Collaboration Initiative

Purpose

Strengthen the University of Nebraska's research competitiveness by fully leveraging its multi-campus intellectual capacity and research resources.

Desired Outcome

An increased capacity to address critical issues important to Nebraskans by having the University of Nebraska's campuses be more nationally grant competitive.





Grant Opportunities

Funding from the Nebraska Research Initiative (NRI)

Allocating ~\$2.5 – 3.5 million (direct expenses)

- Planning Grants
- Seed Grants





General Eligibility

- Retreat Participation
- Assistant, Associate or Full Professors and equivalent-rank research faculty employed by any University of Nebraska campus are eligible to submit funding applications as Principal Investigators (PI)
- Assistant, Associate or Full Professors of Practice that are members of the Graduate Faculty are eligible to serve as Co-PIs
- Seed grants: team members providing core leadership for the team must have individual records of extramurally funded research as a PI or Co-PI
- **Planning grants**: PIs who have not received extramural research funding (PI or Co-PI) must have a Co-PI on their application who is currently grant-active and willing to serve as a research mentor to the team
- Faculty may serve as the lead PI on one planning grant and one seed grant; there is no limit to their participation as Co-PIs

Collaboration Requirements

- PI employed by one University of Nebraska campus (UNK, UNL, UNMC and UNO) must identify at least one collaborator affiliated with another campus
- <u>Meaningful</u> multi-campus and appropriate disciplinary collaborations
 - Involvement in plan of work; budget allocation





Planning Grants

- **Goal:** facilitate and build new research collaboration across University of Nebraska campuses.
- Up to \$20,000 for one year
 - Will support: Planning meetings, retreats, travel to meet program officers at funding agencies, travel within Nebraska, facilitate experimental design/modest data collection (after meet with program officers)
 - Identify extramural funding opportunities that would grow a collective research portfolio in any discipline
 - Identify knowledge gaps that must be addressed to prepare a competitive, extramural application
 - Prepare applications for extramural funding







Planning Grants: Evaluation (100 points)

- a) Plan to interact with potential funding agencies/foundations (20 points)
- b) Justification of the proposed approach and evidence that the completed work plan will help the PI/Co-PI(s) align research question(s) with funding agency/foundation priorities (25 points)
- c) Strategy to identify expertise needs, build collaborations, and prepare competitive extramural research applications (25 points)
- d) Timetable (15 points)
- e) Budget adequate to support the work plan (15 points)





Formed/Forming Team Seed Grants

- **Goal:** enhance research collaborations among faculty that have had modest levels of previous collaboration.
 - Up to \$150,000 total over two years
 - Team members providing core leadership for the team *must* have individual records of extramurally-funded research as a PI or Co-PI.
 - Teams must actively generate knowledge/preliminary data to enhance competitiveness for extramural funding
 - Teams expected to submit extramural applications for at least \$200,000/year.





Team Strengthening Seed Grants

- Goal: strengthen existing research collaborations to allow the team to be more competitive for larger extramural funding opportunities.
 - Up to \$300,000 total over two years
 - Build upon existing research collaborations among faculty with a track record of joint extramural research funding with one or more team members.
 - Addition of new team members to fill gaps in expertise is encouraged.
 - Teams expected to submit extramural applications for at least \$400,000/year.





Seed Grants: Evaluation (100 points)

- Significance, Innovation and Impact of the proposed research (25 points)
- Alignment of research question(s) to priorities of an existing extramural funding opportunity (20 points)
- Ability to enhance competitiveness of the team for extramural funding (20 points)
- Budget and facilities adequate to support plan of work (15 points)
- Meaningful collaborations/roles/responsibilities defined for PI/Co-PIs (10 points)
- Realistic and achievable timetable (10 points)

Review Process

Planning Grants: Research administrators from 4 campuses **Seed Grants:** External reviews from at least two disciplinary experts

Numerical score plus reviewer comments plus funding category

Exemplary:	Definitely fund
Very Good:	Strongly consider for funding
Needs Improvement:	Fund only if resources allow
Inadequate:	Do not fund
