special AFT-B Committee whose term on the ARRC Panel expires during a case shall continue to serve until the case is concluded.

- **3.4 Conflict of Interest.** Conflict of Interest occurs when a member of the Special AFT-B Committee
 - **3.4.1** is in the same department or equivalent unit as a party or witness; or
 - **3.4.2** answers directly to a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.3 has a direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.4 has, or reasonably appears to have, a personal interest in the case or its outcome; or
 - **3.4.5** has provided counsel or assistance to a party relating to allegations contained in the complaint; or
 - **3.4.6** has participated in the efforts of an organization to provide counsel or assistance to a party relating to the case; or
 - 3.4.7 has any other relationship with a party that might prevent impartiality.

When a member of the Special AFT-B Committee discovers that the member has a conflict of interest, the member shall voluntarily withdraw from participation. When a member of the Special AFT-B Committee is alleged to have a conflict of interest and the member does not voluntarily withdraw, the ARRC shall review the allegation and, if a conflict of interest is found, shall bar that person from further participation.

3.5 Communications.

3.5.1 The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee receives communications for the Committee and speaks for it. Both complainant and respondent shall address communications concerning the case only to the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee. Special AFT-B Committee members should discourage contacts outside the regular process, and should direct those who make them to the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee.

3.5.2 The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall keep all parties informed of any substantive communications and contacts, including those that arise outside the normal process.

3.5.3 If the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee has difficulty communicating with a party or other necessary participant, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee may consult with the Chair of the ARRC about ways to resolve the communication problem.

 3.6 Dissemination of Personnel Information. Participation in Special AFT-B Committee proceedings makes participants privy to sensitive information and allegations involving the personal and professional lives of members of the University community. UNL Bylaw 2.9 describes limitations on the collection and dissemination of personnel information. Some information

obtained as part of a AFT-B proceeding may be protected against broader dissemination by this Bylaw. Violators of this Bylaw could be subject to sanctions for professional misconduct. 2 3 Closed Hearings. AFT-B Hearings ordinarily are closed to the public. However, if the 4 3.7 5 respondent prior to the conclusion of the Pre-Hearing Conference requests that the AFT-B Hearing 6 be open to the public, the AFT-B Hearing shall be open to the public. If the Hearing is closed, only those persons identified in Section 6.1 may be present. 8 9 Academic Advisors. Each party may choose an Academic Advisor who may accompany 3.8 10 and advise the party at the Pre-Hearing Conference and the Hearing. The role of Academic Advisor is open to any person who: 11 12 3.8.1 is a member of the UNL Academic Assembly (UNL Bylaw 3.3.1) or has emeritus 13 faculty status at UNL; 14 3.8.2 is not in the same department or equivalent unit as a witness (other than the party being advised) before or a member of the Special AFT-B Committee; 15 3.8.3 has no other relationship with a member of the Special AFT-B Committee that might 16 create, or reasonably might seem to create, a conflict of interest for that Special AFT-B 17 Committee member: 18 3.8.4 has no direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; and 19 3.8.5 has no other relationship with a party, an organization, or a witness that might interfere 20 21 with the investigative process. 22 23 3.9 Counsel and Advice for the Special AFT-B Committee. 24 25 3.9.1 Because of potential conflicts of interest, the Special AFT-B Committee shall not seek or accept advice from anyone to whom a party is answerable or who may be in a 26 27 position of giving advice or legal counsel to a party or to any person or body that may later act on the Report of the Special AFT-B Committee. 28 29 30 3.9.2 The Special AFT-B Committee may receive advice from the ARRC attorney 31 selected pursuant to section 3.10.2 of the ARRC Procedures. 32 33 3.9.3 Nothing in this Section 3.9 shall prevent full participation by a member of the Special AFT-B Committee who is also an attorney. 34 35 36 3.10 **Termination of Pending AFT-B Proceedings.** 37 38 **3.10.1** If at any time all complainants in writing ask the Chair of the Special AFT-B

Committee that the Formal Written Complaint be withdrawn, or all parties in writing notify

the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee that they have reached a settlement of the case, the Special AFT-B Committee shall terminate the proceedings and shall not deliver the Final

Report described in Section 8. However, in such circumstances the Special AFT-B

Committee may, on its own initiative, make written recommendations authorized by

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Sections 8.2.2 and 8.2.3

Procedural questions that the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee cannot resolve promptly and that are so important that failure to resolve them 25 would undermine the credibility of the Special AFT-B Committee may be referred by the 26 27 Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee or by a party to the ARRC for resolution.  - **4.1.5** providing a copy of the Formal Written Complaint, the Formal Written Response, the current ARRC Procedures, and the current Code of Procedures for Special AFT-B Committees to each member of the Special AFT-B Committee, and to the ARRC Observer, if any;
 - **4.1.6** arranging for accommodations for the Pre-Hearing Conference and for the Hearing, taking into account such factors as the time needed, the space needs of the Special Committee and parties and witnesses, the need for a separate accommodation for witnesses while waiting to testify, and access to other facilities that may be needed;
 - **4.1.7** moving the proceedings toward a conclusion as expeditiously as reasonably possible while respecting the rights and needs of all participants;
 - **4.1.8** notifying the Chair of the ARRC of any withdrawal from the Special AFT-B Committee to permit timely appointment of a substitute as provided in Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures;
 - **4.1.9** reminding participants of limitations on the dissemination of personnel information set forth in Section 3.6;
 - **4.1.10** arranging for timely consultation with the Chair of ARRC should procedural disputes arise;
 - **4.1.11** keeping accurate records of expenditures for activities of the Special Committee and arranging for reimbursements from the Chancellor's office; and
 - 4.1.12 arranging for the court reporter and verbatim transcript required by Section 6.5.
 - **4.2 Written Notice to the Parties.** Within 7 days after the Special AFT-B Committee has been convened, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall send to each party the following:
 - **4.2.1** a copy of the Formal Written Complaint;
 - **4.2.2** a copy of the current Procedures of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities Committee;
 - **4.2.3** a copy of the current Code of Procedures for AFT-B Committees:
 - **4.2.4** a list of the members of the Special AFT-B Committee;
 - **4.2.5** the name of the ARRC Observer or, if no ARRC Observer has been appointed, notice to the parties that they are entitled to request that an ARRC Observer be appointed; and
 - **4.2.6** notice of the deadlines established in Section 4.3 and 4.4.

4.3 Formal Written Responses from Respondents: Mandatory Elements and Deadline for Filing. Within 20 calendar days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee, each respondent shall file a Formal Written Response with the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee. In addition, if a Formal Written Complaint was filed by an attorney for a complainant, each respondent shall within 20 calendar days from date of receipt of the complaint mail a copy of the Formal Written Response to said attorney by regular United States mail with sufficient postage attached, properly addressed to said attorney.

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- 4.3.1 Mandatory Elements. Each Formal Written Response shall contain a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the facts alleged in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest and a clear and concise statement indicating any ameliorating or other additional facts the respondent wishes to allege. Under Sections 4.5 and 7.2, if a respondent fails to file a timely Formal Written Response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.
- 4.3.2 Optional Elements. In addition, the Formal Written Response may include the following:
 - 4.3.2.1 a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the standards identified in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest;
 - **4.3.2.2** a clear and concise statement of the standards, if any, the respondent believes to be appropriate for evaluating the complaint;
 - 4.3.2.3 a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the violations alleged in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest;
 - 4.3.2.4 a clear and concise statement indicating reasons, if any, why termination would be inappropriate.
- The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.
- 4.4 Deadline for Requests from Any Party Requesting an Academic Advisor, an ARRC Observer, and for Allegations of Conflict of Interest. Within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee,
 - 4.4.1 any party wishing to be advised by an academic advisor shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee identifying the proposed academic advisor;
 - 4.4.2 any party wishing to request that the ARRC appoint an ARRC Observer shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee;
 - 4.4.3 any party wishing to allege that a member of the Special AFT-B Committee has a conflict of interest shall file a written statement with the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee setting forth the basis for the challenge.
- The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.
- 4.5 Procedure If No Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If no respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the uncontested allegations of fact in the Formal Written Complaint shall be deemed to be true, and the Chair of the Special Committee shall so notify the parties and shall schedule a meeting of the Special AFT-B Committee to prepare the Final Report required by Section 8.
- 4.6 Procedure If a Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If any respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall
 - 4.6.1 determine whether proposed academic advisors are eligible under Section 3.8, and if any party's proposed academic advisor is not eligible, invite that party to propose an eligible academic advisor;

- 1 **4.6.2** forward to each complainant and to each respondent a copy of each Formal Written 2 Response and the names of proposed academic advisors; and 3
 - **4.6.3** forward to the Chair of the ARRC any request that an ARRC Observer be appointed.

4.7 Party Challenges to Proposed Academic Advisors or ARRC Observer.

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> **4.7.1** Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed academic advisor by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed academic advisor. If a challenged proposed academic advisor does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall determine whether the proposed academic advisor is eligible. If the proposed academic advisor is not eligible, the party may propose another academic advisor. proposed academic advisor appears to be eligible, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall notify parties of the new proposed academic advisor and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed academic advisor.

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Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed ARRC Observer by 4.7.2 delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed ARRC Observer. The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall forward the challenge to the Chair of the ARRC. If a challenged ARRC Observer does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the ARRC shall determine whether the proposed ARRC Observer is eligible. If the proposed ARRC Observer is not eligible, the ARRC may in writing propose another ARRC Observer to the Chair of the Special Committee. The Chair of the Special Committee shall in writing notify parties of the new proposed ARRC Observer and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed ARRC Observer.

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5 PRE-HEARING CONFERENCE

 6.2.5 presentation of documentation and testimony of witnesses requested by the Special
 - **6.2.5** presentation of documentation and testimony of witnesses requested by the Special AFT-B Committee;
 - **6.2.6** rebuttal in support of the Formal Written Complaint;
 - **6.2.7** closing statement(s) by Complainant(s), followed by closing statement(s) by Respondent(s);
 - **6.2.8** statement by the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee thanking participants and explaining post-Hearing procedures.

This order may be varied if the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee determines that a clearer way of exploring the issues can be achieved, and if the Special AFT-B Committee and the parties agree.

6.3 Evidence and Witnesses.

- **6.3.1** Testimony shall be taken under oath. Each party shall have the right to cross-examine witnesses who testify and shall have the right to submit rebuttal testimony. Witnesses may testify and evidence may be received not only concerning relevant facts but also concerning relevant standards.
- **6.3.2** Members of the UNL community shall cooperate with the Special AFT-B Committee in providing testimony or documents; however, a person shall not be required to give testimony or to produce documents in regard to any confidential communication for which the law provides a privilege. Refusal by anyone to provide documents or to testify in regard to any communication for which the law does not provide a privilege obstructs the process and shall be taken into consideration by the Special AFT-B Committee in its deliberations and in its preparation of the Final Report.
- **6.3.3** In the event any party to the proceedings desires the issuance of a subpoena, such subpoena shall be issued at the direction of the Secretary of the Board of Regents, and may be served by the party requesting the subpoena or by any law enforcement officer in the manner provided for subpoenas in the Nebraska Courts.
- **6.3.4** Witnesses not able to attend the hearing may present testimony taken by deposition in the manner provided for depositions in the Nebraska Courts.
- **6.3.5** The Special AFT-B Committee may admit and give probative effect to evidence which possesses probative value commonly accepted by reasonably prudent persons in the conduct of their affairs. It may exclude incompetent, irrelevant, immaterial, and unduly repetitious evidence; provided, that a respondent may file with the Committee at least 3 days before the hearing a written request that the rules of evidence followed by the District Courts in the State of Nebraska shall be applicable. If such a written request is filed, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall notify the parties that the proceedings shall comply with the principles of law with respect to proceedings in the District Courts in Nebraska, and all

6.3.7 In cases where the grounds for termination of an appointment are based in whole or in part on questions of professional competence, the report of the meeting of tenured faculty of the respondent's unit required by Regents Bylaw 4.14.(b)(2) shall be made a part of the record. Relevant testimony concerning professional competence from individual colleagues, students, and others also may be admitted.

6.4 Format of Presentations and Questions. To preserve orderly and civil proceedings, the Hearing shall be conducted by the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee as follows:

6.4.1 No person shall speak without prior recognition by the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee.

6.4.2 Each party and each witness may be questioned by members of the Special AFT-B Committee after the end of the presentation of that party or witness.

6.4.3 When the Special AFT-B Committee has finished questioning a party or witness, each party may question that party or witness; alternatively, the parties may submit questions to the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee which the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee may ask on their behalf.

6.4.4 The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee may bar questions under Section 6.3.5. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar a question may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special AFT-B Committee

6.4.5 A party's academic advisor may consult privately with that party, may respond to questions from the Chair, and may address procedural questions to the Chair, but under ordinary circumstances may not otherwise participate in the Hearing.

6.5 Record of Hearing

The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall arrange for a court reporter to be present at the Hearing to produce a verbatim record of the Hearing. Bills for the court reporter's services shall be processed through the office of the General Counsel of the University. The verbatim record shall be made available to the parties and to the Special AFT-B Committee prior to the deliberations and decision of the Special AFT-B Committee required by Section 7. The verbatim record also shall be made available for inspection by the public as set forth in Section 8.3.

7 DELIBERATIONS AND DECISION

- 7.1 All deliberations shall be conducted in executive session with no one present except members of the Special AFT-B Committee, and the ARRC attorney, if invited.
- The complainant bears the burden of proving relevant facts by a preponderance of the relevant evidence. If a respondent fails to file a timely written response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.
- 8 7.3 Refusal by anyone to provide documents or to testify obstructs the process and shall be taken into consideration by the Special AFT-B Committee in its deliberations and preparation of the Final Report.
- The standards against which the charges are to be judged include applicable state and federal law; University bylaws, rules and regulations; established policies of the relevant administrative unit; appropriate professional and discipline based standards; applicable contracts; and academic principles and tradition. In the event of conflict between different University bylaws, rules or regulations, those of the more inclusive administrative unit shall prevail.
 - 7.5 Pursuant to Regents Bylaw 4.14(j), the Special AFT-B Committee shall have the power to consider a request filed by any person, board or committee that alleges that a faculty member should be subject to sanctions less severe than appointment termination, and power to recommend in any case sanctions less severe than appointment termination where less severe sanctions seem appropriate.

