# **University of Nebraska at Kearney**

### 1. New Loper Success Hub dedicated to student support

The University of Nebraska at Kearney celebrated the opening of the Loper Success Hub, a new centralized space dedicated to student support, located inside the Calvin T. Ryan Library. The hub brings together key academic resources such as Academic Advising and Career Development, Disability Services, TRIO Student Support Services, Kearney Bound Scholars, First-Gen Lopers and Tutoring and Academic Support. This one-stop approach aims to enhance student success by offering a range of services in a single, student-focused environment. With lounge areas, tutoring spaces, and a testing center, the facility promotes collaboration and provides students with the tools they need to succeed, both on-campus and online.

# **University of Nebraska-Lincoln**

### 1. Berkowitz to lead NSF's math, physical sciences directorate

The U.S. National Science Foundation has selected Nebraska's David B. Berkowitz to serve as assistant director for mathematical and physical sciences. He will start in the role on Sept. 9. Berkowitz, Elmer H. and Rudy M. Cordes professor of chemistry at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln, will manage the NSF mathematical and physical sciences team and oversee the investment portfolios for the divisions of astronomical sciences, chemistry, mathematical sciences, materials research, physics and the Office of Strategic Initiatives, with a total budget of approximately \$1.7 billion.

### 2. Research center looks to future with \$5.8M NIH renewal

The University of Nebraska–Lincoln's Center for the Prevention of Obesity Diseases through Dietary Molecules (NPOD) received a five-year, \$5,808,886 renewal from the National Institute of Health's Centers of Biomedical Research Excellence Program. The funding will support the center's efforts to solidify its research base and prepare to thrive in the long term. The center is led by Janos Zempleni, Willa Cather Professor of molecular nutrition.

### 1. iEXCEL sessions prep professionals for opening of unit

In anticipation of the opening of the Innovation Design Unit in January 2025, iEXCEL at UNMC recently hosted a series of collaborative sessions to explore cutting-edge care delivery models. ### DWFI facilitated a field trip to West Central Nebraska for international irrigation startups

DWFI recently hosted a field trip for two international agtech startups, AgInfinity and Raks Technologies, as part of the AgTech Connect conference. The goal of the tour was to help the startups understand Nebraska's agricultural landscape and agtech adoption potentials. The startups met with the UNL-TAPS and N-mobile irrigation testing lab program teams to learn about university resources for testing and validating their products.