8 THE FINAL REPORT

 When the Special AFT-B Committee has completed its deliberations it shall prepare a Final Report setting forth the Special AFT-B Committee's disposition of each charge alleged in the Formal Written Complaint. Communications regarding matters outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint shall be addressed in accordance with the rules set forth in Section 10 below. The Final Report shall be limited to the following mandatory and optional elements.

- **8.1 Mandatory Elements of the Final Report.** The Final Report shall contain, with respect to each charge in the Formal Written Complaint:
 - **8.1.1** specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based;
 - 8.1.2 identification of the standards against which the charge is being judged;
 - 8.1.3 the Special AFT-B Committee's conclusions concerning whether applicable standards have been violated; and
 - **8.1.4** if the Special AFT-B Committee concludes that applicable standards have been violated, whether termination or some lesser sanction is warranted.
- Before preparing the elements of the Final Report required by Sections 8.1.2 and 8.1.3, the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall send to each party a copy of a provisional draft of the specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based required by Section 8.1.1. Each party shall have five days after receipt of the provisional draft

to submit written comments to the Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee suggesting specific changes to correct specific alleged inaccuracies in the provisional draft. No changes based upon 3 such comments shall be made to the provisional draft without first providing other parties an opportunity to respond to the comments. If the Special AFT-B Committee decides not to make 4 changes suggested in a written comment, that written comment and the Special AFT-B Committee's 5 reasons for that decision shall be appended to the Final Report. 6 8 8.2 Optional **Elements of the Final Report.** In addition, the Final Report may contain one or more of the following: 9 **8.2.1 Recommendations.** The Final Report may include recommendations: 10 8.2.1.1 concerning ways to prevent recurrence of acts, decisions, or circumstances 11 which may have contributed to the filing of the complaint; 12 13 8.2.1.2 concerning correction of any deficiencies or anomalies found in the substance 14 or application of bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, procedures, or customs which 15 may have contributed to the filing of the complaint. 8.2.2 Concurring or Dissenting Opinions. The Final Report may include concurring or 16 17 dissenting opinions, or both, concerning any mandatory or optional element of the report. 18 19 8.3 Delivery and Archiving of Verbatim Record, Case File, and Final Report. 20 21 **8.3.1** The Chair of the Special AFT-B Committee shall 8.3.1.1 deliver a copy of the Final Report, a copy of the verbatim record of the 22 23 Hearing, and a copy of all exhibits to the Board of Regents: 24 8.3.1.2 deliver a copy of the Final Report to each party, to the Chancellor, to the 25 President, to the Chair of the ARRC, and to the President of the Academic Senate: 26 and 27 **8.3.1.3** deliver a copy of the Final Report and of the case file required by Section 28 4.1.4 to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate.

8.3.2 The Coordinator of the Academic Senate shall

8.3.2.1 obtain from the Corporate Secretary of the Board of Regents a copy of any committee report considered by the Board of Regents and a copy of the official record of the Board of Regents action;

8.3.2.2 deposit any committee report considered by the Board of Regents, the official record of the Board of Regents action, a second copy of the Final Report, and the case file in the Academic Senate Office under specified conditions of access; and **8.3.2.3** deposit any committee report considered by the Board of Regents, the official record of the Board of Regents action, a second copy of the Final Report, and the case file in the University Archives under specified conditions of access.

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9 FOLLOW UP TO THE REPORT

- **9.1 Chancellor's (or President's) Response to Recommendations.** In response to recommendations made by the Special AFT-B Committee, the Chancellor (or, if the Chancellor is a party, the President) shall within 30 days provide a written response to the Chair of the ARRC indicating:
 - 9.1.1 the recommendations that have been accepted and the action taken;
 - 9.1.2 the recommendations that have been rejected in part or completely; and
 - **9.1.3** for each recommendation rejected, reasons responsive to the Committee's rationale for proposing it.
- Copies shall be sent to the parties, to the President of the Academic Senate, and to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate for inclusion in the case files in the ARRC archives and in the University Archives. If the response rejects or changes the recommendations made by the Special AFT-B Committee, the ARRC shall inform the President of the Academic Senate who shall provide each member of the Senate Executive Committee with a copy of the Final Report and of the response and shall put the matter on the agenda of the next Senate Executive Committee meeting for whatever action the Senate Executive Committee may deem appropriate.

9.2 ARRC Review of Implementation of Recommendations. The ARRC shall determine the extent to which recommendations of the Special AFT-B Committee have been implemented, and shall report its findings to the President of the Academic Senate and in its annual report to the Senate.

9.3 ARRC Meeting with the Special AFT-B Committee. After the Final Report has been filed, the ARRC shall meet with the Special AFT-B Committee and any others considered appropriate by the Chair of the ARRC to thank the Special AFT-B Committee for its work, to collect all copies of documents, and to hear from the Special AFT-B Committee any suggestions about how the work of the ARRC and its special committees might be improved.

10 COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING MATTERS OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF THE FORMAL WRITTEN COMPLAINT

10.1 In the course of an investigation, one or more members of the Special AFT-B Committee may conclude that the Special AFT-B Committee has heard allegations or otherwise discovered information which, though outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint and thus not subject to full investigation and evaluation by the Special AFT-B Committee, nonetheless suggests that actions or decisions have been taken or may be taken in violation of law, University policy, or academic principle.

10.2 Such concerns shall not be addressed in the Final Report of the Special AFT-B Committee required by Section 8.0. However, the Special AFT-B Committee acting though its chair, or any member or members of the Special AFT-B Committee, may communicate those concerns in writing to the appropriate administrator for investigation and for whatever corrective action may be appropriate. In shaping the contents of and determining the recipients for such communications, those preparing the communications shall consult with the Chair of the ARRC.

1	10.3	A copy of any such communication to an administrator shall at the same time be sent to
2		10.3.1 the Chancellor; and
3		10.3.2 the Chair of the ARRC; and
4		10.3.3 any individual on whose actions, decisions, or practices the communication
5		reflects; and
6		10.3.4 if the communication reflects on the actions, decisions, or practices of a committee
7		or unit, the individual who heads that committee or unit;
8		10.3.5 if the communication reflects on the actions, decisions, or practices of the Chancellor,
9		the President; and
10		10.3.6 if the communication includes concerns about alleged unlawful discrimination,
11		including sexual or other prohibited harassment, the UNL Office of Equity, Access and
12		Diversity Programs.
13		
14	10.4	Such communications shall be deemed to be a part of the responsibility of Special AFT-B
15	Comn	nittee members and, as such, to be subject to the same protections afforded all Special AFT-B

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1 CODE OF PROCEDURES FOR 2 SPECIAL GRIEVANCE COMMITTEES 3 University of Nebraska-Lincoln 4 5 6 1 INTRODUCTION 7 8 1.1 Academic Rights and Responsibilities. All professional staff (including administrators 9 and faculty members) of the University of Nebraska are entitled to enjoy and to exercise, without 10 penalty, all the rights of an American citizen and the rights of academic freedom as specified in 11 Regents Bylaw 4.2. It is essential to the University that all administrators and professional staff 12 exercise these rights and respect their exercise by others, and uphold the attendant responsibilities outlined in Regents Bylaw 4.1. 13 14 15 Duty of University Officials to Investigate and to Take Action on Known or Alleged 1.2 16 **Discrimination.** University Officials have a duty promptly to investigate and to take appropriate 17 action on all known or alleged incidents of illegal discrimination. University officials in this context shall be defined as any individual employed by UNL with job authority or responsibility 18 19 20 1.2.1 supervise, hire, assign or reassign responsibilities; 21 1.2.2 recommend or grant promotion or demotion; and/or 22 1.2.3 recommend or take any disciplinary or corrective actions. 23 24 1.3 Authority and Jurisdiction of Special Grievance Committees. 25 26 1.3.1 Regents Bylaws 4.8 and 4.13 authorize a Faculty Grievance Committee to 27 consider complaints by any faculty member alleging any grievance. The UNL Academic 28 Senate, with the approval of the University of Nebraska Board of Regents, has vested that 29 authority in Special Grievance Committees established under the aegis of the Academic 30 Rights and Responsibilities Committee (ARRC). A description of the committees can be 31 found in the Syllabus of Committees of the Academic Senate, available from the Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. 32 33 34 1.3.2 The Code entitled "Responsibilities of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities 35 Committee and Procedures for Handling Matters of Academic Freedom and Tenure. 36 Grievance and Professional Conduct" ("ARRC Procedures") indicates how complaints 37 are to be received by the ARRC, assessed for sufficiency and jurisdiction, and transmitted to a Special Committee. 38 39 40 This "Code of Procedures for Special Grievance Committees" indicates how a 41 complaint is to be handled after the ARRC has transmitted it to a Special Grievance 42 Committee. 43 44 The ARRC Procedures and the Code of Procedures for Special Grievance 45 Committees in their current form are available from the Academic Senate Office and on

the Academic Senate website. Any faculty member contemplating filing a complaint with the ARRC should first consult both documents. For information and advice concerning these procedures, contact the Chair of the ARRC.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this Code of Procedures for Special Grievance Committees, unless the context otherwise requires:

2.1 Chancellor shall mean the Chancellor of UNL.

2.2 Days shall mean days on which University offices are open for business.

2.3 Faculty Member shall mean any staff member of UNL holding the academic rank of lecturer or above or equivalent rank (Regents Bylaws 3.1.1.1 and 4.4).

2.4 In Writing and **Written**, when used to describe a communication, shall mean that the communication so described shall be either a paper document signed by the sender or an electronic communication that can be readily accessed by the sender and by the recipient.

2.5 Parties shall mean the complainant(s) and the respondent(s).

2.6 President shall mean the President of the University of Nebraska and shall include the authorized representative of the President. The President shall not extend such authorization to the Chancellor or staff members of any campus of the University.

2.7 Section, unless otherwise noted, refers to a section of this Code of Procedures for Grievances.

3 GENERAL RULES GOVERNING SPECIAL GRIEVANCE COMMITTEES

- 32 3.1 Quorum. Each Special Grievance Committee has six members. If a member of the
- 33 Special Grievance Committee withdraws or is barred prior to commencement of the
- 34 Investigative Hearing, the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall notify the Chair of the
- 35 ARRC, and the Chair of the ARRC shall make every reasonable effort to appoint a suitable
- 36 replacement as provided in Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures. In an emergency, and with
- 37 the consent of the parties, a hearing may be conducted with one member absent, but a member
- absent from the hearing may not participate in subsequent deliberations. In no case may the Special Grievance Committee proceed with the Investigative Hearing with fewer than five
- 40 members present.

3.2 Voting. The Special Grievance Committee may take action only on concurrence of four members. The Chair may vote.

- 1 3.3 Expiration of Term. A member of the Special Grievance Committee whose term on the ARRC Panel expires during a case shall continue to serve until the case is concluded.

- **3.4 Conflict of Interest.** Conflict of Interest occurs when a member of the Special Grievance Committee
 - 3.4.1 is in the same department or equivalent unit as a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.2 answers directly to a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.3 has a direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.4 has, or reasonably appears to have, a personal interest in the case or its outcome; or
 - 3.4.5 has provided counsel or assistance to a party relating to the grievance; or
 - **3.4.6** has participated in the efforts of an organization to provide counsel or assistance to a party relating to the case; or
 - 3.4.7 has any other relationship with a party that might prevent impartiality.

 When a member of the Special Grievance Committee discovers that the member has a conflict of interest, the member shall voluntarily withdraw from participation. When a member of the Special Grievance Committee is alleged to have a conflict of interest and the member does not voluntarily withdraw, the ARRC shall review the allegation and, if a conflict of interest is found, shall bar that person from further participation.

3.5 Communications.

3.5.1 The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee receives communications for the Committee and speaks for it. Both complainant and respondent shall address communications concerning the case only to the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee. Special Grievance Committee members should discourage contacts outside the regular process, and should direct those who make them to the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee.

3.5.2 The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall keep all parties informed of any substantive communications and contacts, including those that arise outside the normal process.

3.5.3 If the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee has difficulty communicating with a party or other necessary participant, the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee may consult with the Chair of the ARRC about ways to resolve the communication problem.

- 3.6 Dissemination of Personnel Information. Participation in Special Grievance
- Committee proceedings makes participants privy to sensitive information and allegations involving the personal and professional lives of members of the University community. UNL
- 42 Bylaw 2.9 describes limitations on the collection and dissemination of personnel information.
- 43 Some information obtained as part of a Grievance proceeding may be protected against broader
- dissemination by this Bylaw. Violators of this Bylaw could be subject to sanctions for
- 45 professional misconduct.

The 41 responsibilities of the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee include: 42 **4.1.1** convening and presiding over meetings of the Special Grievance Committee; **4.1.2** receiving communications for the Special Grievance Committee and speaking for 43 44 it;

4.1.3 ensuring that all substantive communications regarding the grievance are made
 available to all parties;
 4.1.4 maintaining a complete case file, including a record of all substantive

- **4.1.4** maintaining a complete case file, including a record of all substantive communications, documents, committee actions, and committee reports related to the grievance;
- **4.1.5** providing a copy of the Formal Written Complaint, the Formal Written Response, the current ARRC Procedures, and the current Code of Procedures for Special Grievance Committees to each member of the Special Grievance Committee, and to the ARRC Observer, if any;
- **4.1.6** arranging for accommodations for the Pre-Hearing Conference and for the Investigative Hearing, taking into account such factors as the time needed, the space needs of the Special Committee and parties and witnesses, the need for a separate accommodation for witnesses while waiting to testify, and access to other facilities that may be needed;
- **4.1.7** moving the proceedings toward a conclusion as expeditiously as reasonably possible while respecting the rights and needs of all participants;
- **4.1.8** notifying the Chair of the ARRC of any withdrawal from the Special Grievance Committee to permit timely appointment of a substitute as provided in Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures;
- **4.1.9** reminding participants of limitations on the dissemination of personnel information set forth in Section 3.6;
- **4.1.10** arranging for timely consultation with the Chair of ARRC should procedural disputes arise; and
- **4.1.11** keeping accurate records of expenditures for activities of the Special Committee and arranging for reimbursements from the Chancellor's office.
- **4.2 Written Notice to the Parties.** Within 7 days after the Special Grievance Committee has been convened, the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall send to each party the following:
 - **4.2.1** a copy of the Formal Written Complaint;
 - **4.2.2** a copy of the current Procedures of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities Committee;
 - **4.2.3** a copy of the current Code of Procedures for Grievances;
 - **4.2.4** a list of the members of the Special Grievance Committee;
 - **4.2.5** the name of the ARRC Observer or, if no ARRC Observer has been appointed, notice to the parties that they are entitled to request that an ARRC Observer be appointed; and
 - **4.2.6** notice of the deadlines established in Section 4.3 and 4.4.
- 4.3 Formal Written Responses from Respondents: Mandatory Elements and Deadline for Filing. Within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee, each respondent shall file a Formal Written Response with the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee.

4.3.1 Mandatory Elements. Each Formal Written Response shall contain a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the facts alleged in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest and a clear and concise statement indicating any ameliorating or other additional facts the respondent wishes to allege. Under Sections 4.5 and 7.2, if a respondent fails to file a timely Formal Written Response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.

- **4.3.2 Optional Elements.** In addition, the Formal Written Response may include the following:
 - **4.3.2.1** a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the standards identified in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest; **4.3.2.2** a clear and concise statement of the standards, if any, the respondent believes to be appropriate for evaluating the complaint;
 - **4.3.2.3** a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the violations alleged in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest:
 - **4.3.2.4** a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the proposed remedies, sanctions, or other personal relief or prospective institutional change the respondent believes would be inappropriate.

The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.

- 4.4 Deadline for Requests from Any Party Requesting an Academic Advisor, an ARRC Observer, and for Allegations of Conflict of Interest. Within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee,
 - **4.4.1** any party wishing to be advised by an academic advisor shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee identifying the proposed academic advisor;
 - **4.4.2** any party wishing to request that the ARRC appoint an ARRC Observer shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee;
 - **4.4.3** any party wishing to allege that a member of the Special Grievance Committee has a conflict of interest shall file a written statement with the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee setting forth the basis for the challenge.

The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.

4.5 Procedure If No Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If no respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the uncontested allegations of fact in the Formal Written Complaint shall be deemed to be true, and the Chair of the Special Committee shall so notify the parties and shall schedule a meeting of the Special Grievance Committee to prepare the Final Report required by Section 8.

- **4.6** Procedure If a Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If any respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall
 - **4.6.1** determine whether proposed academic advisors are eligible under Section 3.8, and if any party's proposed academic advisor is not eligible, invite that party to propose an eligible academic advisor;
 - **4.6.2** forward to each complainant and to each respondent a copy of each Formal Written Response and the names of proposed academic advisors; and
 - **4.6.3** forward to the Chair of the ARRC any request that an ARRC Observer be appointed.

4.7 Party Challenges to Proposed Academic Advisors or ARRC Observer.

4.7.1 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed academic advisor by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed academic advisor. If a challenged proposed academic advisor does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall determine whether the proposed academic advisor is eligible. If the proposed academic advisor is not eligible, the party may propose another academic advisor. If the new proposed academic advisor appears to be eligible, the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall notify parties of the new proposed academic advisor and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed academic advisor.

4.7.2 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed ARRC Observer by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed ARRC Observer. The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall forward the challenge to the Chair of the ARRC. If a challenged ARRC Observer does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the ARRC shall determine whether the proposed ARRC Observer is eligible. If the proposed ARRC Observer to the Chair of the Special Committee. 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- **6.3.3** Witnesses may testify and evidence may be received not only concerning relevant facts but also concerning relevant standards. The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee may bar the introduction of documents, evidence, questions, and testimony reasonably deemed irrelevant, immaterial, not-competent, or unduly repetitious. The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee also may bar the introduction of documents, evidence, and testimony if introduction would unfairly surprise another party and if the documents, evidence, or testimony could, with reasonable diligence, have been discovered or produced before the Pre-Hearing Conference. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar the introduction of evidence may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special Grievance Committee.
- **6.3.4** The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee may in appropriate circumstances temporarily adjourn the Investigative Hearing.

Format of Presentations and Questions. To preserve orderly and civil proceedings, the

- Investigative Hearing shall be conducted by the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee as follows:
 - **6.4.1** No person shall speak without prior recognition by the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee.
 - **6.4.2** Each party and each witness may be questioned by members of the Special Grievance Committee after the end of the presentation of that party or witness.
 - **6.4.3** When the Special Grievance Committee has finished questioning a party or witness, each party may question that party or witness; alternatively, the parties may submit questions to the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee which the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee may ask on their behalf.
 - **6.4.4** The Chair of the Special Grievance Committee may bar questions under Section 6.3.3. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar a question may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special Grievance Committee
 - 6.4.5 A party's academic advisor may consult privately with that party, may respond to questions from the Chair, and may address procedural questions to the Chair, but under ordinary circumstances may not otherwise participate in the Investigative Hearing.

All deliberations shall be conducted in executive session with no one present except members of the Special Grievance Committee, and the ARRC attorney, if invited,

DELIBERATIONS AND DECISION

- 7.2 The complainant bears the burden of proving relevant facts by a preponderance of the relevant evidence. If a respondent fails to file a timely written response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.
- **7.3** Refusal by anyone to provide documents or to testify obstructs the process and shall be taken into consideration by the Special Grievance Committee in its deliberations and preparation of the Final Report.

7.4 The standards against which the charges are to be judged include applicable state and federal law; University bylaws, rules and regulations; established policies of the relevant administrative unit; appropriate professional and discipline based standards; applicable contracts; and academic principles and tradition. In the event of conflict between different University bylaws, rules or regulations, those of the more inclusive administrative unit shall prevail.

8 THE FINAL REPORT

When the Special Grievance Committee has completed its deliberations it shall prepare a Final Report setting forth the Special Grievance Committee's disposition of each grievance alleged in the Formal Written Complaint. Communications regarding matters outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint shall be addressed in accordance with the rules set forth in Section 10 below. The Final Report shall be limited to the following mandatory and optional elements.

- **8.1 Mandatory Elements of the Final Report.** The Final Report shall contain, with respect to each grievance alleged in the Formal Written Complaint:
 - **8.1.1** specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based;
 - **8.1.2** identification of the standards against which the grievance is being judged; and **8.1.3** the Special Grievance Committee's conclusions concerning whether applicable standards have been violated.

Before preparing the elements of the Final Report required by Sections 8.1.2 and 8.1.3, the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee shall send to each party a copy of a provisional draft of the specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based required by Section 8.1.1. Each party shall have five days after receipt of the provisional draft to submit written comments to the Chair of the Special Grievance Committee suggesting specific changes to correct specific alleged inaccuracies in the provisional draft. No changes based upon such comments shall be made to the provisional draft without first providing other parties an opportunity to respond to the comments. If the Special Grievance Committee decides not to make changes suggested in a written comment, that written comment and the Special Grievance Committee's reasons for that decision shall be appended to the Final Report.

8.2 Optional Elements of the Final Report . In addition, the Final Report may contain one or more of the following:

1		8.2.1 Order of Reconsideration Under Regents Bylaw 4.13.2. If the grievance alleged
2		that inadequate consideration was given to relevant matters by the person or body that
3		took the action or made the decision that led to the grievance, and if the Special
4		Grievance Committee has determined that inadequate consideration of the relevant
5		matters occurred, the Final Report of the Special Grievance Committee shall state the
6		facts found and the respects in which the consideration was inadequate. The Special
7		Grievance Committee shall not substitute its judgment on the merits for that of the
8		person, group, or groups that previously considered the decision. The Special Grievance
9		Committee may order the matter reconsidered by the appropriate person, group, or
10		groups, or recommend that other rectifying action be taken. Any such order of
11		reconsideration shall indicate the person or unit that is to begin the reconsideration
12		ordered by the Special Grievance Committee, shall indicate reasonable time limits
13		within which the reconsideration shall occur, and shall include the requirement that the
14		file used for the reconsideration include the full Final Report of the Special Grievance
15		Committee and any relevant further evidence submitted for the reconsideration. ²
16		8.2.2 Recommendations. The Final Report may include recommendations:

9 FOLLOW UP TO THE REPORT

- 9.1 Chancellor's (or President's) Response to Recommendations. In response to recommendations made by the Special Grievance Committee, the Chancellor (or, if the Chancellor is a party, the President) shall within 30 days provide a written response to the Chair of the ARRC indicating:
 - 9.1.1 the recommendations that have been accepted and the action taken;
 - 9.1.2 the recommendations that have been rejected in part or completely; and
 - **9.1.3** for each recommendation rejected, reasons responsive to the Committee's rationale for proposing it.

Copies shall be sent to the parties, to the President of the Academic Senate, and to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate for inclusion in the case files in the ARRC archives and in the University Archives. If the response rejects or changes the recommendations made by the Special Grievance Committee, the ARRC shall inform the President of the Academic Senate who shall provide each member of the Senate Executive Committee with a copy of the Final Report and of the response and shall put the matter on the agenda of the next Senate Executive Committee meeting for whatever action the Senate Executive Committee may deem appropriate.

9.2 ARRC Review of Implementation of Recommendations. The ARRC shall determine the extent to which recommendations of the Special Grievance Committee have been implemented, and shall report its findings to the President of the Academic Senate and in its annual report to the Senate.

9.3 ARRC Meeting with the Special Grievance Committee. After the Final Report has been filed, the ARRC shall meet with the Special Grievance Committee and any others considered appropriate by the Chair of the ARRC to thank the Special Grievance Committee for its work, to collect all copies of documents, and to hear from the Special Grievance Committee any suggestions about how the work of the ARRC and its special committees might be improved.

10 COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING MATTERS OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF THE FORMAL WRITTEN COMPLAINT

- 10.1 In the course of an investigation, one or more members of the Special Grievance

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1 **CODE OF PROCEDURES FOR** 2 SPECIAL PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT - A (PC-A) COMMITTEES 3 University of Nebraska-Lincoln 4 5 6 1 INTRODUCTION 7 8 1.1 Academic Rights and Responsibilities. All professional staff (including administrators and faculty members) of the University of Nebraska are entitled to enjoy and to exercise, without 9 penalty, all the rights of an American citizen and the rights of academic freedom as specified in 10 11 Regents Bylaw 4.2. It is essential to the University that all administrators and professional staff exercise these rights and respect their exercise by others, and uphold the attendant responsibilities 12 outlined in Regents Bylaw 4.1. 13 14 15 1.2 Duty of University Officials to Investigate and to Take Action on Known or Alleged Discrimination. University Officials have a duty promptly to investigate and to take appropriate 16 action on all known or alleged incidents of illegal discrimination. University officials in this context 17 shall be defined as any individual employed by UNL with job authority or responsibility to 18 19 1.2.1 supervise, hire, assign or reassign responsibilities: 20 1.2.2 recommend or grant promotion or demotion; and/or 21 **1.2.3** recommend or take any disciplinary or corrective actions. 22 23 1.3 Authority and Jurisdiction of Special PC-A Committees. 24 25 Regents Bylaws 4.15 authorizes a Faculty Professional Conduct Committee to 26 consider complaints by any person charging a member of the professional staff with 27 professional misconduct. The UNL Academic Senate, with the approval of the University 28 of Nebraska Board of Regents, has vested that authority in Special Professional Conduct 29 Committees established under the aegis of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities Committee (ARRC). A description of the committees can be found in the Syllabus of 30 31 Committees of the Academic Senate, available from the Academic Senate Office and on the 32 Academic Senate website. 33 34 1.3.2 The Code entitled "Responsibilities of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities" 35 Committee and Procedures for Handling Matters of Academic Freedom and Tenure, Grievance and Professional Conduct" ("ARRC Procedures") indicates how complaints are 36 37 to be received by the ARRC, assessed for sufficiency and jurisdiction, and transmitted to a 38 Special Committee. 39 This "Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees" indicates how a complaint 40 41 alleging professional misconduct other than Federal Misconduct in Science is to be handled 42 after the ARRC has transmitted it to a Special PC-A Committee. The "Code of Procedures for Special PC-B Committees" indicates how a complaint by the Vice-Chancellor for 43 44 Research alleging violation of Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations is to be handled after the ARRC has transmitted it to a Special PC-B Committee. 45

1 1.3.4 The ARRC Procedures and the Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees in their current form are available from the Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. Any faculty member contemplating filing a complaint with the ARRC should first consult both documents. For information and advice concerning these procedures, contact the Chair of the ARRC.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees, unless the context otherwise requires:

2.1 Chancellor shall mean the Chancellor of UNL.

2.2 Days shall mean days on which University offices are open for business.

2.3 F aculty Member shall mean any staff member of UNL holding the academic rank of lecturer or above or equivalent rank (Regents Bylaws 3.1.1.1 and 4.4).

 2.4 Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations shall mean regulations covering misconduct in federally sponsored scientific research, particularly, but not exclusively, that funded by the Public Health Service. Consult the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research to determine projects covered by these regulations.

2.5 In Writing and Written, when used to describe a communication, shall mean that the communication so described shall be either a paper document signed by the sender or an electronic communication that can be readily accessed by the sender and by the recipient.

2.6 Parties shall mean the complainant(s) and the respondent(s).

2.7 President shall mean the President of the University of Nebraska and shall include the authorized representative of the President. The President shall not extend such authorization to the Chancellor or staff members of any campus of the University.

2.8 Section, unless otherwise noted, refers to a section of this Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees.

2.9 Vice Chancellor for Research shall include the authorized representative of the Vice Chancellor. The Vice Chancellor shall not extend such authorization to Deans with collegiate or divisional responsibility or to a staff member of any such college or division.

3 GENERAL RULES GOVERNING SPECIAL PC-A COMMITTEES

3 3.1 Quorum.

1 2

3.1.1 Each Special PC-A Committee has six faculty members. If a Special Committee to be convened as a Special PC-A Committee is to hear a discrimination complaint filed by other than a member of the Academic/Administrative or Other Academic Staff, the Special PC-A Committee shall be augmented pursuant to Section 3.3.6 of the ARRC Procedures by the addition of three members of the committee to which the complaint would have been referred had the complainant been formally charged under the UNL "Policy and Procedures on Unlawful Discrimination, Including Sexual and Other Prohibited Harassment.

3.1.2 If a member of the Special PC-A Committee or a staff member or student appointed to augment the Special PC-A Committee withdraws or is barred prior to commencement of the Investigative Hearing, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall notify the Chair of the ARRC, and the Chair of the ARRC shall make every reasonable effort to appoint a suitable replacement as provided in Section 3.3.5 or 3.3.6 of the ARRC Procedures. In an emergency, and with the consent of the parties, a hearing may be conducted with one faculty member absent, but a faculty member absent from the hearing may not participate in subsequent deliberations. In no case may the Special PC-A Committee proceed with the Investigative Hearing with fewer than five faculty members present.

3.2 Voting. The Special PC-A Committee may take action only on concurrence of four faculty members. The Chair may vote. Students or staff added to a Special PC-A Committee pursuant to Section 3.3.6 of the ARRC Procedures may participate fully in discussions, hearings, and deliberations of the Special PC-A Committee, but may not vote. If the opinion of the students or staff added to the Special PC-A Committee differs from that of the regular members of the Special PC-A Committee, their opinion and the rationale for that opinion shall be included in the Final Report of the Special PC-A Committee required by Section 8.

3.3 Expiration of Term. A member of the Special PC-A Committee whose term on the ARRC Panel expires during a case shall continue to serve until the case is concluded.

- **3.4 Conflict of Interest.** Con flict of Interest occurs when a member of the Special PC-A Committee
 - 3.4.1 is in the same department or equivalent unit as a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.2 answers directly to a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.3 has a direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; or
 - 3.4.4 has, or reasonably appears to have, a personal interest in the case or its outcome; or
- **3.4.5** has provided counsel or assistance to a party relating to the professional misconduct allegation; or
 - **3.4.6** has participated in the efforts of an organization to provide counsel or assistance to a party relating to the case; or
 - **3.4.7** has any other relationship with a party that might prevent impartiality.

When a member of the Special PC-A Committee discovers that the member has a conflict of interest, the member shall voluntarily withdraw from participation. When a member of the Special PC-A Committee is alleged to have a conflict of interest and the member does not voluntarily withdraw, the ARRC shall review the allegation and, if a conflict of interest is found, shall bar that person from further participation.

3.5 Communications.

 3.5.1 The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee receives communications for the Committee and speaks for it. Both complainant and respondent shall address communications concerning the case only to the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee. Special PC-A Committee members should discourage contacts outside the regular process, and should direct those who make them to the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee.

3.5.2 The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall keep all parties informed of any substantive communications and contacts, including those that arise outside the normal process.

3.5.3 If the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee has difficulty communicating with a party or other necessary participant, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may consult with the Chair of the ARRC about ways to resolve the communication problem.

3.6 Dissemination of Personnel Information. Participation in Special PC-A Committee proceedings makes participants privy to sensitive information and allegations involving the personal and professional lives of members of the University community. UNL Bylaw 2.9 describes limitations on the collection and dissemination of personnel information. Some information obtained as part of a PC-A proceeding may be protected against broader dissemination by this Bylaw. Violators of this Bylaw could be subject to sanctions for professional misconduct.

3.7C losed Hearings. PC-A proceedings, including the Pre-Hearing Conference and the Investigative Hearing, are considered to be investigative in nature. They are not open to the public, nor to witnesses except while they are presenting evidence and responding to questions.

3.8 Academic Advisors. Each party may choose an Academic Advisor who may accompany and advise the party at the Pre-Hearing Conference and the Investigative Hearing. The role of Academic Advisor is open to any person who:

3.8.1 is a member of the UNL Academic Assembly (UNL Bylaw 3.3.1) or has emeritus faculty status at UNL;

 3.8.2 is not in the same department or equivalent unit as a witness (other than the party being advised) before or a member of the Special PC-A Committee;

 3.8.3 has no other relationship with a member of the Special PC-A Committee that might create, or reasonably might seem to create, a conflict of interest for that Special PC-A Committee member;

3.8.4 has no direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; and

2 with the investigative process. 3 4 3.9 Counsel and Advice for the Special PC-A Committee. 5 6 3.9.1 Because of potential conflicts of interest, the Special PC-A Committee shall not seek 7 or accept advice from anyone to whom a party is answerable or who may be in a position of 8 giving advice or legal counsel to a party or to any person or body that may later act on the Report of the Special PC-A Committee. 9 10 11 3.9.2 The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may receive advice from the ARRC attorney selected pursuant to section 3.10.2 of the ARRC Procedures, but may not have an 12 attorney present at the Investigative Hearing. 13 14 3.9.3 Nothing in this Section 3.9 shall prevent full participation by a member of the 15 Special PC-A Committee who is also an attorney. 16 17 18 3.10 Termination of Pending PC-A Proceedings. 19 3.10.1 If at any time all complainants in writing ask the Chair of the Special PC-A 20 21 Committee that the Formal Written Complaint be withdrawn, or all parties in writing notify 22 the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee that they have reached a settlement of the case. the Special PC-A Committee shall terminate the proceedings and shall not deliver the Final 23 Report described in Section 8. However, in such circumstances the Special PC-A 24 Committee may, on its own initiative, make written recommendations authorized by 25 26 Sections 8.2.2 and 8.2.3 27 3.10.1.1 concerning ways to prevent recurrence of acts, decisions, or circumstances 28 which may have contributed to the filing of the complaint; and 3.10.1.2 concerning ways to correct any deficiencies or anomalies found in the 29 substance or application of bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, procedures, or 30 customs which may have contributed to the filing of the complaint. 31 32 Termination of the proceedings under this section shall not preclude the Special PC-A 33 Committee, or members of the Special PC-A Committee, from making the 34 "Communications Regarding Matters Outside the Scope of the Formal Written Complaint" 35 authorized by Section 10. 36 37 38 3.10.2 Resignation from the University by any party shall not necessarily prevent the 39 Special PC-A Committee from completing its deliberations and delivering the Final Report described in Section 8. 40 41 42 Timely Completion. Unless the ARRC, for good cause shown, authorizes a longer period of

time, the Special PC-A Committee shall complete its investigation and deliver its report within 150

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days of receiving the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the ARRC.

3.8.5 has no other relationship with a party, an organization, or a witness that might interfere

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3.12 Adherence to Procedures.

3.12.1 If a party has good reason to believe that the Special PC-A Committee is out of compliance with these procedures, the matter should be brought to the attention of the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee. Procedural questions that the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee cannot resolve promptly and that are so important that failure to resolve them would undermine the credibility of the Special PC-A Committee may be referred by the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee or by a party to the ARRC for resolution. The ARRC shall resolve the issues after obtaining the views of the parties and of the Special PC-A Committee. The Chair of the ARRC shall inform the parties and the Special PC-A Committee of the ARRC decision and direct them to follow the decision.

3.12.2 If a party has good reason to believe that the ARRC is out of compliance with these procedures or the ARRC Procedures, the party may invoke Section 6.2 of the ARRC Procedures.

4 GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CHAIR OF THE SPECIAL PC-A COMMITTEE, NOTICE, RESPONSE, ALLEGATIONS OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST, AND CHALLENGES TO THE ELIGIBILITY OF PROPOSED ACADEMIC ADVISORS

- 4.1 General Responsibilities of the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee. The responsibilities of the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee include:
 - **4.1.1** convening and presiding over meetings of the Special PC-A Committee;
 - 4.1.2 receiving communications for the Special PC-A Committee and speaking for it;
 - **4.1.3** ensuring that all substantive communications regarding the PC-A are made available to all parties;
 - **4.1.4** maintaining a complete case file, including a record of all substantive communications, documents, committee actions, and committee reports;
 - **4.1.5** providing a copy of the Formal Written Complaint, the Formal Written Response, the current ARRC Procedures, and the current Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees to each member of the Special PC-A Committee, and to the ARRC Observer, if any;
 - **4.1.6** arranging for accommodations for the Pre-Hearing Conference and for the Investigative Hearing, taking into account such factors as the time needed, the space needs of the Special Committee and parties and witnesses, the need for a separate accommodation for witnesses while waiting to testify, and access to other facilities that may be needed;
 - **4.1.7** moving the proceedings toward a conclusion as expeditiously as reasonably possible while respecting the rights and needs of all participants;
 - **4.1.8** notifying the Chair of the ARRC of any withdrawal from the Special PC-A Committee to permit timely appointment of a substitute as provided in Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures;
- **4.1.9** reminding participants of limitations on the dissemination of personnel information set forth in Section 3.6;

1 4.1.10 arranging for timely consultation with the Chair of ARRC should procedural disputes 2 arise: and 4.1.11 keeping accurate records of expenditures for activities of the Special Committee and 3 4 arranging for reimbursements from the Chancellor's office. 5 6 7 4.2 Written Notice to the Parties. Within 7 days after the Special PC-A Committee has been convened, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall send to each party the following: 8 9 **4.2.1** a copy of the Formal Written Complaint; 4.2.2 a copy of the current Procedures of the Academic Rights and Responsibilities 10 11 Committee: 12 **4.2.3** a copy of the current Code of Procedures for Special PC-A Committees; 4.2.4 a list of the members of the Special PC-A Committee; 13 4.2.5 the name of the ARRC Observer or, if no ARRC Observer has been appointed, notice 14 15 to the parties that they are entitled to request that an ARRC Observer be appointed; and **4.2.6** notice of the deadlines established in Section 4.3 and 4.4. 16 17 Formal Written Responses from Respondents: Mandatory Elements and Deadline for 18 4.3 19 Filing. Within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee, each respondent shall file a Formal Written Response with the Chair 20 of the Special PC-A Committee. 21 22 23 **4.3.1 Mandatory Elements.** Each Formal Written Response shall contain a clear and 24 concise statement indicating which, if any, of the facts alleged in the Formal Written 25 Complaint the respondent wishes to contest and a clear and concise statement indicating any 26 ameliorating or other additional facts the respondent wishes to allege. Under Sections 4.5 and 7.2, if a respondent fails to file a timely Formal Written Response or otherwise fails to 27 contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true. 28 29 30 4.3.2 Optional Elements. In addition, the Formal Written Response may include the following: 31 32 **4.3.2.1** a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the standards 33 identified in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest; **4.3.2.2** a clear and concise statement of the standards, if any, the respondent believes 34 35 to be appropriate for evaluating the complaint; 4.3.2.3 a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the violations 36 alleged in the Formal Written Complaint the respondent wishes to contest; 37 4.3.2.4 a clear and concise statement indicating which, if any, of the 38 39 proposed remedies, sanctions, or other personal relief or prospective institutional change the respondent believes would be inappropriate. 40 41 42 The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.

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- 4.4 D eadline for Requests from Any Party Requesting an Academic Advisor, an ARRC Observer, and for Allegations of Conflict of Interest. Within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee,
 - **4.4.1** any party wishing to be advised by an academic advisor shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee identifying the proposed academic advisor;
 - **4.4.2** any party wishing to request that the ARRC appoint an ARRC Observer shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee;
 - **4.4.3** any party wishing to allege that a member of the Special PC-A Committee has a conflict of interest shall file a written statement with the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee setting forth the basis for the challenge.

The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.

4.5 Procedure If No Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If no respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the uncontested allegations of fact in the Formal Written Complaint shall be deemed to be true, and the Chair of the Special Committee shall so notify the parties and shall schedule a meeting of the Special PC-A Committee to prepare the Final Report required by Section 8.

- **4.6** Procedure If a Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If any respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall
 - **4.6.1** determine whether proposed academic advisors are eligible under Section 3.8, and if any party's proposed academic advisor is not eligible, invite that party to propose an eligible academic advisor:
 - **4.6.2** forward to each complainant and to each respondent a copy of each Formal Written Response and the names of proposed academic advisors; and
 - **4.6.3** forward to the Chair of the ARRC any request that an ARRC Observer be appointed.

4.7 Party Challenges to Proposed Academic Advisors or ARRC Observer.

4.7.1 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed academic advisor by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed academic advisor. If a challenged proposed academic advisor does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall determine whether the proposed academic advisor is eligible. If the proposed academic advisor is not eligible, the party may propose another academic advisor. If the new proposed academic advisor appears to be eligible, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall notify parties of the new proposed academic advisor and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed academic advisor.

 4.7.2 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed ARRC Observer by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed ARRC Observer. The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall forward the challenge to the Chair of the ARRC. If a challenged ARRC Observer does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the ARRC shall determine whether the

proposed ARRC Observer is eligible. If the proposed ARRC Observer is not eligible, the ARRC may in writing propose another ARRC Observer to the Chair of the Special Committee. The Chair of the Special Committee shall in writing notify parties of the new proposed ARRC Observer and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed ARRC Observer.

5 PRE-HEARING CONFERENCE

- 5.1 Purpose. As soon as possible after giving notice of a Formal Written Response contesting any allegations of the Formal Written Complaint and resolving any issues involving conflicts of interest and eligibility of proposed academic advisors and ARRC Observers, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall arrange a Pre-Hearing Conference with all parties in attendance
 - **5.1.1** to clarify the issues involved;
 - **5.1.2** to identify uncontroverted facts;
 - **5.1.3** to explore the possibility of a voluntary settlement of the case;
 - 5.1.4 to explain procedures applicable to the Investigative Hearing; and
 - **5.1.5** to establish procedures for setting the date, time, and place of the Investigative Hearing.

 At the Pre-Hearing Conference each party shall provide every other party and the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee with a copy of any documentation to be introduced by the party at the Investigative Hearing and with a list of any witnesses to be called by the party at the Investigative Hearing.

5.2 Persons Who May Attend and Participate in the Pre-Hearing Conference:

- **5.2.1** the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee:
- **5.2.2** the parties;
- **5.2.3** each party's academic advisor, if any;
- 5.2.4 the ARRC attorney, if requested by the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee; and
- **5.2.5** the ARRC Observer, if any.

5.3 M eeting of the Special PC-A Committee after the Pre-Hearing Conference and Before the Investigative Hearing.

- **5.3.1** As soon as possible after the conclusion of the Pre-Hearing Conference, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall provide each member of the Special PC-A Committee with the following:
 - **5.3.1.1** a copy of the Formal Written Complaint and a copy of each Formal Written Response;
 - **5.3.1.2** a copy of each party's written list of witnesses to be called and documentation to be introduced at the Investigative Hearing;
 - **5.3.1.3** a written summary of matters decided at the Pre-Hearing Conference.
- **5.3.2** After a reasonable time to permit members of the Special PC-A Committee to review of these materials, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall convene a meeting of the Special PC-A Committee, with only members of the Special PC-A Committee present, to determine whether the Special PC-A Committee wishes to call any additional witnesses or

6.3 Evidence and Witnesses.

- **6.3.1** The Special PC-A Committee may direct the parties, faculty members, and other officers of the University to produce specific relevant documents (including personnel and student records) for introduction at the Investigative Hearing.
- **6.3.2** Members of the UNL community shall cooperate with the Special PC-A Committee in providing testimony or documents; however, a person shall not be required to give testimony or to produce documents in regard to any confidential communication for which the law provides a privilege. Refusal by anyone to provide documents or to testify in regard to any communication for which the law does not provide a privilege obstructs the process and shall be taken into consideration by the Special PC-A Committee in its deliberations and in its preparation of the Final Report.
- **6.3.3** Witnesses may testify and evidence may be received not only concerning relevant facts but also concerning relevant standards. The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may bar the introduction of documents, evidence, questions, and testimony reasonably deemed irrelevant, immaterial, not-competent, or unduly repetitious. The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee also may bar the introduction of documents, evidence, and testimony if introduction would unfairly surprise another party and if the documents, evidence, or testimony could, with reasonable diligence, have been discovered or produced before the Pre-Hearing Conference. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar the introduction of evidence may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special PC-A Committee.
- **6.3.4** The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may in appropriate circumstances temporarily adjourn the Investigative Hearing.
- **6.4** Format of Presentations and Questions. To preserve orderly and civil proceedings, the Investigative Hearing shall be conducted by the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee as follows:
 - **6.4.1** No person shall speak without prior recognition by the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee.
 - **6.4.2** Each party and each witness may be questioned by members of the Special PC-A Committee after the end of the presentation of that party or witness.
 - **6.4.3** When the Special PC-A Committee has finished questioning a party or witness, each party may question that party or witness; alternatively, the parties may submit questions to the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee which the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may ask on their behalf.
 - **6.4.4** The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee may bar questions under Section 6.3.3. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar a question may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special PC-A Committee

6.4.5 A party's academic advisor may consult privately with that party, may respond to questions from the Chair, and may address procedural questions to the Chair, but under ordinary circumstances may not otherwise participate in the Investigative Hearing.

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7 DELIBERATIONS AND DECISION

7.1 All deliberations shall be conducted in executive session with no one present except members of the Special PC-A Committee, and the ARRC attorney, if invited.

7.2 The complainant bears the burden of proving relevant facts by a preponderance of the relevant evidence. If a respondent fails to file a timely written response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.

7.3 Refusal by anyone to provide documents or to testify obstructs the process and shall be taken into consideration by the Special PC-A Committee in its deliberations and preparation of the Final Report.

7.4 The standards against which the charges are to be judged include applicable state and federal law; University bylaws, rules and regulations; established policies of the relevant administrative unit; appropriate professional and discipline based standards; applicable contracts; and academic principles and tradition. In the event of conflict between different University bylaws, rules or regulations, those of the more inclusive administrative unit shall prevail.

 7.5 Students or staff added to a Special PC-A Committee pursuant to Section 3.3.6 of the ARRC Procedures may participate fully in discussions, hearings, and deliberations of the Special PC-A Committee, but may not vote. If the opinion of students or staff added to the Special PC-A Committee differs from that of the regular members of the Special PC-A Committee, their opinion and the rationale for that opinion shall be included in the report of the Special PC-A Committee.

8 THE FINAL REPORT

When the Special PC-A Committee has completed its deliberations it shall prepare a Final Report setting forth the Special PC-A Committee's disposition of each charge of professional misconduct in the Formal Written Complaint. Communications regarding matters outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint shall be addressed in accordance with the rules set forth in Section 10 below. The Final Report shall be limited to the following mandatory and optional elements.

- **8.1 Mandatory Elements of the Final Report.** The Final Report shall contain, with respect to each charge of professional misconduct alleged in the Formal Written Complaint:
 - **8.1.1** specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based;
 - **8.1.2** identification of the standards against which the charge of professional misconduct is being judged;
- **8.1.3** the Special PC-A Committee's conclusions concerning whether applicable standards have been violated; and

1 8.1.4 if the opinion of students or staff added to the Special PC-A Committee pursuant to 2 Section 3.3.6 of the ARRC Procedures differs from that of the regular members of the Special PC-A Committee, their opinion and the rationale for that opinion. 3 4 5 Before preparing the elements of the Final Report required by Sections 8.1.2 and 8.1.3, the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall send to each party a copy of a provisional draft of the specific 6 findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based required by Section 8.1.1. Each party shall have five days after receipt of the provisional draft to submit written comments to the Chair of the Special PC-A Committee suggesting specific changes to correct specific alleged inaccuracies in the provisional draft. No changes based upon 10 such comments shall be made to the provisional draft without first providing other parties an 11 opportunity to respond to the comments. If the Special PC-A Committee decides not to make 12 changes suggested in a written comment, that written comment and the Special PC-A Committee's 13 reasons for that decision shall be appended to the Final Report. 14 15 16 8.2 Optional **Elements of the Final Report.** In addition, the Final Report may contain one or 17 more of the following: **8.2.1 Recommendations.** The Final Report may include recommendations: 18 19 8.2.1.1 concerning appropriate sanctions for a respondent found to have committed professional misconduct, including but not limited to 20 **8.2.1.1.1** formal censure. 21 **8.2.1.1.2** restitution; 22 8.2.1.1.3 non-reappointment at the end of the respondent's specific term 23 24 appointment, 8.2.1.1.4 removal from an administrative position, 25 26 **8.2.1.1.5** reduction in salary or adjustment in responsibilities, 8.2.1.1.6 recommendation by the Chancellor to the President that the 27 respondent be terminated under Regents Bylaw 4.1.4; 28 8.2.1.2 concerning ways to redress the consequences of any professional misconduct 29 by the respondent; 30 8.2.1.3 concerning ways to prevent recurrence of acts, decisions, or circumstances 31 which may have contributed to the professional misconduct by the respondent: 32 8.2.1.4 concerning correction of any deficiencies or anomalies found in the 33 substance or application of bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, procedures, or 34 35 customs which may have contributed to the filing of the charge of professional misconduct against the respondent. 36 8.2.2 Concurring or Dissenting Opinions. The Final Report may include concurring or 37 38 dissenting opinions, or both, concerning any mandatory or optional element of the report. 39 40 8.3 Delivery and Archiving of Final Report. 41 42 8.3.1 The Chair of the Special PC-A Committee shall

- 9.1 Chancellor's (or President's) Response to Recommendations. In response to recommendations made by the Special PC-A Committee, the Chancellor (or, if the Chancellor is a party, the President) shall within 30 days provide a written response to the Chair of the ARRC indicating:
 - **9.1.1** the recommendations that have been accepted and the action taken;
 - 9.1.2 the recommendations that have been rejected in part or completely; and
 - **9.1.3** for each recommendation rejected, reasons responsive to the Committee's rationale for proposing it.

Copies shall be sent to the parties, to the President of the Academic Senate, and to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate for inclusion in the case files in the ARRC archives and in the University Archives. If the response rejects or changes the recommendations made by the Special PC-A Committee, the ARRC shall inform the President of the Academic Senate who shall provide each member of the Senate Executive Committee with a copy of the Final Report and of the response and shall put the matter on the agenda of the next Senate Executive Committee meeting for whatever action the Senate Executive Committee may deem appropriate.

9.2 ARRC Review of Implementation of Recommendations. The ARRC shall determine the extent to which recommendations of the Special PC-A Committee have been implemented, and shall report its findings to the President of the Academic Senate and in its annual report to the Senate.

9.3 ARRC Meeting with the Special PC-A Committee. After the Final Report has been filed, the ARRC shall meet with the Special PC-A Committee and any others considered appropriate by the Chair of the ARRC to thank the Special PC-A Committee for its work, to collect all copies of documents, and to hear from the Special PC-A Committee any suggestions about how the work of the ARRC and its special committees might be improved.

10 COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING MATTERS OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF THE FORMAL WRITTEN COMPLAINT

10.2 Such concerns shall not be addressed in the Final Report of the Special PC-A Committee required by Section 8.0. However, the Special PC-A Committee acting though its chair, or any member or members of the Special PC-A Committee, may communicate those concerns in writing to the appropriate administrator for investigation and for whatever corrective action may be appropriate. In shaping the contents of and determining the recipients for such communications, those preparing the communications shall consult with the Chair of the ARRC.

- 10.3 A copy of any such communication to an administrator shall at the same time be sent to
 - 10.3.1 the Chancellor; and
 - 10.3.2 the Chair of the ARRC; and
 - 10.3.3 any individual on whose actions, decisions, or practices the communication reflects; and
 - 10.3.4 if the communication reflects on the actions, decisions, or practices of a committee or unit, the individual who heads that committee or unit; and
 - 10.3.5 if the communication reflects on the actions, decisions, or practices of the Chancellor, the President.

 10.4 Such communications shall be deemed to be a part of the responsibility of Special PC-A Committee members and, as such, to be subject to the same protections afforded all Special PC-A Committee activities by Section 6.8 of the Regents Bylaws.

DEFINITIONS

of the ARRC.

As used in this Code of Procedures for Special PC-B Committees, unless the context otherwise requires:

1.3.4 The ARRC Procedures and the Code of Procedures for Special PC-B Committees

in their current form are available from the Academic Senate Office and on the Academic Senate website. For information and advice concerning these procedures, contact the Chair

2.1 Chancellor shall mean the Chancellor of UNL.

2.2 Days shall mean days on which University offices are open for business.

2.3 Faculty Member shall mean any staff member of UNL holding the academic rank of lecturer or above or equivalent rank (Regents Bylaws 3.1.1.1 and 4.4).

2.4 Federal Misconduct in Science Regulations shall mean regulations covering misconduct in federally sponsored scientific research, particularly, but not exclusively, that funded by the Public Health Service. The Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research provides guidance concerning which projects may be covered by these regulations.

2.5 In Writing and Written, when used to describe a communication, shall mean that the communication so described shall be either a paper document signed by the sender or an electronic communication that can be readily accessed by the sender and by the recipient.

2.6 Parties shall mean the complainant Vice Chancellor for Research and the respondent(s).

2.7 President shall mean the President of the University of Nebraska and shall include the authorized representative of the President. The President shall not extend such authorization to the Chancellor or staff members of any campus of the University.

2.8 Section, unless otherwise noted, refers to a section of this Code of Procedures for Special PC-B Committees.

 2.9 Vice Chancellor for Research shall mean the Vice Chancellor for Research of UNL, and shall include the authorized representative of the Vice Chancellor. The Vice Chancellor shall not extend such authorization to Deans with collegiate or divisional responsibility or to a staff member of any such college or division.

3 GENERAL RULES GOVERNING SPECIAL PC-B COMMITTEES

3.1 Quorum. Each Special PC-B Committee has six faculty members. If a member of the Special PC-B Committee withdraws or is barred prior to commencement of the Investigative

Hearing, the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee shall notify the Chair of the ARRC, and the Chair of the ARRC shall make every reasonable effort to appoint a suitable replacement as provided in Section 3.3.5 of the ARRC Procedures. In an emergency, and with the consent of the parties, a hearing may be conducted with one faculty member absent, but a faculty member absent from the hearing may not participate in subsequent deliberations. In no case may the Special PC-B Committee proceed with the Investigative Hearing with fewer than five faculty members present.

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3.2 Voting. The Special PC-B Committee may take action only on concurrence of four faculty members. The Chair may vote.

3.3 Expiration of Term. A member of the Special PC-B Committee whose term on the ARRC Panel expires during a case shall continue to serve until the case is concluded.

3.4 Conflict of Interest. Conflict of Interest occurs when a member of the Special PC-B Committee

ommittee

2.4.1 is in the same department on equivalent unit as a party or witness, or

3.4.1 is in the same department or equivalent unit as a party or witness; or

3.4.2 answers directly to a party or witness; or **3.4.3** has a direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; or

3.4.4 has, or reasonably appears to have, a personal interest in the case or its outcome; or 3.4.5 has provided counsel or assistance to a party relating to the professional misconduct

allegation; or 3.4.6 has participated in the efforts of an organization to provide counsel or assistance to

a party relating to the case; or **3.4.7** has any other relationship with a party that might prevent impartiality.

When a member of the Special PC-B Committee discovers that the member has a conflict of interest, the member shall voluntarily withdraw from participation. When a member of the Special PC-B Committee is alleged to have a conflict of interest and the member does not voluntarily withdraw, the ARRC shall review the allegation and, if a conflict of interest is found, shall bar that person from further participation.

3.5 Communications.

3.5.1 The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee receives communications for the Committee and speaks for it. Both the complainant Vice Chancellor for Research and the respondent(s) shall address communications concerning the case only to the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee. Special PC-B Committee members should discourage contacts outside the regular process, and should direct those who make them to the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee.

3.5.2 The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee shall keep all parties informed of any substantive communications and contacts, including those that arise outside the normal process.

3.5.3 If the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee has difficulty communicating with a

1 party or other necessary participant, the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee may consult with the Chair of the ARRC about ways to resolve the communication problem. 2 3 4 Dissemination of Personnel Information. Participation in Special PC-B Committee 3.6 proceedings makes participants privy to sensitive information and allegations involving the 5 personal and professional lives of members of the University community. UNL Bylaw 2.9 6 describes limitations on the collection and dissemination of personnel information. In addition, 7 Federal Regulations Governing Misconduct in Science require great care to protect the interests 8 of informants and the accused. Some information received by members of the ARRC may be 9 protected by this Bylaw and these regulations. Violators of these requirements could be subject 10 to sanctions for professional misconduct. 11 12 3.7Closed 13 Hearings. PC-B proceedings, including the Pre-Hearing Conference and the Investigative Hearing, are considered to be investigative in nature. They are not open to the public, 14 15 nor to witnesses except while they are presenting evidence and responding to questions. 16 **Academic Advisors.** Each party may choose an Academic Advisor who may accompany 17 3.8 and advise the party at the Pre-Hearing Conference and the Investigative Hearing. The role of 18 Academic Advisor is open to any person who: 19 3.8.1 is a member of the UNL Academic Assembly (UNL Bylaw 3.3.1) or has emeritus 20 faculty status at UNL: 21 22 **3.8.2** is not in the same department or equivalent unit as a witness (other than the party being advised) before or a member of the Special PC-B Committee; 23 3.8.3 has no other relationship with a member of the Special PC-B Committee that might 24 create, or reasonably might seem to create, a conflict of interest for that Special PC-B 25 Committee member; 26 3.8.4 has no direct voice in the salary or working conditions of a party or witness; and 27 3.8.5 has no other relationship with a party, an organization, or a witness that might 28 29 interfere with the investigative process. 30 31 3.9 Counsel and Advice for the Special PC-B Committee. 32 33 3.9.1 Because of potential conflicts of interest, the Special PC-B Committee shall not seek or accept advice from anyone to whom a party is answerable or who may be in a 34 position of giving advice or legal counsel to a party or to any person or body that may later 35 act on the Report of the Special PC-B Committee. 36 37 The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee may receive advice from the ARRC 38 attorney selected pursuant to section 3.10.2 of the ARRC Procedures, but may not have an 39 attorney present at the Investigative Hearing. 40 41 42 **3.9.3** Nothing in this Section 3.9 shall prevent full participation by a member of the Special PC-B Committee who is also an attorney. 43 44 45

3.10 Termination of Pending PC-B Proceedings.

3.10.1 If at any time the complainant Vice Chancellor for Research in writing asks the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee that the Formal Written Complaint be withdrawn, or all parties in writing notify the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee that they have reached a settlement of the case, the Special PC-B Committee shall terminate the proceedings and shall not deliver the Final Report described in Section 8. However, in such circumstances the Special PC-B Committee may, on its own initiative, make written recommendations authorized by Sections 8.2.2 and 8.2.3

3.10.1.1 concerning ways to prevent recurrence of acts, decisions, or circumstances which may have contributed to the filing of the complaint; and

3.10.1.2 concerning ways to correct any deficiencies or anomalies found in the substance or application of bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, procedures, or customs which may have contributed to the filing of the complaint.

Termination of the proceedings under this section shall not preclude the Special PC-B Committee, or members of the Special PC-B Committee, from making the "Communications Regarding Matters Outside the Scope of the Formal Written Complaint" authorized by Section 10.

3.10.2 Resignation from the University by any party shall not necessarily prevent the Special PC-B Committee from completing its deliberations and delivering the Final Report described in Section 8.

3.11 Timely Completion. Unless the ARRC, for good cause shown, authorizes a longer period of time, the Special PC-B Committee shall complete its investigation and deliver its report within the Federal deadlines identified by the Vice Chancellor for Research pursuant to ARRC Procedures Section 4.2.1.8.

3.12 Adherence to Procedures.

 3.12.1 If a party has good reason to believe that the Special PC-B Committee is out of compliance with these procedures or with Federal procedures identified pursuant to Section 4.2.1.8 of the ARRC Procedures, the matter should be brought to the attention of the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee. Procedural questions that the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee cannot resolve promptly and that are so important that failure to resolve them would undermine the credibility of the Special PC-B Committee may be referred by the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee or by a party to the ARRC for resolution. The ARRC shall resolve the issues after obtaining the views of the parties and of the Special PC-B Committee. The Chair of the ARRC shall inform the parties and the Special PC-B Committee of the ARRC decision and direct them to follow the decision.

3.12.2 If a party has good reason to believe that the ARRC is out of compliance with these procedures, with Federal procedures identified pursuant to Section 4.2.1.8 of the ARRC Procedures, or with the ARRC Procedures, the party may invoke Section 6.2 of the ARRC

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- 4.4 Deadline for Requests from Any Party Requesting an Academic Advisor, an ARRC Observer, and for Allegations of Conflict of Interest. Within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Formal Written Complaint from the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee,
 - **4.4.1** any party wishing to be advised by an academic advisor shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee identifying the proposed academic advisor;
 - **4.4.2** any party wishing to request that the ARRC appoint an ARRC Observer shall file a written request with the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee;
 - **4.4.3** any party wishing to allege that a member of the Special PC-B Committee has a conflict of interest shall file a written statement with the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee setting forth the basis for the challenge.

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After consultation with the ARRC attorney to assure compliance with federal deadlines, the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee may extend these deadlines for good cause shown.

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4.5 Procedure If No Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response. If no

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respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the uncontested allegations of fact in the Formal Written Complaint shall be deemed to be true, and the Chair of the Special Committee shall so notify the parties and shall schedule a meeting of the Special PC-B Committee to prepare the Final Report required by Section 8.

- **4.6.1 Procedure If a Respondent Files a Timely Formal Written Response.** If any respondent files a timely Formal Written Response, the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee shall **4.6.1** determine whether proposed academic advisors are eligible under Section 3.8, and if any party's proposed academic advisor is not eligible, invite that party to propose an eligible academic advisor;
 - **4.6.2** forward to the complainant Vice Chancellor for Research and to each respondent a copy of each Formal Written Response and the names of proposed academic advisors; and **4.6.3** forward to the Chair of the ARRC any request that an ARRC Observer be appointed.

4.7 Party Challenges to Proposed Academic Advisors or ARRC Observer.

4.7.1 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed academic advisor by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed academic advisor. If a challenged proposed academic advisor does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee shall determine whether the proposed academic advisor is eligible. If the proposed academic advisor is not eligible, the party may propose another academic advisor. If the new proposed academic advisor appears to be eligible, the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee shall notify parties of the new proposed academic advisor and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed academic advisor.

4.7.2 Any party may in writing challenge the eligibility of a proposed ARRC Observer by delivering the challenge to the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee within 7 days after receipt of the name of the proposed ARRC Observer. The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee shall forward the challenge to the Chair of the ARRC. If a challenged ARRC Observer does not voluntarily withdraw, the Chair of the ARRC shall determine whether the proposed ARRC Observer is eligible. If the proposed ARRC Observer is not eligible, the ARRC may in writing propose another ARRC Observer to the Chair of the Special Committee. The Chair of the Special Committee shall in writing notify parties of the new proposed ARRC Observer and afford parties an opportunity to challenge the new proposed ARRC Observer.

5 PRE-HEARING CONFERENCE

- **6.3.3** Witnesses may testify and evidence may be received not only concerning relevant facts but also concerning relevant standards. The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee may bar the introduction of documents, evidence, questions, and testimony reasonably deemed irrelevant, immaterial, not-competent, or unduly repetitious. The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee also may bar the introduction of documents, evidence, and testimony if introduction would unfairly surprise another party and if the documents, evidence, or testimony could, with reasonable diligence, have been discovered or produced before the Pre-Hearing Conference. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar the introduction of evidence may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special PC-B Committee.
- **6.3.4** The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee may in appropriate circumstances temporarily adjourn the Investigative Hearing.
- **6.4 Format of Presentations and Questions.** To preserve orderly and civil proceedings, the Investigative Hearing shall be conducted by the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee as follows:
 - **6.4.1** No person shall speak without prior recognition by the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee.
 - **6.4.2** Each party and each witness may be questioned by members of the Special PC-B Committee after the end of the presentation of that party or witness.
 - **6.4.3** When the Special PC-B Committee has finished questioning a party or witness, each party may question that party or witness; alternatively, the parties may submit questions to the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee which the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee may ask on their behalf.
 - **6.4.4** The Chair of the Special PC-B Committee may bar questions under Section 6.3.3. A party adversely affected by a decision to bar a question may appeal the decision of the Chair to the full Special PC-B Committee
 - **6.4.5** A party's academic advisor may consult privately with that party, may respond to questions from the Chair, and may address procedural questions to the Chair, but under ordinary circumstances may not otherwise participate in the Investigative Hearing.

7 DELIBERATIONS AND DECISION

7.1 All deliberations shall be conducted in executive session with no one present except members of the Special PC-B Committee, and the ARRC attorney, if invited.

- 7.2 The complainant Vice Chancellor for Research bears the burden of proving relevant facts by a preponderance of the relevant evidence. If a respondent fails to file a timely written response or otherwise fails to contest an allegation of fact, the uncontested allegations of fact shall be deemed to be true.
- **7.3** Refusal by anyone to provide documents or to testify obstructs the process and shall be taken into consideration by the Special PC-B Committee in its deliberations and preparation of the Final Report.
- 7.4 The standards against which the charges are to be judged include applicable state and federal law; University bylaws, rules and regulations; established policies of the relevant administrative unit; appropriate professional and discipline based standards; applicable contracts; and academic principles and tradition. In the event of conflict between different University bylaws, rules or regulations, those of the more inclusive administrative unit shall prevail.

8 THE FINAL REPORT

When the Special PC-B Committee has completed its deliberations it shall prepare a Final Report setting forth the Special PC-B Committee's disposition of each charge of professional misconduct in the Formal Written Complaint. Communications regarding matters outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint shall be addressed in accordance with the rules set forth in Section 10 below. The Final Report shall be limited to the following mandatory and optional elements.

- **8.1 Mandatory Elements of the Final Report.** The Final Report shall contain, with respect to each charge of professional misconduct alleged in the Formal Written Complaint:
 - **8.1.1** specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based;
 - **8.1.2** identification of the standards against which the charge of professional misconduct is being judged; and
 - **8.1.3** the Special PC-B Committee's conclusions concerning whether applicable standards have been violated.

Before preparing the elements of the Final Report required by Sections 8.1.2 and 8.1.3, the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee shall send to each party a copy of a provisional draft of the specific findings of relevant fact and reference to the evidentiary foundations upon which those findings are based required by Section 8.1.1. Each party shall have five days after receipt of the provisional draft to submit written comments to the Chair of the Special PC-B Committee suggesting specific changes to correct specific alleged inaccuracies in the provisional draft. No changes based upon such comments shall be made to the provisional draft without first providing other parties an opportunity to respond to the comments. If the Special PC-B Committee decides not to make changes suggested in a written comment, that written comment and the Special PC-B Committee's reasons for that decision shall be appended to the Final Report.

8.2 Optional Elements of the Final Report. In addition, the Final Report may contain one

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9 FOLLOW UP TO THE REPORT

- **9.1** Chancellor's (or President's) Response to Recommendations. In response to recommendations made by the Special PC-B Committee, the Chancellor (or, if the Chancellor is a party, the President) shall within 30 days provide a written response to the Chair of the ARRC indicating:
 - **9.1.1** the recommendations that have been accepted and the action taken;
 - 9.1.2 the recommendations that have been rejected in part or completely; and
 - **9.1.3** for each recommendation rejected, reasons responsive to the Committee's rationale for proposing it.

Copies shall be sent to the parties, to the President of the Academic Senate, and to the Coordinator of the Academic Senate for inclusion in the case files in the ARRC archives and in the University Archives. If the response rejects or changes the recommendations made by the Special PC-B Committee, the ARRC shall inform the President of the Academic Senate who shall provide each member of the Senate Executive Committee with a copy of the Final Report and of the response and shall put the matter on the agenda of the next Senate Executive Committee meeting for whatever action the Senate Executive Committee may deem appropriate.

9.2 ARRC Review of Implementation of Recommendations. The ARRC shall determine the extent to which recommendations of the Special PC-B Committee have been implemented, and shall report its findings to the President of the Academic Senate and in its annual report to the Senate.

9.3 ARRC Meeting with the Special PC-B Committee. After the Final Report has been filed, the ARRC shall meet with the Special PC-B Committee and any others considered appropriate by the Chair of the ARRC to thank the Special PC-B Committee for its work, to collect all copies of documents, and to hear from the Special PC-B Committee any suggestions about how the work of the ARRC and its special committees might be improved.

10 COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING MATTERS OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF THE FORMAL WRITTEN COMPLAINT

10.1 In the course of an investigation, one or more members of the Special PC-B Committee may conclude that the Special PC-B Committee has heard allegations or otherwise discovered information which, though outside the scope of the Formal Written Complaint and thus not subject to full investigation and evaluation by the Special PC-B Committee, nonetheless suggests that actions or decisions have been taken or may be taken in violation of law, University policy, or academic principle.

 10.2 Such concerns shall not be addressed in the Final Report of the Special PC-B Committee required by Section 8.0. However, the Special PC-B Committee acting though its chair, or any member or members of the Special PC-B Committee, may communicate those concerns in writing to the appropriate administrator for investigation and for whatever corrective action may be

RULES OF ORDER OF THE ACADEMIC SENATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA-LINCOLN

Preamble: The following Rules of Order of the Academic Senate are designed to:

- 1. allow for the full and free discussion of all issues appropriately brought before the Academic Senate.
- 2. encourage consultation between senators and the members of the Academic Assembly whom they represent.
- 3. allow the Senate to act in a timely manner on the issues before it.
- 1. Basic Procedural Rules of the Academic Senate

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the conduct of Academic Senate meetings except insofar as they are superseded by the Bylaws of the Board of Regents, the Bylaws of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, or the following rules of order.

2. Introduction of Motions and Timing of Their Consideration

A motion may be moved by any senator or by a Committee of the Academic Senate. Following the presentation of a report by an officer or committee, one or more motions to carry out recommendations related to the report may be introduced. Motions brought forward by a committee of the Senate require no second from the floor.

When a principal motion has been moved and seconded, the presiding officer clearly state the motion and open the floor for debate. The member who made the motion will generally have the right to speak first in debate. To facilitate consultation with colleagues, motions brought and debated before the Senate at a given meeting will then be placed on the agenda of the following meeting, with or without amendment, and may be voted on at that meeting.

If, however, the presiding officer determines that the nature of the motion is sufficiently urgent as to require immediate action, the presiding officer may declare, before debate begins, the motion an emergency motion thus allowing the vote to be taken at the meeting in which the motion is offered. Any member wishing to challenge the ruling of the chair must do so immediately before debate begins and, if seconded the body shall vote on whether the decision of the chair shall be sustained. A two-thirds vote sustains the decision of the chair.

Additionally, any member of the Senate may move that a motion be given emergency status. Members wishing to offer a motion as an emergency motion must ask that it be considered as such when their motion is made. If seconded the body can, with a two-thirds vote, accept the original motion as an emergency motion. Likewise, any member may move that emergency status be given to a motion just offered. In either case, the motion to assign emergency status must be made before debate begins on the original motion.

The presumption, in the absence of evidence to the contrary, shall be that elections and motions for commendation of an individual or group shall have action at the meeting in which they are made, whereas motions concerning senate policy are presumed to not require immediate action in the absence of countervailing facts.

3. Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote must be made at the meeting at which the original vote was taken. The reconsideration shall occur as the next item of business at the meeting, unless a motion to postpone the reconsideration to a definite time is passed by the Senate. Should the motion to reconsider be neither voted upon nor postponed by vote at that meeting prior to adjournment, the motion to reconsider shall be deemed to have failed.

4. Rearrangement of the Agenda By the Presiding Officer

The presiding officer shall have the right to deviate from the published agenda of the Senate to facilitate the reception of reports by an administrator or committee, or to otherwise assist the Senate. Such deviation from the agenda shall be subject to appeal, which appeal shall require a simple majority of the voting members to approve.

5. Conduct of Elections of Officers and the Executive Committee

Nominations for President Elect, for Secretary, and for the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate shall be solicited by the Committee on Committees. The Committee on Committees shall strive to obtain at least two nominations for each office. All nominations received by the Committee on Committees shall be forwarded to the President up until three weeks prior to the last regular meeting of the Senate. The nominations shall be forwarded without being ranked. Nominations from any member of the UNL Assembly may also be directly forwarded to the President up until three weeks prior to the last regular meeting of the academic year. Nominations shall be considered only with the consent of the individual nominated.

Two weeks in advance of that Senate meeting, a list of candidates (all valid nominees) for these positions shall be sent to all senators, along with biographical materials submitted by the candidates. The Senate Executive Committee may set reasonable limits on the length of this material.

At the last regular meeting of the Senate, the first order of business shall be the election for the President Elect of the Senate, followed immediately by the election of the Secretary of the Senate. Each candidate will be allowed to make a statement to the Senate if she/he so chooses. The Senate will then proceed to a vote, which will be by secret ballot unless there is only one candidate and no objection to a voice vote. On the initial ballot for these offices, a candidate must be chosen on a majority of the ballots cast to be elected. The valid ballots will be counted, and if someone is elected, the winner is announced to the Senate. If no candidate receives a majority of the ballots cast, a run-off will be held between the two candidates receiving the most votes. If the result of any ballot is a tie, additional ballots shall be held, as needed, until a candidate has been elected.

At the last regular meeting, election of the Executive Committee shall follow immediately upon announcement of the results of the elections for President Elect and Secretary. Each candidate will then be allowed to make a statement to the Senate if she/he so chooses. The Senate will then proceed to a vote, which will be by secret ballot. The valid ballots will be counted and the winners announced to the Senate. The candidates receiving the largest numbers of votes shall be elected. In the case that there are terms of different length to be filled, the candidates receiving the most votes will fill the seats with the longest terms. Additional ballots, as needed, shall resolve ties.

In the event that a special election is needed for the President Elect, Secretary, or a member of the Executive Committee, voting procedures applicable to the office will be followed. The Executive Committee will publicly solicit nominations from the current Senate membership and forward all valid nominations for a vote by the full Senate. The Executive Committee shall strive to obtain at least two nominations for all offices. The election(s) will be held at the next meeting of the Senate, if the nominations can be included with the call to the meeting.

Upon a permanent vacancy of the Presidency, the President Elect, shall assume the duties of the President (Bylaw 3.3.11C). If such a vacancy occurs prior to the regular November Senate meeting, the President Elect shall become the President of the Senate for the remainder of their term and an election for a new President Elect must be held according to the special election procedures outlined above.

6. Quorum

A quorum for the making of or action on motions of any sort other than a motion to adjourn shall consist of a majority of the voting members of the Senate. Any member noticing the apparent absence of a quorum can make a point of order to that effect. The Senate may continue to receive reports and discuss business before it so long as at least one quarter of the voting members are present.

7. Writing of Motions

On the request of any one (1) senator, a principal or subsidiary motion shall not be voted upon unless submitted in written form to the secretary, who shall read the motion to the senate before the close of debate on the motion. If the senator who initiated the motion does not submit the motion in writing within five (5) minutes, or such longer time as may be granted by the Senate, the motion shall be regarded as withdrawn.

8. Proxies

On any motion or election before the senate, votes by proxy shall not be allowed.

EXPLANATION:	The proposed changes are largely housekeeping matters to bring the Faculty Government document into conformity with current practices at UNL. For example, the earlier version called for the presidency of the Senate to change during the May meeting of the Senate. Due to changes in the academic calendar, the last meeting of the Senate occurs in late April. In addition the changes allow for the recall of a Senator by the Senator's home department under certain circumstances. The proposed changes have been approved by the Academic Senate and UNL campus administration.

FACULTY GOVERNMENT

- **Purpose.** The purpose of this chapter is to establish a process by which the faculty may participate with the administration in the formulation of education policy and governance as provided in Sections 2.12 and 2.12.1 of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska.
- **3.1 Organization.** The powers of the faculty shall be exercised by the Academic Senate and UNL Asembly established by this chapter.
- **3.2 UNL Assembly.** There shall be established the UNL Assembly to provide a formal setting for discussion of UNL matters involving faculty and administrators.
- 3.2.1 Composition. The UNL Assembly shall comprise: (1) Assistant professors and above, and those with equivalent rank, holding Continuous or Specific Term appointments of 0.5 FTE or greater; (2) Assistant professors and above, and those with equivalent rank, holding 0.5 FTE or greater Special Appointments and having three successive academic years of paid faculty service at any professorial rank at UNL; (3) the Chancellor, Vice Chancellors, and all administrators who hold continuous appointments or appointment for a specific term; (4) Lecturers and Senior Lecturers, holding 0.5 FTE or greater Special Appointment and having three successive academic years of paid faculty service at 0.5 FTE or greater at any faculty rank at UNL.
- **3.2.2 Meetings of the Assembly.** Meetings of the Assembly can be convened on seven days notice by the Chancellor, the President of the Academic Senate, a petition by one hundred members of the Assembly, or a majority vote of the Academic Senate. A meeting may be convened with three days notice, if called jointly by the Chancellor and the President of the Academic Senate. Any call to a meeting must specify the issue or issues to be considered.
- **3.2.3 Procedures and Powers.** The discussion at meetings of the Assembly shall be informational and deliberative. The Assembly has the following powers relating to matters covered under section 2.12.1 of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents:
 - A. It may refer the matter for consideration to the Academic Senate, appropriate campus wide committees or administrators.
 - B. It may order a referendum by mail ballot of all members of the Assembly. The adoption of a position by referendum by a simple majority of those members of the Assembly voting on that issue supersedes any action taken by the Academic Senate.

- **3.3 UNL Academic Senate.** There shall be established a UNL Academic Senate with the powers specified in section 2.12.1 of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska.
- 3.3.1 Composition. The UNL Academic Senate shall comprise: Members of the Assembly elected for staggered terms of three years* by constituencies described in 3.3.5(a). A candidate for election to the Academic Senate must be a member of the constituency he/she seeks to represent, a member of the UNL Assembly and have at least three years service** at UNL. The Vice Chancellors and three Deans shall be ex officio non voting members. The Deans shall be selected by the Chancellor from among those Deans responsible for faculty and shall serve staggered terms of three years.
- **3.3.2 Participation by non-members.** Faculty and administrators who are not members of the Senate, the managerial/professional staff, the office/service staff, and students shall have the right to request the President of the Senate to place matters on the agenda of the Academic Senate, and to participate in the resulting discussion.
- 3.3.3 Meetings. The Senate shall have nine regular monthly meetings during the academic year. The terms of the elected members and officers commence and terminate at the May last meeting in April of the Academic Senate. Special meetings of the Academic Senate may be called with seven days notice by the President of the Academic Senate, the Chancellor, any ten elected members of the Senate or any fifty members of the Assembly. The President shall preside at all meetings.
- **3.3.4 Attendance.** Elected members of the Senate who miss more than three meetings in a Senate year may be removed from membership of the Senate by action of the Secretary with the approval of the President.
- **3.3.5** Electoral Constituencies. At the February meeting of even numbered years, the Senate shall consider and act on a report, developed by the Secretary of the Senate and recommended by the Committee on Committees, proposing the apportionment of Senate seats according to the following guidelines:
 - A. Each department with five or more members of the Assembly shall have one seat, those with more than twenty five shall have two seats and those over fifty shall have three seats.
 - B. Colleges not subdivided into academic departments and each of the research and extension district centers shall be treated as a single department.
 - C. A department with four or fewer members shall be linked with one of closely related interests, after appropriate consultation with the departments in question.

- D. The faculty of departments with two or more seats shall decide whether separate constituencies should be established within the department and, if so, how they shall be constituted.
- E. No Assembly member may belong to more than one constituency. A member associated with more than one department shall vote in the department designated on the personnel action form as the home department.
- 3.3.6 Conduct of Elections. Beginning in the week following the February meeting the Secretary of the Senate shall conduct elections. Nominations from a particular electoral constituency must be made in writing by an Assembly member from that constituency with the consent of the nominee. When the nomination process produces only one nomination, the Academic Senate Office notifies the electoral constituency and allows an extended time period of ten (10) working days for the district to nominate additional qualified candidates. In the event no further nomination is received, the electoral constituency is notified, and the original nominee is considered to have been elected. In the event two or more nominations are received, an election is held. The voting shall be by secret ballot. In order to be elected, a nominee must receive the votes of more than fifty percent of the persons voting. In the event no person receives this requisite number of votes, the Secretary shall hold a run-off election between the two nominees receiving the most votes in the first ballot. A tie in the second ballot shall be broken by lot. The election of members shall be completed by the 15th of April.
- **3.3.7 Interim Elections.** When an elected member ceases to serve in the Senate, the procedures for electing a replacement for the remainder of the term shall follow those in 3.3.6 and commence within fifteen days of the seat becoming vacant.
- **3.3.8** Vacancies in the <u>ex officio</u> seats. Vacancies in the <u>ex officio</u> positions shall be filled by the Chancellor within thirty days of the seat becoming vacant.
- **3.3.9 Election of Officers.** At its regular May last meeting in April, the Senate shall elect from among its members a President Elect who shall take office as President at the end of one year.* The Senate shall also elect one of its members to serve as Secretary of the Senate for a term of one year.
- **3.3.10 Executive Committee Composition.** The Executive Committee of the Senate shall be composed of the President, President Elect, Immediate Past President, the Secretary and nine ordinary members of the Senate at the time of their election. They shall be elected by the members of the Senate at the May last meeting in April. Any member of the Executive Committee whose term as an elected member of the Senate has expired shall become an ex officio voting member of the Senate until the term on the Executive Committee expires. No more than four members of the Executive Committee can be from one college or IANR. At least one member from IANR must be an Extension Agent.

3.3.11 Duties of the President.

- A. The President shall be the chief representative of the UNL Assembly to the Campus and System Administrations, the Board of Regents and the State.
- B. The duties of the President in addition to those specified in sections 3.2.2, 3.3.3, 3.3.4 and 3.4 shall include:
 - (a) Serving as the chair of all meetings of the Executive Committee.
 - (b) Arranging the agendas for the Academic Senate in consultation with the Chancellor, Vice Chancellors and the Executive Committee.
 - (c) Ensuring that motions of the Senate that require response are brought promptly to the attention of the appropriate administrators or committees, and that the responses are reported back to the Senate as expeditiously as possible.
 - (d) Dealing with any matter of importance to the Faculty. The President may delegate duties to the officers or other suitable faculty members, and may establish <u>ad hoc</u> committees in consultation with the Executive Committee.
- C. In the absence of the President, the President Elect shall assume the duties of the President.
- 3.3.12 Duties of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall act for the Faculty between meetings of the Senate and the Assembly. The Executive Committee shall meet with the Chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln at least twice per month, except that one of these meetings may be waived by mutual consent if the Chancellor appears and answers questions at the regular meeting of the Senate for that month. The Executive Committee shall advise and otherwise assist the Chancellor in carrying out all the duties and administrative functions specified in Section 2.8.1 and 2.3.2 of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska. The Executive Committee shall report to the Senate about such meetings and receive instructions from the Senate concerning the position of the faculty relating to the operations of the University.

The Executive Committee shall also meet with the Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at least bimonthly, and shall advise and otherwise assist the Senior Vice Chancellor in carrying out the duties and functions specified in Section 1.5.1 of the Bylaws of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The Executive Committee shall meet with the Vice Chancellor for Agriculture and Natural Resources at least bimonthly, and shall advise and otherwise assist the Vice Chancellor in carrying out the duties and functions specified in Section 1.5.2 of the Bylaws of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, particularly with regard to academic matters, items affecting the relationship of IANR

with other academic units, and concerns affecting academic personnel within the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

- 3.3.13 Recall of Representatives. Upon receipt of the Senate Office of requests from at least 50% of the members of a constituency described in 3.3.5, for the recall of a representative of that constituency, and receipt of a consent form from at least one eligible constituent agreeing to run for one vacancy resulting from a recall, then the Senate shall conduct, within 14 days, a recall vote by secret ballot of the constituency. If more than 50% of the persons voting are in favor of recall, then the seat is vacated and an interim election shall be conducted as in 3.3.7. If not more than 50% of the persons voting are in favor of recall, then for the remainder of that annual term of the Senate (as defined for 3.3.9), that representative shall not be subject to another recall vote unless requests from more than 50% of the members of the constituency are received in the Senate Office. Recall requests are to be held in confidence by the Senate Office, except that the Senate Secretary (or the Senate President, in such cases that request is to recall the representative serving as the Senate Secretary) may review and confirm the authenticity of the requests.
- 3.4 Senate and Other Campus-Wide Standing Committees. The Senate shall publish annually a Syllabus of Senate and other campus-wide standing committees. The Academic Senate shall have power to modify the number and charges of Senate Committees at any time. The President of the Senate shall appoint a member of the Senate as a non-voting member of every standing, campus-wide committee that lacks a representative from the Senate.
- **3.5 Amendments.** In addition to the provisions of Chapter VII of the UNL Bylaws, any amendments to this chapter on Faculty Governance must be approved by a majority of the members of the Assembly voting in a mail ballot ordered either by the Assembly in accord with Section 3.2.3(b) above, or by a two-thirds majority of those voting in a vote of the Senate.

FOOTNOTES:

SECTION 3.3.1

*Members of the current Senate shall remain in office until the first meeting of the new Senate. In the meantime elections shall be held for all seats of the new Senate. After the elections are completed that Secretary of the Senate shall select by a lot a third of the new members to serve one year terms, a third for two years and a third for three years.

**The three year rule shall not apply to those who were eligible for election to the Faculty Senate during the 1989-90 and earlier academic years, although all other eligibility rules shall apply.

SECTION 3.3.9

*At the May, 1990, meeting, both a President and President Elect shall be elected from among the membership of the Academic Senate. The President shall take office at the conclusion of that meeting and preside over the Senate during the period May 1990 - May 1991. The President Elect will assume Presidency in May 1991.

SECTION 3.3.10

*The three with highest number of votes at the first election shall serve terms of three years, the next three, two years and the lowest three one year. Ties will be decided by lot.

SUBJECT: Amendment of Section 5.6 of the *Bylaws of the Board of Regents*.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve amendment of Section 5.6 of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents

relating to public information regarding students.

PREVIOUS ACTION: Section 5.6 of the *Bylaws* was originally adopted on November 10, 1978.

It was amended on June 16, 1984, to delete "marital status" as public information; and on June 3, 1992, to permit the release of names of students mentioned in campus security or campus police reports concerning

accidents and incidents.

EXPLANATION: It is requested that the Board of Regents approve the following amendment

of Section 5.6 of the *Bylaws of the Board of Regents* to add additional information regarding students that is considered to be public information:

5.6 Public Information Regarding Students. Public information regarding students attending the University shall be the (i) student's name, current (ii) local address, (iii) permanent address, (iv) telephone listings, (v) year at the University, (vi) dates of attendance, and (vii) academic college and major field of study, (viii) enrollment status (e.g., undergraduate or graduate; full-time or part-time), (ix) participation in officially recognized activities and sports, (x) degrees, honors and awards received, and (xi) most recent educational agency or institution attended. The names of students mentioned in some kinds of campus security or campus police reports concerning accidents and incidents may also be released to the public. Each major administrative unit shall define the kinds of reports and information that may be released to the public. Information contained in personal files of the student is considered confidential and requires written authorization by the student for release; provided such records with names and personal identification deleted, and kept confidential, may be made available for governmental or University approved research and analysis.

The foregoing proposed amendment would add eight additional classifications of public information regarding students to Section 5.6, namely local address; telephone listings; dates of attendance; academic college; enrollment status; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; degrees, honors and awards received; and most recent educational agency or institution attended.

Each proposed additional classification of public information, except college of study, is expressly included in the definition of directory information in the regulations for the Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, at 34 CFR §99.3. Directory information is considered to be information that may be publicly disclosed without the necessity of obtaining written consent for its release.

With regard to including college of study as public information, the FERPA regulations permit public disclosure of additional information contained in education records of students so long as it is information that "would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed." Making college of study public information would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve amendment of Section 3.4.5 of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents

relating to outside professional employment.

PREVIOUS ACTION: Section 3.4.5 of the *Bylaws* was originally adopted on November 10, 1978.

It has been amended once on June 22, 1991.

EXPLANATION: It is requested that the Board of Regents approve the following amendment

of Section 3.4.5 of the *Bylaws of the Board of Regents* relating to outside professional employment by members of the University's professional staff:

3.4.5 Outside Employment.

Staff members employed on a part-time basis by the University, such as practicing lawyers or physicians, may engage in outside employment or activities unless it is expressly stipulated to the contrary in the conditions of employment.

Staff members employed by the University, other than those covered in the preceding paragraph, shall be encouraged to engage in professional activities outside the University as a means of contributing to the economic growth and development of the state as well as broadening their experience and keeping them abreast of the latest developments in their specialized fields; provided such activities do not interfere with their regular duties at the University, or represent a conflict of interest. Staff members may accept temporary or occasional employment for such professional services when such employment is recommended by the Dean of the college or director of the division involved and approved by the Chancellor or President, or their designees.

Specific approval of the Board is required before <u>any</u> members of the full-time professional staff:

(a) Accept retainer fees or other remuneration on a permanent or yearly basis as May be retained to provide professional consultants services outside the University to an individual person, client, company, firm or governmental agency over a time period lasting more than two years.

- (b) <u>May</u> accept professional employment requiring more than an average of two days per month during the period of <u>their his or her</u> full-time <u>University</u> employment.
- (c) Charge fees for work performed in University buildings with University equipment and materials.
- (d) Provide professional services for remuneration to departments or agencies of state government.

The President shall promulgate such executive policies as shall be necessary for administration and enforcement of this Section 3.4.5, including regulations covering the conduct of outside professional activity performed in University buildings using University equipment or materials that assure there is adequate consideration to the University for such use.

Nothing contained in this Section 3.4.5 shall, however, prevent the Board from continuing affect the administration or enforcement of the Medical Service Plan at the University of Nebraska Medical Center adopted March 5, 1972, and or the Dental Service Plan at the University of Nebraska Medical Center, adopted January 16, 1982, or from making or any amendments, changes, or alterations thereto or revisions thereof which have been approved by the Board.

EXPLANATION: The University of Nebraska proposes to submit a deficit budget request for

two items for the fiscal year 2005-2006 operating budget:

(1) Mead ARDC environmental clean-up costs

(2) Utility increases

Environmental clean-up expenses related to ARDC property, which can be incurred by the University, are projected to be between \$2 and \$6 million.

The University is experiencing rapidly increasing energy prices and evaluating the potential impact they will have on the current year operating budget. A 7.5% utility increase was included in the operating budget approved in June. However, petroleum and natural gas market prices have been higher than anticipated and are expected to remain high over the next several months.

Fiscal year 2005-2006 budget deficit requests are due to the Governor on October 28, 2005. Section 81-126 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1996, provides for the Governor to make recommendations to the Legislature as to the deficiency funding requirements of the various agencies, boards, and commissions of State government.

Approval of this agenda item will delegate authority to the Chairman of the Board and the President on a one time basis to finalize and approve the terms of the submission of a budget deficit request to the Governor and Legislature consistent with this agenda item. The request, when finalized, will be reported to the Board of Regents.

In exchange for the lease of property, Alltel will pay rent of \$9,600 the first year with 10% increases per year for the five year term. The University will also receive \$375 monthly for utilities used with a 10% escalation per 5 year term. Alltel will be granted the right to extend the lease for five additional terms of five (5) years each on the same terms and conditions except that the rent will increase as specified in paragraph 6 of the attached lease agreement.

The proposed lease agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Office of the University General Counsel.

The project budget would increase by \$551,000 to \$1,921,000.

This item, if approved, would also grant that change orders over \$100,000 in value may be approved by the UNL Vice Chancellor for Business and Finance as long as such change orders do not exceed the

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (this "MOU") is entered into on September _____, 2005, by and between AK-SAR-BEN FUTURE TRUST, a Nebraska non-profit corporation ("AFT") and the BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA, a public body corporate of the State of Nebraska (the "University").

- 1. **Real Property**. AFT owns or intends to obtain ownership or control of the parcels of real property identified in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached to this MOU as follows: (a) the approximately 2-acre parcel identified as parcel A-3 (the "University Target") and (b) the approximately 54-acre parcel identified as parcel A-1 ("Chili Greens"). The University owns or intends to obtain ownership or control of the parcels of real property identified in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached to this MOU as follows: (a) the approximately 4-acre parcel identified as parcel A-4 (the "AFT Target") and (b) the approximately 17-acre parcel identified as parcel A-2 (the "Center Street 17").
 - 2. **Transaction**. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this MOU:
 - a. AFT shall convey fee title to the University Target and Chili Greens to the University or its designee:
 - b. the University shall convey fee title to the AFT Target to AFT or its designee;
 - c. the University shall acquire ownership or control of all of the real property comprising the Center Street 17 (the "Assemblage");
 - d. AFT and the University shall take all actions and execute and deliver all instruments necessary to dedicate to the City of Omaha (the "City"), at no cost to the City or the parties hereto, any land they may own or control sufficient to extend the 67th Street right-of-way from Pine Street to Center Street, including but not limited to parcel A-5 identified in Exhibit A;
 - the University shall take all actions and execute, deliver and record all instruments necessary to ensure that any real property located south of Pacific Street owned or controlled by the University or any of its affiliates shall be developed in a manner consistent with the basic urban design principles employed in connection with the development of the area depicted in Exhibit A (the "Project"). Such principles generally include:
 - i. Wide, pedestrian-friendly sidewalks with extensive landscaping and specialty lighting;
 - ii. Plazas and other small gathering spaces incorporated into the pedestrian system;
 - iii. Buildings that front on the sidewalks with little or no set-backs;

- iv. Localize streets with on-street parking;
- v. Off-street parking facilities, be they structures or surface lots, located behind and screened by the buildings; and
- vi. Building architecture and design which present a consistent theme, rhythm and use of materials.
- f. the University shall take all actions and execute, deliver and record all instruments necessary to ensure that the Center Street 17 and Chili Greens shall be used for University purposes, such as student housing, academic buildings, athletic facilities and off street parking facilities, or for purposes that are complementary to the teaching, research and service mission of the University, such as business incubator facilities and affiliated educational or research facilities. The University shall commence construction of improvements and building structures on the Center Street 17 on or before January 1, 2009, and on Chili Greens when funds are available and plans have been completed, and
- g. the University shall cause to be constructed all infrastructure within the areas highlighted in yellow in Exhibit A attached to this MOU.
- 3. **Conditions to Closing the Transaction**. AFT shall convey fee title to the University Target and Chili Greens to the University or its designee, and the University shall convey fee title to the AFT Target to AFT or its designee subject to the following conditions:
 - a. the University shall convey fee title to the AFT Target to AFT or its designee subject to any matters of record other than liens, leaseholds and other possessory rights (which the University shall release and terminate at its sole cost and expense) and AFT shall accept such conveyance;
 - b. AFT shall convey fee title to the University Target and Chili Greens to the University or its designee subject to any matters of record other than liens, leaseholds and other possessory rights (which AFT shall release and terminate at its sole cost and expense) and the University shall accept such conveyance;
 - c. the University shall pay or cause to be paid to AFT the sum of \$1,750,000, as adjusted for closing expenses and prorations in accordance with local custom, as consideration for AFT's conveyance of Chili Greens to the University;
 - d. AFT shall evaluate the status of the Assemblage of the Center Street 17 to ensure, in AFT's reasonable opinion, that the Assemblage shall be completed and that the Center Street 17 shall be developed for use by the University or its affiliates;
 - e. the University shall have taken all actions and executed and delivered all instruments necessary to dedicate land sufficient to extend the 67th Street right-of-way as described above; and

- f. the University shall take all actions and execute, deliver and record all instruments necessary to fulfill the terms of Sections 2(e) and 2(f) above.
- 4. **Closing Date; Due Diligence Costs**. The Agreement, as defined below, shall provide that the parties shall satisfy the conditions set forth above and close the transaction set forth above on or before October 31, 2005. Each party shall be solely responsible for any due diligence it desires to conduct with respect to the real property which is the subject of this MOU.
- 5. **Approvals/Consents**. The Agreement shall provide that the University shall use reasonable efforts to obtain any required approval or consent of First Data Resources or its affiliates to any of the proposed development activities of AFT, the University or their assignees in connection with the Agreement. The Agreement shall provide that AFT shall use reasonable efforts to obtain the release of any mortgage or other debt instrument encumbering any real property to be conveyed by AFT to the University as contemplated in this MOU.
- 6. **Non-Binding Nature of MOU**. AFT and the University intend and desire to enter into the transaction generally described in this MOU, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this MOU. This MOU is merely a general statement of the parties' intent to proceed, does not create any binding obligations upon the parties and should not be considered an offer binding on the parties hereto. Any closing of the transaction described herein is conditioned upon the execution and delivery of a definitive purchase/swap agreement (the "Agreement") by and among the parties hereto. The parties agree to negotiate the terms of the Agreement in good faith and to use their best efforts to finalize, execute and deliver the same on or before October 15, 2005.
- 7. **Counterparts.** This MOU may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original.

WHEREAS, the University has a unique opportunity to acquire at a favorable price from Ak-Sar-Ben Future Trust approximately 54 acres of land identified as Parcel A-1 (Chili Greens) in the attached Exhibit "A" in accordance with terms of a Memorandum of Understanding between the University and Ak-Sar-Ben Future Trust, a copy of which memorandum is attached as Exhibit "B"; and

WHEREAS, the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding with Ak-Sar-Ben Future Trust require the University to acquire approximately 17 acres of real property identified as Parcel A-2 in the attached Exhibit "A" as a condition to the conveyance of Parcel A-1 (Chili Greens) by Ak-Sar-Ben Future Trust to the University; and

WHEREAS, the University of Nebraska Foundation has been and is in the process of trying to purchase tracts of real property within Parcel A-2 for the benefit of and use by the University, and to date has purchased several separate tracts within Parcel A-2; and




